The Fort Pierce FireHawks was established in February 2018. The primary focus of this program is to develop self-discipline, self-confidence, physical fitness, good citizenship, and sound character in the youth of this community. Another goal is to fuse the youth of our community with community members that can have a positive impact on their lives

through sportsmanship, fair play, and fellowship. This impact promotes accountability and the likelihood that our children are excelling both on and off the field. There is a great emphasis placed on academics. Tutoring and mentoring are also provided to every child participating in this program. Every child understands that they are STUDENT athletes. The league consists of volunteers from the community with years of experience and who have all these things in common; their commitment to our youth, their love for youth sports and their love for



the Fort! They spend countless hours doing various tasks to ensure this league is a success. Divisions were developed to ensure that every child can safely participate. These divisions include cheer, flag football, and tackle football. Although the season doesn't officially begin until July, we have begun taking registrations. Registrations take place at 1200 Ave M from 11 am to 3 pm on the following dates: April 7th & 21st and May 5th & 19th.

Registration costs are as follows: \$100 for football and \$150 for cheer which includes home and away uniforms for both cheer and football. 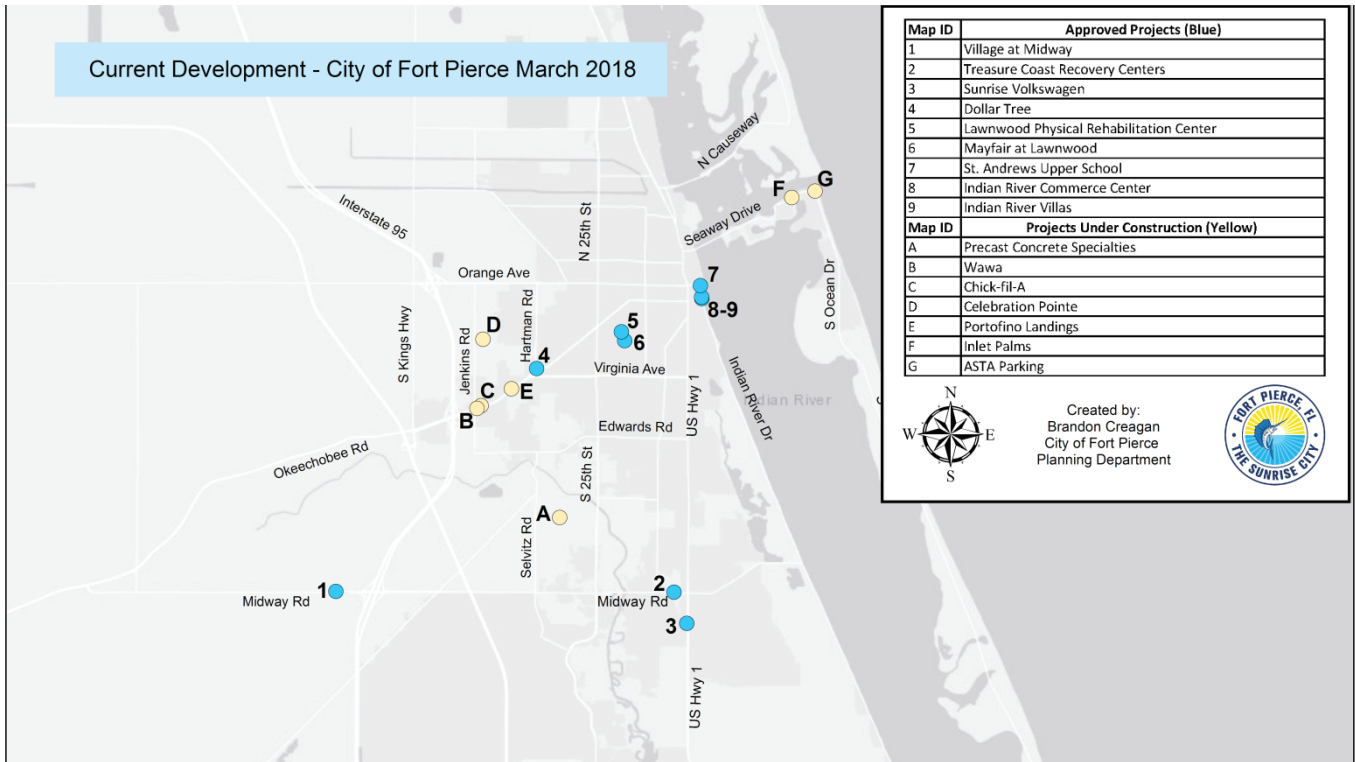




Cider, works.

