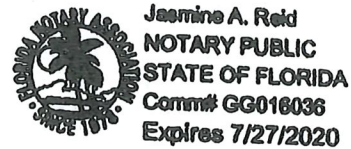

1. Describe your organization and list your Mission Statement.

Sword Outreach Mentoring & Resource Center is a program for at risk youth in Ft. Pierce/St. Lucie County who are facing multiple problems with little resources . . . specifically children directly impacted by violence and crime. In order to combat gangs and violence, in response to a coordinated approach between neighborhoods and agencies, the program is designed for children impacted by significant social problems, most especially domestic abuse, child abuse, and poverty.

#### Mission Statement:

Sword Outreach Mentoring & Resource Center, Inc. is a holistic mentoring organization focused on at-risk young men and young women who are influenced by gangs, poverty or a lack of role models. We help them build the self-esteem, character and initiative to conquer life challenges.

2. Describe your organization's history and prior experience, including a description of programs/projects similar to the one you are applying for in this application.

Sword Outreach Mentoring and Resource Center has been in operation since October 2, 2009. Throughout the course of our existence we have had the opportunity to partner with various organizations, such as St. Lucie County School District, One Florida Foundation, Boys and Girls Club of St. Lucie County, Community Mobilization Team, the Cascade Computer Club, Marine Initiative Cleanup, Inc., the Lincoln Park Advisory Committee, The St. Lucie County Roundtable, The City of Ft. Pierce, Ft. Pierce Utility Authority, Ft. Pierce Housing Authority, Allegeny Fransiscan Ministries, St. Lucie County Children Service Council, Wal-Mart, Eckerd's Youth-Project Bridge and many more who have been instrumental in helping Sword Outreach to enhance opportunities for the youth, parents, and families of communities of Ft. Pierce. Our organization has been able to provide support with intervention programs for students that have been labeled with having behavioral problems in the schools. We have collaborated with various churches in the community in establishing mentors for the youth in the churches. We have also provided one on one mentoring sessions to students referred from Eckerd's Youth Project Bridge, Forest Grove Middle School, New Horizons, and the youth in the local community of Parkland Court and Bethany Court Apts. Our youth, volunteers, and mentors have also worked to help beautify the city of Fort Piece through the Marine Cleanup Initiative, Inc. and One Florida Foundation which entails picking up trash in our canals and neighborhoods.

Sword Outreach Mentoring and Resource Center has received a proclamation from the City of Ft. Pierce for our collaborative clean-up efforts along with ONE Florida Foundation, Marine Initiative Clean-up, Community Mobilization Team, Eckerd's Youth Project Bridge in up keeping the canal stretch from 7<sup>th</sup> St to 15<sup>th</sup> St of Moore's Creek along with the park area of 10<sup>th</sup> St. Linear Park.

Sword Outreach Mentoring and Resource Center received \$4000 from the Public Service Grant of the City of Ft. Pierce in 2016-17. This grant was sufficient in assisting Sword Outreach with it's 2017 Summer camp Initiative. The Sword Outreach Mentor Center has now expanded its capacity to include a youth empowerment session, an adult literacy session, a young lady dance team, a young man AAU Basketball Team, a young man Step Performance team and a parenting enhancement session. All these sessions occur on separate days and are a part of a holistic approach in enhancing opportunities to our community. Items which have been listed within the budget sheet of this grant application are necessary to further accomplish the project of Higher Learning and Community Opportunities.

5. What is your organization's annual budget? Describe how your organization is currently funded.

Our organization is currently funded through fundraisers, in-kind donations, and personal sponsorship from staff and volunteers. We coordinate fundraisers such as car washes, bucket drives, yards sales, dine-in-to donate at restaurants, wal-mart bucket rives, etc. We take part in Friday Fest, were we are able to inform the public about what is offered through our organization, as well as sale items. Our volunteers, volunteer their time as in-kind services throughout the week and weekends. Also our organization receives in-kind services through the housing authority that entails the leasing of the facility at a nominal rate.

How are your services different?

Sword Outreach Mentoring & Resource Center services are different from other agencies similar to our organization because we provide our youth with their own personal mentor. Our mentors provide individualize attention to sports, tutoring and help with homework, to providing some basic, yet much needed, one-on-one attention. Our mentors serve as advocates for the youth. They partner with educators, health care providers, and clergy to ensure that the children's academic, physical, social, emotional and spiritual needs are met. Our mentors also get involved with the parents by helping them build a strong positive relationship with their children, as well as assisting them with job searches, resume writing or sampling informing them of other services in the community that may be of assistance to their particular needs.

Sword Outreach Mentoring and Resource Center, Inc will meet the National objective of benefiting low to moderate income person's by providing low income to moderate families with a community resource center located within their neighborhood without cost. The center is designed to improve our community with a quality of life by providing a location for job searches, resume writing classes, one on one mentoring, an adult literacy program, youth empowerment sessions, parenting enhancement sessions, afterschool tutoring, assisting with homework, developing study skills for our youth and providing the public with additional information to other services available throughout the community that normally would be outside of their reach due to lack of transportation and financial burdens.

