In 2016, the Sheriff's Office was awarded \$4000 to support a Basketball Summer Camp. This year, the Sheriff's Office is hosting a new summer camp. This is not a continuation of the former project and will include new activities and different young people.

5. What is your organization's annual budget? Describe how your organization is currently funded.

The Sheriff's Office 2018 budget is \$81,940,721.00. The Board of County Commissioners fund the budget annually. All activities, equipment and programs not funded through the annual budget must be secured through other means, such as grants and community donations. Summer camps and after-school programs are not funded in the Sheriff's annual budget.

6. Does the City of Fort Pierce and/other local organizations in Fort Pierce provide services similar to your agency? If you answered Yes, how do your services compliment their offerings? If yes, explain. How are your services different?

The Ft. Pierce PAL and Boys and Girls Clubs offer similar sports activities, but neither offer law enforcement interaction and mentoring. The PAL center is not nearby or within walking distance for our target audience. The Boys and Girls Club does not offer evening sports classes. The Sheriff's Office camp is offered during the evening hours and will be located near the target community, making it convenient to students. The area has a high crime rate in which unsupervised youth may become involved in criminal activity. The goal of the camp is to promote healthy exercise combined with educational programs on peer pressure, gang education, bullying, cyber safety, and helping kids make positive life choices. Youth learn

sportsmanship, discipline, teamwork, accountability, critical thinking and the camp provides a safe environment keeping them off the street and out of danger. In many high crime communities law enforcement's interaction with residents is not always positive. Through the Sheriff's Office summer camp, kids and families get to interact with deputies in a more positive light.

To insure safety and provide program data all participants will be required to register for the camp.

11. Describe the existing problems or needs to be addressed by this program/project.

This community event is held during the summer when youth have unlimited free time. Parents in low-income households struggle to obtain safe activities for their children during the summer. Summer camps can be very expensive far exceeding the financial abilities of many households. Unsupervised children can get into trouble or become victims of crime if left unsupervised. In many low-income homes, food is limited and children can go all day without anything to eat. In addition, in high-crime areas the relationship between law enforcement and the community is often tense and strained.

12. Describe your proposed project’s activities and how they will address the problems/needs, you listed in #11 above.

The Sheriff’s Office seeks to address these issues by hosting a no cost supervised summer camp for local youth at the Dan McCarty Middle School. The camp will provide a safe supervised environment promoting healthy exercise combined with educational programs and daily healthy meals. This opportunity for young people to experience law enforcement deputies in a positive manner will aid in building community trust. Parents are also encouraged to visit the camp to observe the activities and meet with law enforcement staff.

Our goal is to provide a safe and healthy environment for youth that may otherwise be at-risk during the summer months. We seek to achieve this through the following objectives:

A. Host a summer camp June 18-29, 2018 from 8am – 10pm.

B. Provide healthy exercise (sports) and educational sessions.

C. Improve community and law enforcement relations.

D. Provide healthy meals for kids that may be at risk of having no food to eat during the day.

All participants must complete a registration form in order to participate.

Daily sign in sheets will be maintained providing attendance for agency record keeping.

C. The camp will provide daily nutritious meals.

D. Participates will be required to register and sign in daily.

We are continually seeking other sources to assist in the funding of this project. If this grant request is not fully funded we may be forced to significantly reduce the activities offered and decrease number of youth served.

The Sheriff's Office is fully committed to provide positive life experiences for the residents of our communities during the summertime. Building community trust begins at an early age and the summer camp is a great opportunity. When young people have an opportunity to meet law enforcement deputies during the camp sessions it seeks to develop relationship and builds trust and respect.

**Question 1: Describe your organization and list your Mission Statement.**

The St. Lucie County Sheriff is the chief law enforcement officer in St. Lucie County and has a range of duties that include criminal investigations, traffic enforcement, and operation of the St. Lucie County Jail, including the safekeeping of inmates and operation of the jail commissary. The sheriff also provides security for the courthouse, including the county and district courts, assists with service of subpoena and other process and accepts bail for prisoners in the county's custody. In a county without a Bail Bond Board, the Sheriff sets bail bond policy for the county. Finally, the sheriff may conduct sales of forfeited property, property being sold at auction for failure to pay property taxes and property sold to satisfy judgments in civil cases. The sheriff has ultimate authority over the operations of the office with authority to determine how to use all other resources allocated to the office during the budget process.

The Vision and Mission statement of the St. Lucie County Sheriff's Office is as follows:

**Vision:** We want the people of St. Lucie County to have the most professional criminal justice services possible. We will accomplish this by providing responsive, quality, cost effective service.

**Values:** We will honor the public trust through respect and dignity for those with whom we deal; respect and care for the environment; equal opportunity; a work force selected with care, treated with respect and rewarded for performance; open and honest communication; positive action and innovation; team work; and responsible use of public resources.

**Mission:** The St. Lucie County Sheriff's Office pledges to protect life and property and maintain order through a continuing commitment to service, integrity, the highest standard of ethics and respect for individual rights in a diverse population.

**Goals:** We will focus on community service, invest in the work force and live within our means.

**We will focus on community service by:** Supporting the priorities of our community; listening and responding to our residents and visitors; cutting red tape; improving public awareness of Sheriff's Office services; improving effectiveness of internal support services; involving employees in goal setting and ongoing improvement efforts; planning, initiating, implementing and evaluating thoroughly our programs and projects; and improving our interaction with the community to promote greater understanding.

