Sea turtle egg thefts land 2 men in hot water

Two Riviera Beach men were sentenced to several months in prison after they were convicted of stealing more than 650 sea turtle eggs on St. Lucie County beaches, according to a statement from the Department of Justice.

Carl Lawrence Cobb, 60, and Raymond Saunders, 50, were found guilty of transporting sea turtle eggs for the purpose of sale, according to the statement.

Cobb, who was found guilty of two counts, was sentenced to seven months in prison with two years of supervised release. He also was ordered to pay \$227 to the state.

Saunders, convicted of one count, received the same sentence.

On May 5, the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission received reports of a man disturbing turtle nests on North Hutchinson Island, according to the statement. An investigation showed Cobb removed more than 200 eggs from two turtle nests.

On May 24, law-enforcement officials saw Cobb and Saunders take about 470 eggs from nests. The pair were arrested while taking the eggs to Palm Beach County, according to the statement.

The eggs, which were suspected to belong to loggerhead turtles, were relocated by marine biologists.

Loggerheads are the most commonly encountered nesting sea turtles on the Treasure Coast. Nesting season runs from March through October.

Sea turtles are protected by federal and state laws that forbid taking, possessing, disturbing, mutilating, destroying, selling or harassing all types of sea turtles, their nests and their eggs.

The men were tried and found guilty in a U.S. District Court Aug. 11.

that Fitzgerald had to refuse herself from so much of CDC's work that it "prevented her from fully engaging on public health issues including cancer, the opioid epidemic, and other epidemics that involved information technology."

Fitzgerald's resignation comes as CDC's work has been especially high profile over the past year with the public health concerns over back-to-back hurricanes and the particularly bad flu season, says John Auerbach, CEO of the nonprofit Trust for America's Health.

"Any distraction from the core important work of the CDC, particularly as we enter the budget season can potentially impair the agency's ability to do what it does so well," says Auerbach, a former CDC director of policy and health commissioner of Massachusetts.

Video shows man waving gun around in PSL Wawa

PORT ST. LUCIE – Port St. Lucie police are asking for the public's help to identify a man accused of "recklessly displaying" a gun at a Wawa store in the Tradition community.

The incident happened about 5:40 a.m. Jan. 28 at the store in the 10300 block of Southwest Tradition Parkway west of Interstate 95.

Surveillance footage shows a black man, described as about 30 years old and about 5 feet 7 inches tall, walk in "with a handgun in his hand and in full view of the public," police said.

The man, who weighs about 150 pounds and wore a blue collared shirt and blue jeans, followed a woman around, and talked to her as he held the gun in his hand.

He eventually put the gun in his waistband and left in a dark blue Ford Crown Victoria.

Master Sgt. Frank Sabol, police spokesman, said Wednesday the man did not try to hold up the store.

"That's why it's not a robbery," he said.

Instead, Sabol said the

crime is reckless display of a firearm.

According to a police report, a shift manager at the store said he was attending to a woman who had two cups of coffee.

He said a man was standing next to the woman and tried to engage her in conversation.

He said the man offered to pay for the woman's coffee but she declined. That's when the man said, "You gonna do me like that girl?" and pulled a handgun and waved it around.

The woman asked the manager to escort her out to her vehicle, which he did.

The manager told police the man typically comes to the store about two times a week in the early-morning hours. He said he didn't hear the man with the gun make any threatening statements.

Police have been unable to identify the woman or the accused gunman. Police also didn't get any calls from the woman.
