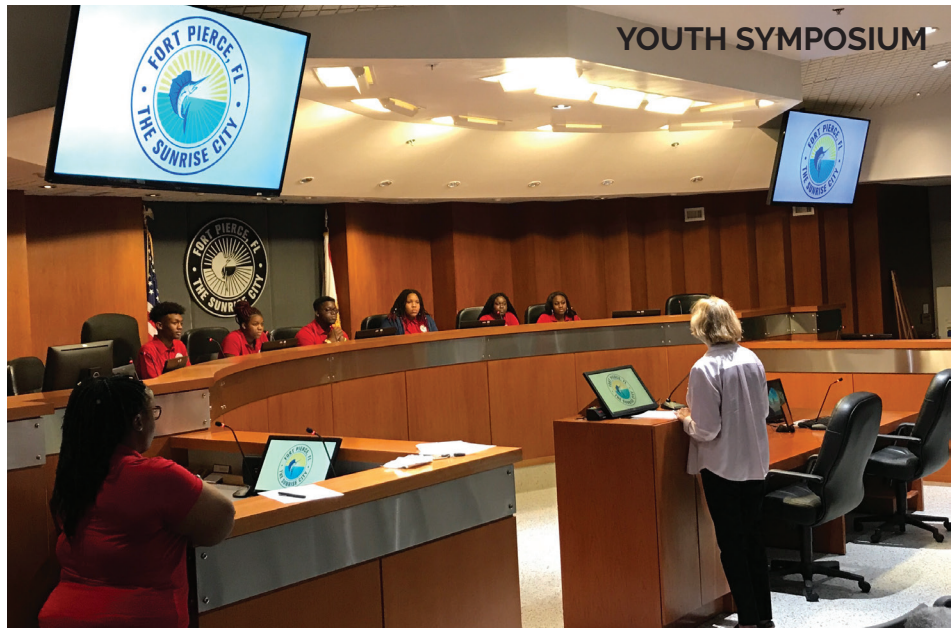

The Grants Administration Division kicked off registration for the 2017 Summer Jam Basketball Camp. 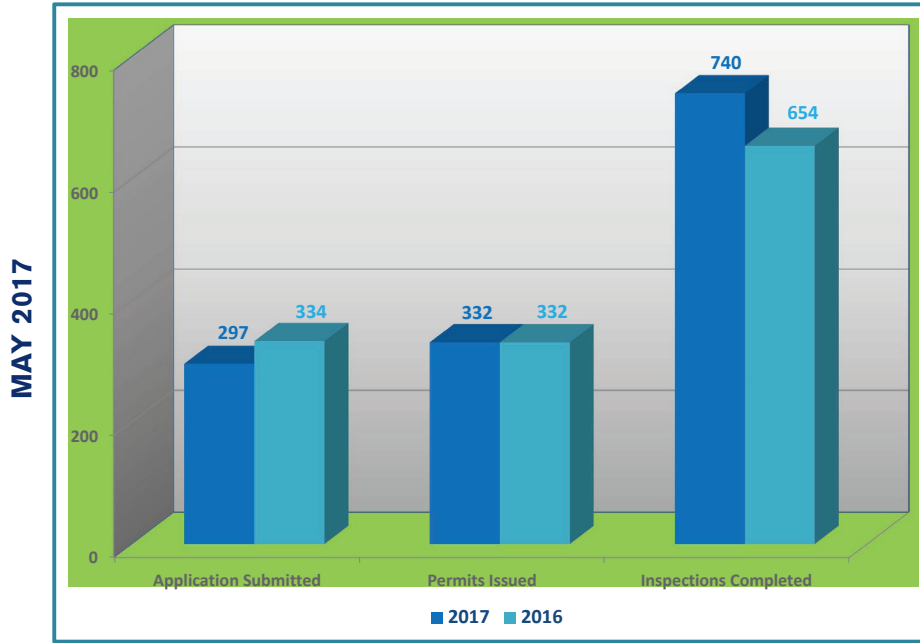