Sword Outreach has established a parent committee consisting of the parents of the local area. Sword Outreach utilizes the parents and the youth of the program to do local door to door outreach to inform residents of programs offered. Sword Outreach has a monthly calendar which is distributed to all staff, mentors, youth, and parents of the program. Sword Outreach do consistent yearly toy drives and back to school events that keeps the community engage with the efforts of the program. Sword Outreach also does one-on-one mentoring which requires the parents to be actively involved within the youth life and the program.

The Area Benefit of Sword Outreach Mentoring Center is the Parkland Court and Bethany Court Apts community and the surrounding N. 13<sup>th</sup> St. area. This area is a housing authority low income area. This area has been target for high crime activity that includes gang involvement.

11. Describe the existing problems or needs to be addressed by this program/project.

Fort Pierce suffers from a high rate of violent crime - especially gang-related gun violence. Many of the youth in the county are involved in gangs and dangerous activity. With a crime rate of 67 per one thousand residents, Fort Pierce has one of the highest crime rates in America (neighborhoodscout.com). Child abuse, neglect, or threatened harm rates were higher than state levels, and crime and violence in schools are more than double the state rate for all three-peer counties. Last year, the Federal Bureau of Investigation ranked Fort Pierce ninth on the list of Florida's most dangerous cities. This ranking was higher than that given to the cities of Miami (ranked 10th), Tampa, Tallahassee, and Riviera Beach (Homesecurityshield.org). The high rate of violence disproportionately impacts children residing in Fort Pierce which encompasses 21 square miles, and has a current population of approximately 43,000.

With each of the children we serve, our mentors will strive to promote change in our youth's life by addressing significant social issues in order to improve their quality of life and help fulfill their potential. Therefore, our organization creates an environment that focuses on building character, increasing self-esteem and providing another outlook on life other than violence and crime that plagues our communities. Hence forward assisting our families with finding jobs, other community resources to help increase the stability in their homes that will cater to their emotional, physical and financial needs.

12. Describe your proposed project's activities and how they will address the problems/needs you listed in #11 above.

Our proposed project activities will consist of rehabilitating our youth into mainstream society so that they are able to become productive members of society. This will be done by having one on one mentor that will increase the involvement in contact with teachers. Our project will also increase job opportunities for our mentees. While teaching and increasing the following activities through:

- establishing partnerships to provide job resources and opportunities for our mentees and their families
- engage youth in sports and sport-related activities
- attend community and school related activities
- visiting cultural, educational and career related sites
- engage in fundraising and awareness activities
- host fun activities and trips to amusement parks
- increasing positive socialization through fellowships and outings
- provide tutoring with emphasis on obtaining GEDs and high school diplomas
- arrange trips to emphasize the consequences of making bad choices such AIDS hospitals,

prisons)

- arranging trips/meetings to emphasize the benefits of making positive choices (business sites, career oriented sites, political and civic leadership functions)

Sword Outreach looks to have increase participation with its partner Career Source who provides job skill such as interview lessons, career pathway development. Sword looks to have an increase of 40 to 60% participation from parents and youth within the Parkland and Bethany Court Community as well as the Fort Pierce Community utilizes the Centers computers for job search, career skill development, and educational beneficial purposes by September 30, 2018.

Sword Outreach looks to have its youth participate in more organize sports program that Sword Outreach enlisted such as basketball, wrestling, and flag football. Sword objective is to obtain available coaches who are able to volunteer and commit time in mentoring our at-risk youth. Sword objective is to obtain coaches that can coach the different sports by September 30, 2018. These sports related involvement will serve a purpose of developing character, leadership, discipline, respect, and initiative within the lives of the youth who are apart of Sword Outreach.

Sword Outreach objective is to have an increase participation of 40 to 60% of its youth involvement and participation in multipurpose community events which will broaden the youth perspective of the city of Fort Pierce. This will broaden the youth perspective of life, allowing them to see that there is more to offer in Fort Pierce than just their neighborhood. This will also broaden their socializing behavior as well. Sword objective goal is an increase involvement by September 30, 2018

Sword Outreach objective is to expose the youth to many career and educational related opportunities such as college fairs, career fairs, and even college campus tours that will show the youth diverse pathways of opportunities that are before them that they can achieve through their efforts. Sword Outreach objective is to have an increase of 4 to 5 opportunities to engage the youth in by September30, 2018.

Sword Outreach objective is to have an increase of 40 to 60% participation of our youth involvement in fundraisers activities within the organization that will teach and show the youth an appreciation of earning and obtain desired goals through their own hand labors. Sword objective date of increase is by September 30, 2018.

Sword Outreach objective is to have an increase number of 4 to 5 fun related trips to amusement sites, museums, historic sites, and other extracurricular related trips. These objectives will benefit and show the youth that their earnings through laboring, community service, educational improvements, and character discipline shall not go unrewarded. These objectives of Sword Outreach are look to be accomplished by September 30, 2018.