Pierced Ciderworks, the latest addition to Edgartown, the original neighborhood to historic Fort Pierce dating back to 1887. Pierce Ciderworks is located in the circa 1900 home on 2nd Street, formerly Sailfish Brewery. This unique brewery has a variety of “hard” cider beverages along with craft beers, wines and soft drinks. The new establishment offers a unique “industrial chic” interior, displaying handcrafted metal artwork from flooring and seating to tables and lighting. Guests can enjoy a relaxing evening outdoors on the newly renovated patio and even enjoy a game or two of cornhole.





CURRENT DEVELOPMENT MAP

The month of March has seen various projects move from the approved projects section of the Current Development map to the projects under construction section. The much anticipated Chick-fil-A is under construction as well as ASTA Parking and the single family portion of the Celebration Pointe subdivision. Lawnwood Physical Rehabilitation Center was approved by the City Commission in February for development. Causeway Cove received a temporary Certificate of Occupancy (CO) in February and thus has been removed from the development map. Things are heating up in Fort Pierce and Planning Staff looks to continue adding more exciting projects in the months to come.

KOA

A new Kampgrounds of America (KOA) is coming to Fort Pierce soon. The new facility will be located at 3180 S. Jenkins Road, which is at the corner of Jenkins Road and Edwards Road. The site will feature 323 lots which 197 of those will be pull-through RV lots and the rest will be 126 back-in RV lots. The site will also feature 2 lakes, a pool, a horseshoe pit, pickle ball courts, shuffleboard courts, and a kayak launch. The RV spaces will feature landscaped space, a patio, and a fire pit. Construction is slated to begin sometime during the spring of 2018 and end sometime in 2023.



Bed & Breakfast

The Historic Preservation Board approved plans for restoration and remodeling of the property at 511 S Indian River Drive for the purpose of establishing a Bed and Breakfast enterprise within the River's Edge Historical District and close to downtown Fort Pierce. The plans include enhancements to the building's outward appearances to maintain its historical architectural features, as well as modifications to accommodate future guests such as a dining area, porches and decks and full ADA compliance.



Inlet Palms

The Inlet Palms townhomes are making steady progress as workers continue their building phases. The east side of the units are currently receiving metals roofs while stucco and other details are being added to the remaining.