**We will invest in the work force by:** Treating employees as customers; achieving market competitiveness in wages and benefits; involving employees in decisions that affect them; and responding to employee suggestions.

**We will live within our means by:** Operating within budgetary limits and adhering to financial policies; seeking new sources of funding; emphasizing preventive maintenance; and focusing on continuous improvement of quality, productivity, efficiency and effectiveness.

**Question 2: Describe your organization's history and prior experience, including a description of programs/projects similar to the one you are applying for in this application.**

Founded in 1905, St. Lucie County was formed by an act of the Florida Legislature. County offices were established, including the Office of Sheriff. The St. Lucie County Sheriff provides countywide law enforcement, maintains the county jail, serves warrants, and provides security at the county courthouse. The Sheriff is the highest-ranking law enforcement officer in the county. The School Resource Unit provides security and mentoring for many of the county's schools with the assignment of on-campus deputies. Specially trained to work with schoolchildren and their families, these deputies provide a vast array of activities to build self-esteem in students, provide security, and improve community-police relations.

The summer months can be very risky for youth, as they are often home alone and unsupervised. Children from low-income families and children of color are particularly at risk. The Sheriff's Office seeks to address this problem by providing community based activities to help keeps kids off the street and out of danger. Programs such as Deputy/Youth Dialogue, Pop Up Block parties, Bike Rodeos, Fingerprinting programs, summer sports camps, swimming classes, and the Explorers Program are a part of the Sheriff's Office many community activities.

Over the past three years, the School Resource Unit has hosted summer camp activities in the City of Ft. Pierce for youth 8-16 years old. In 2016, the agency received a Public Service Grant for \$4,000 to support the project and that summer camp was a huge success. Last year, the Sheriff's Office summer camp served almost 75 kids who may have otherwise become involved in criminal activity or been the victim of criminal activity during the unsupervised summer months.

The Sheriff's Office is requesting funds to support the 2018 School Resource Summer Camp at the Dan McCarty Middle School located at 1201 Mississippi Avenue, Ft. Pierce, FL 34950. This will be the third year for this event. The target population will be children who reside around the school. The camp will be a two-week program beginning June 18<sup>th</sup>

and ending June 29th from 8am-10pm. The event will promote healthy exercise combined with education programs on Peer Pressure, Gang Education, Bullying, Cyber Safety and the promotion of making positive life choices. Each year, community leaders share in this summer experience by visiting and interacting with participants. They share positive life lessons to engage, inspire, and encourage young people to set future goals. Last year's guest speakers included a Harlem Globetrotters Player, University of Central Florida's wide receiver David Gabriel, and Kansas City Chief's Professional Football Player Albert Wilson, who is tentatively scheduled to attend the camp again this year. The basketball portion of the camp will take place in the evenings and parents and the community are invited to come and watch the kids play ball.

The ultimate goal of the Sheriff's Office is to provide for a safe and secure county for all of its residents. This is achieved through building and strengthening trust between community residents and law enforcement. Activities such as the summer camp program, where deputies work closely with young people in a relaxed and fun setting, serve to strengthen these relationships and build community.

**Improve and enhance educational opportunities**

The nightly presentations held on subjects such as Bullying, Gang Resistance, and Peer Pressure will help youth develop the skills necessary for critical thinking.

**Promote cultural diversity**

The City of Ft. Pierce has a very diverse population including differences in ethnicity and economic backgrounds. This summer camp will provide an opportunity for people from a vast array of differences to interact. Inner city kids and deputies whose prior interaction with each other may have been negative will gain an opportunity to see each other from a different perspective.

**Promote outdoor activities and a healthy lifestyle**

Participants will learn the rules of the game of basketball while learning the importance of physical exercise to improve and maintain a healthy body.

**Encourage partnership between City Hall, residents and other community organizations**

The partnership between the St. Lucie County Sheriff's Office and the City of Ft. Pierce to host and fund this event will serve to demonstrate to the residents of the city that its government officials are truly concerned, committed and vested into improving the lives of its citizens.

**Instill and foster community pride**

Youth attending this camp will be exposed to positive role models. Individuals who are genuinely concerned about their safety and well-being. When young people believe that others care about them, they begin to care about themselves. When people take pride in themselves, they take care of their environment.

**Discourage adverse activity such as crime, drug use, and vandalism**

The camp will take place from 8am – 10 pm in an effort to provide a safe environment for the young people attending. The targeted community has a high crime rate as unsupervised young people often become involved in criminal activity or they become victims of crime. This camp will help to get kids off the streets and into a structured setting. Presentations on subjects such as Bullying, Gang Resistance, and Peer Pressure will help to improve self-worth and personal pride. Young people who value themselves are more focused and education driven and more likely to resist criminal activity.

**Inspire and support the healthy development of youth**

The Sheriff's Office goal for this event is to expose young people to law enforcement in a more positive light. By breaking down, barriers of fear and mistrust in the community and sending the message that deputies genuinely care about the residents of the communities in which they serve can and will inspire and support the healthy development of youth and improve relationships.
