The police department presented its compensation budget proposal at the Budget Workshop, and was directed to keep it Operating Budget as status quo. While we understand the justification for this direction, the police department needs to present a true needs budget, as there are certainly line items that have continued to increase over the past several years. For example the Indian River Regional Crime Lab annual fee has increased by thirty-seven thousand dollars (\$37,000); however, this line item has not been adjusted. Most of our vendors have also increased their prices e.g., uniforms, leather gear, ammunition, paper and other supplies.


While the police department has experienced some positive gains in addressing our Capital needs e.g., police vehicles, there are still Capital needs that need to be addressed; Tasers, Firearms, Laptops, Vehicles, Security Gates at both the main station and substation). The lack of a Capital Budget for the police department since 2008 put a severe strain on the police department's ability to replace outdated and/or worn out equipment. This affects the overall effectiveness and efficiency of the police department and its effort to combat crime.

Status as of June 30, 2017

The police department has presented a FY2017 /2018 budget to the City Manager and Director of Finance. The budget included a 3% raise for sworn staff (Coastal Florida Police Benevolent Association, Sergeants and Lieutenants Unit & the International Union of Police Associations, Police Officer Unit) and civilian staff (Teamsters Local Union, Number 769, General Employee Unit and Non-Bargaining).