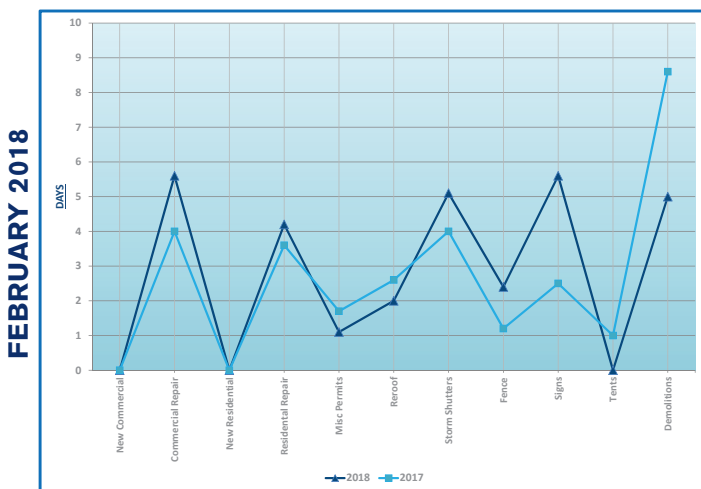


ROOSTER IN THE GARDEN

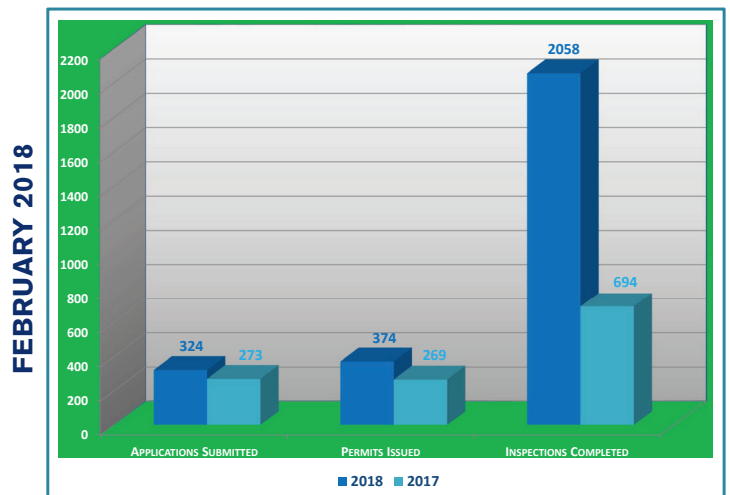

Keeping Up!

The Public Works Department has been busy this month with beautification projects, routine maintenance and the repair/restoration of the Jaycee Park play-sets. Moore's Creek between US1 and 2nd Street received some much needed attention in the form of exotic vegetation removal, tree trimming, sod installation and trash removal. Our partners at the Fort Pierce Utilities Authority were so pleased with the work being performed they have offered to assist in the upkeep of the north side of the creek adjacent to their property. It was a tedious task but the Team did a wonderful job in transforming the area and they have a maintenance plan for the future to keep the area in its current condition.

With all of the positive news coming out of Indian Hills Golf Course, Deputy Director Derrick Johnson wanted to contribute to the visual enhancements of the course. Mr. Johnson organized a team of employees to do a major clean-up along 3rd Street that included tree trimming, exotic vegetation removal and a thorough mowing of the retention area. Staff did an excellent job with this project and the appearance has dramatically improved.

One of the busiest parks in the City is Jaycee Park with thousands of visitors annually. In addition to the water, one of the biggest draws to this park is the play-sets. With the amount of use and the environment that the equipment is in, the play-sets will require maintenance. The playground is currently closed while staff replaces some components and repaints the equipment. Construction continues on the downtown library with completion anticipated within the next 45-60 days.

Coming up on April 14th the Public Works Department will once again host the Keep Fort Pierce Beautiful, Great American Cleanup event held at the PAL center. The KFPB Committee has come up with some wonderful projects and the goal for this year is to have the largest participation yet. In addition to the community beautification projects, there will be an open house for the City of Fort Pierce. We are hopeful that all departments within the City can join us with an informational booth about the services that they provide. As always, there will be food, drinks and t-shirts provided for all of the volunteers and fun activities for children.

We have had an outstanding stretch of rounds for February and March, accumulating almost 13,000 in those two months alone! This year we are approximately 7,000 rounds ahead of last year covering the same stretch from October 1 through March, so we Thank You all for your continued support!

As season begins to wind down a bit, we will begin to ramp up our work on the golf course. In the past week, approximately 100 palm trees have been trimmed around holes #1, #9, #10 and #18 to provide a neater, cleaner and sharper look to the course.

The staff at Public Works cleaned up the west side of our range netting by trimming up our palm trees as well as the swale that runs along 3rd Street. They will be working on our supplemental parking area close to the practice range to provide a neater appearance. Thank You to Mike Reals, Derrick Johnson and their staff for all of their hard work!

It has certainly been a dry winter and we look forward to receiving some natural rain as irrigation alone cannot replace the nutrients it provides. Beginning in May, we will start to work on fairways, greens and tee complexes

to return those to their proper condition. We have begun to spray for weed control and will be cleaning up the practice range.

We have begun to receive our new golf equipment from Callaway, Odyssey, Taylor Made and Tour Edge with several Demos for you to try from each company! Our pricing will be competitive with any in the area and our Members will receive their additional 10% off our retail price.

Our Demo Day was a huge success with three companies in attendance. Taylor Made, Callaway and Tour Edge were all on hand with their newest equipment for everyone to try.