Sword Outreach objective is to host the Center Operation Hours to the community of Parkland,

Bethany, and Ft. Pierce where the adults, high school, middle school, and elementary school students may have access to utilize the Centers computers for job related and school related purposes. Sword objective is to have an after school hour as well where the youth may also have a time of evening recreation. Sword objective is to have an increase of 40 to 60% use by September 30, 2018.

Sword Outreach objective is to establish an increase core of positive re-enforcing tours to sites such as boot camps, aids clinics, rehab centers and much more that will help to re-enforce positive behavior in the lives of the youth of Sword Outreach. These positive re-enforcements will help the youth to make positive choices. .Sword objective is to have an increase of about 4 to 5 tours by September 30, 2018.

These goals and objectives will be tracked through the mentee IEP plan that will be updated monthly. Each IEP plan will have a log of last month's goals, comments on last month's goals, the current month's goals and comments on the current month's goals. The IEP will also contain progress reports from teachers, parents, and other community workers that the mentee is involved with. This will give the mentor insight on how to better assist the mentee. The mentor will also track the mentee progress through session Feedback in which the following questions will need to answered and recorded in the IEP plan:

- My mentee effectively uses time to ensure development goals are met
- My mentee arrives at meetings on time and is prepared to brief me on recent progress and achievements
- My mentee lets me know if goals are unrealistic or action plan needs revision

Sword Outreach serves about 27 boys, 25 girls and about 48 adults who are all low/moderate income.

Sword Outreach looks to serve an increase of 20 more unduplicated boys, 25 more unduplicated girls, and 20 more unduplicated adults who are all low/moderate income by September 30, 2018.

- Sword Outreach Resource & Mentoring Organization will enhance education opportunities by providing tutoring and assisting with homework assignments.
- Sword Outreach will enhance job training opportunities through its partnership with Career Source who provides job skill lessons such as interview skill, resume skill, and job search opportunities. Therefore Sword Outreach will offer free asses to computers while helping those in the community research careers and connect with employment and educational opportunities. Also by partnering with Career Source, Sword Outreach will be able to provide opportunities to interview and work with prominent area employers, as well as assist with job readiness skills through workshops and job shadowing.
- Due to our organization partnering with St. Lucie County schools, all children regardless of their culture are referred to our organization. Therefore we able to work with children of various cultural diversity, which gives our mentors the chance to teach our mentees about cultural diversity while encouraging them to interact with other mentees that has a different culture from their own.
- Sword Outreach promotes outdoor activities and healthy lifestyle through the various outdoor activities that is provided through our organization, such as wrestling, basketball, hip hope dance and stepping.
- Sword Outreach mentees has had the chance to take part in various community projects that involved keeping our canals and community clean. We have been able to spur the interest of our mentees by centering the clean ups around activities that stimulate their interest and by creating ways to clean while exposing them to activities that they have never experienced before. They were able to pick up trash in the canals while paddling in Kayaks. Therefore we will continue to use actives like Kayaking to spur their interest and participation in neighborhood improvement activities. Community clean ups and educational trips to wild life parks, preservations, the beach etc will also be used to promote activities that protect the environment.
- Sword Outreach has had a great opportunity in involving the community of Parkland and Bethany Court in a community clean-up which brought about a since of community pride and engagement. The event allowed city officials to attend as well as the Fort Pierce City Police Dept to come out and assist in the clean-up. This event was a great effort of revitalizing the neighborhood. Sword Outreach will continue to engage the youth and community in events like these.
- Sword Outreach is now taken part in the Paint the Town Community Volunteer Initiative through the City of Fort Pierce, This project will engage the mentors, and mentees of Sword Outreach to be a community contributor to residents of the City of Fort Pierce that are physically disabled and have specific needs of assistance.
- Sword Outreach continues its partnership with One Florida Foundation and Marine Clean-Up Initiative whose objective is to keep the environment and waterways clean. Sword Outreach has adopted Morse Creek Canal from 7<sup>th</sup> to 15<sup>th</sup> St along with 10<sup>th</sup> St Linear Park as its project to clean every 3<sup>rd</sup> month through this partnership. Sword Outreach engages its mentors and mentees in this community service. This project allows the youth and adults to take pride in its city and communities by volunteering time to remove trash from the water ways and park environment.

- Sword Outreach main focus of mentoring at-risk youth is an effort of developing the character, self-esteem, self-initiative, self-discipline, and self-respect that will help detour the youth involvement or influence by gangs or negative influences. Sword Outreach continues to build on its program curriculum, activities, and one-on-one mentoring efforts to help discourage adverse activities such as crime, drug use and vandalism.
- Sword Outreach utilizes methods of approach such as mental developmental exercises like its creed and pledge that express self-awareness. These exercises promote healthy relationships, healthy conscious, and self-respect. Sword Outreach promotes healthy life styles through many partnerships such as Parent and Teen Connection, and Parent Academy who presents topics such as teen dating, sexual conduct, parent and teen relationships. These efforts are beneficial to both the mentee and their parent.