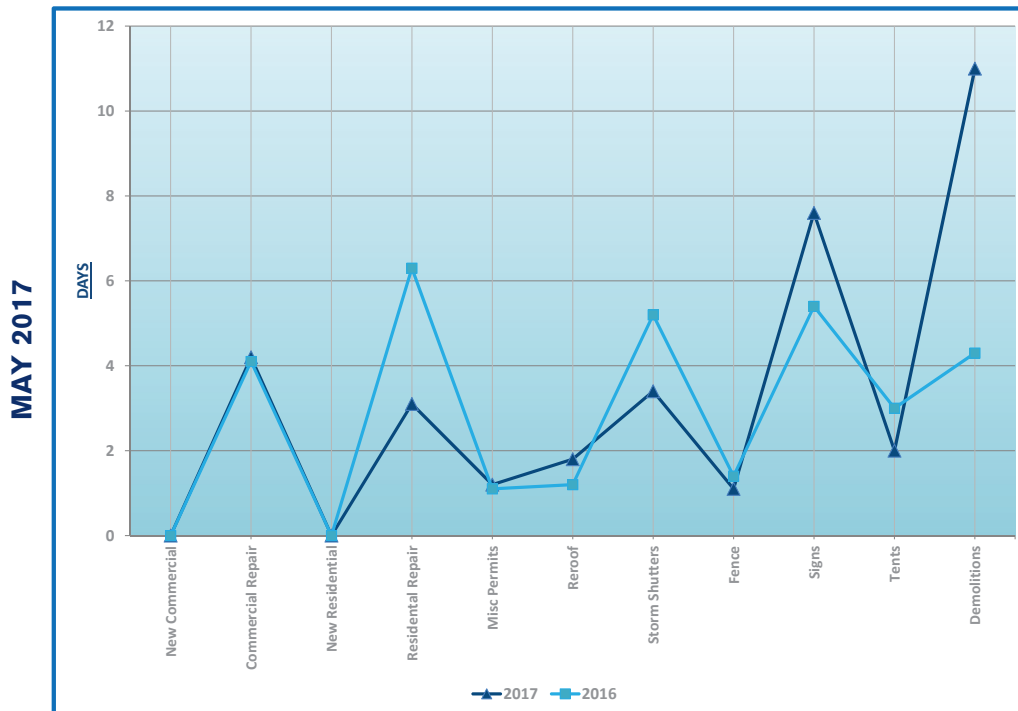

The Public Works Department participated in the 2<sup>nd</sup> annual "Restoring the Village" project on June 10, 2017. It is amazing to see the amount of community pride and unity that is exhibited by everyone involved. This year, there was fantastic support by our local governmental bodies with both employees and elected officials lending a hand. In total, there were over 600 volunteers present that day. The City of Fort Pierce, Fort Pierce Police Department, Fort Pierce Utilities Authority, St. Lucie County, St. Lucie County Sheriff's Department and the St. Lucie County Fire District were all represented well.

With an area covering from 13<sup>th</sup> Street to the East and 29<sup>th</sup> Street to the West, Avenue D to the South and Avenue Q to North, the Public Works Department team provided support services early on, delivering pallets of water and coolers of ice to the four stations. Then their focus shifted to providing maintenance to City owned properties and rights of way, a beautification project around Lincoln Park Academy and picking up all bulk material and vegetative debris within the clean-up area (19.48 tons of debris removed). By the time the rain set in, the impact of all of the volunteers efforts were clearly visible.



Another exciting project going on in the Public Works Department is the installation of bollard lights along Inlet Linear Park. Over 30 decorative lights are being installed and will be operational soon. These are the same turtle friendly, low level lights that are installed within Jetty Park.



With the rainy and grow seasons upon us, the Public Works Department team has many challenges and their work cut out for them but will continue to do a great job.

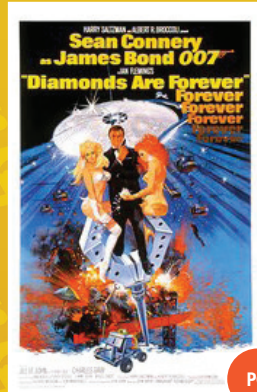
