The 31st National Conference on Preventing Crime in the Black Community is scheduled May 31 through June 2, 2017, at the Rosen Centre Hotel located at 9840 International Drive, Orlando. This conference is a collaborative effort sponsored by Pam Bondi, Florida's Attorney General.

The Orange County Sheriff's Office and the Orlando Police Department are the host agencies and share the responsibility of organizing and staffing this conference. The mission of the National Conference on Preventing Crime in the Black Community is to showcase successful programs and promote a positive exchange of ideas and strategies for preventing crime in the black community. In recent years, the conference has centered heavily on efforts to prevent youth violence and delinquency. The focal points of the conference include presentations by national and state leaders, motivational speakers, workshops on notable efforts to curb drug abuse and youth violence, community crime prevention, and program models that are transferable to other communities. The conference includes plenary sessions, luncheons and break-out sessions for both adults and teens.

To guarantee the success of this conference, each local law enforcement agency is asked to contribute \$3,000 from forfeiture or other funds. Your assistance will help ensure a positive learning experience for all participants. The 2017 conference is expected to attract over 2,100 attendees from across the country.

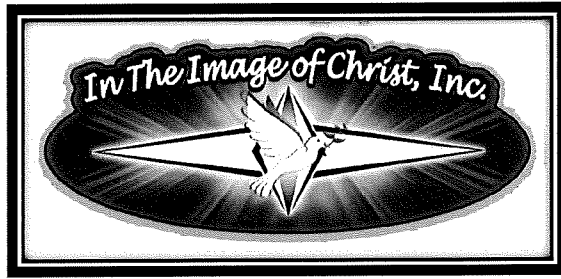

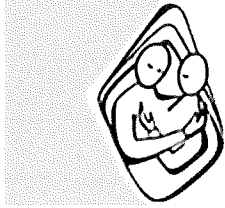

Hi Chief,

I hope this email finds you well.

I'm writing to ask FPPD to consider co-sponsoring our upcoming event, From Youth at Risk to Kids at Hope Mini-Masters –A Positive Youth Development Symposium, scheduled for March 28-30, 2017 (see attached flyer). To celebrate 10 years of Kids at Hope in St. Lucie County, we are bringing national speakers to help us examine best practices for addressing racial and ethnic disparities in our juvenile justice system, and dealing with the effects of trauma on our children. The keynote speaker is Antwone Fisher, whose life is chronicled in the 2002 movie starring Denzel Washington about a foster child who triumphed despite significant adversity. We are providing this event free to the community. Please send the flyer out to your officers, particularly those who work with youth, and encourage them to register and attend if feasible.

We are also seeking sponsors to cover costs. The event is free to the community and we expect 150 people. The requested sponsorship amount from law enforcement agencies is \$1,000, but any amount would be greatly appreciated. We would of course list your logo on the flyer as a sponsoring agency, and acknowledge you as a sponsor throughout the conference. I am sending the same request to PSLPD and SLCSO.

With respect to juvenile justice, our speaker is Michael Finley, from the W. Haywood Burns Institute. The Burns Institute provides technical assistance to jurisdictions around the country in their efforts to assess, identify and reduce racial and ethnic disparities in juvenile justice. As you know, this has been a topic of intense engagement in our community. **To that end, please save the date of Tuesday, March 28, 2017, to attend the conference, because that is when Mr. Finley will be speaking. If you cannot reserve the entire day, please reserve 1pm to 3pm which will be a "by invitation only" meeting with Mr. Finley for chiefs/deputy chiefs from FPPD, PSLPD, DJJ, State Attorney's Office, Public Defender's Office, and the Court to discuss how we can**

advance the ball on this issue in our community. We would love to have you and your deputy chiefs in attendance.

Thanks in advance for your generosity. Please also let me know if you and your deputy chiefs will attend the conference, specifically the invitation only meeting on March 28 from 1-3 at the Fenn Center.
