On Wednesday, July 11, 2018, the Fort Pierce Police Department hosted its 2nd Annual Unity In Our Community. This year more than 1,100 adults and children attended the event, surpassing last year’s participation. Attendees took advantage of the valuable resources, including services for seniors, offender re-entry, health screenings, HIV/STI testing, education, parenting, mentoring, blood donation and much more. “Unity In Our Community is about us together making a difference and it takes all of us to do that,” said Fort Pierce Police Chief Diane Hobley-Burney. “This was absolutely amazing. It showed our commitment to our City and Citizens.”

POLICE OFFICERS SUMMER FUN TOUR

The Fort Pierce Police Department's Crime Prevention Unit set out on a Fun Tour which included visits to five St. Lucie County Public School's 21st Century Community Learning Centers and the Sword Outreach Ministry's It's A Small World Summer Camp. At each location, Officer Damian Spotts challenged the students to see how many kids they could get into a police car or to see who was stronger at arm wrestling. The answer to first challenge was "apparently, a lot" and the answer to the second challenge was "only the kids and the officer knows that answer."

The officers were joined by Chief of Police Diane Hobley-Burney during their visit at C. A. Moore Elementary School. They also went to Lawnwood, St. Lucie and Weatherbee elementary schools, and Samuel Gaines Academy. Officers John Fasanello, Eddie Dove, Jose Maldonado, and Acting Sergeant Willis Tumblin talked to the students, showed off their police cars and gave them stickers and ice pops before bidding farewell.

Spending a few minutes with these kids can make a big difference for them, and the officers are more than happy to do that, especially if huge smiles on their faces is what they get in return.

All the canines are dual certified. This type of dual purpose certification means they can do narcotics detection and patrol work, which includes tracking, apprehensions, and article searches. To become qualified the canines and their handlers had to complete 480 hours of training in patrol work and approximately 120 hours of training in narcotics detection. “To maintain their certification, the team train an additional 8 hours every week,” said Sergeant Tad Lindstadt.

K9 Loki is a one and a half year old Dutch Shepherd mix. His handler is Officer Robie Troutman. “Loki loves to be the center of attention. He likes to jump in the kitchen sink, but hast the water,” said Officer Troutman.

K9 Lotto is an eight and a half year old Belgian Malinois mix. His handler is Sergeant Lindstadt. “Lotto’s hobbies include chewing on his favorite Kong toy, lounging on the couch during his day off, and swimming. He also enjoys removing the squeakers in his favorite stuffed animals and burying the remnants in the yard. Once they have gotten aged and dirty, he will dig them up and parade them around the house,” said Sergeant Lindstadt

K9 Tucker is a one and a half year old Dutch Shepherd mix. His handler is Officer Albert Eckrode. “Everything Tucker does, he does it 100mph. He does not have an off switch, regardless of where he is at home or at work. He loves squeaker toys, until he destroys them 2 minutes later,” said Officer Eckrode.





JENKINS ROAD CORRIDOR

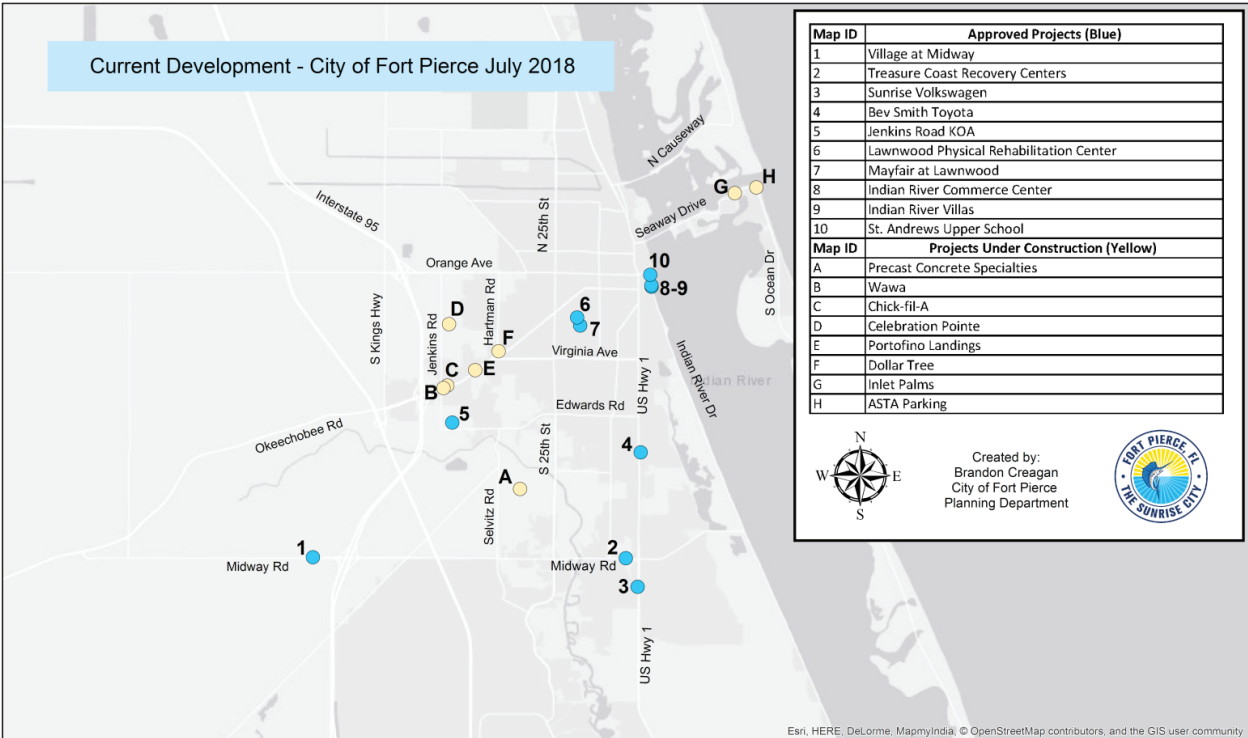
The City of Fort Pierce is on the move! There has been a recent uptick in development along the Jenkins Road corridor. New developments consist of Celebration Pointe, Camping World, Gander Outdoors, Chick-Fil-A, Wawa, and KOA. Celebration Pointe is a housing development consisting of 318 single-family homes, 145 townhomes, and 292 villa-style apartments. Camping World is the world’s largest supplier of RV parts, supplies and accessories. The company has RV Sales and RV Service at over 130 locations. Gander Outdoors, originally Gander Mountain, Inc. headquartered in St. Paul, Minnesota, is a retail network of stores for hunting, fishing, camping, and other outdoor recreation products and services. We are pleased to announce that there are a few other pending applications that align up with this project to become a major corridor.



CAMPING WORLD

Coming soon to Fort Pierce will be a Camping World and Gander Outdoors commercial development that will be situated around the corner of Jenkins Road and Graham Road. The total development will consist of 80,241 square feet of retail, sales, and service facilities. Specifically, there will be a 47,456 square foot Gander Outdoors retail building, a 17,750 square foot Camping World sales/retail building, and a 15,035 square foot Camping World service center. Fort Pierce will be one of the first cities in Florida to have both Camping World and Gander Outdoors in the same development.

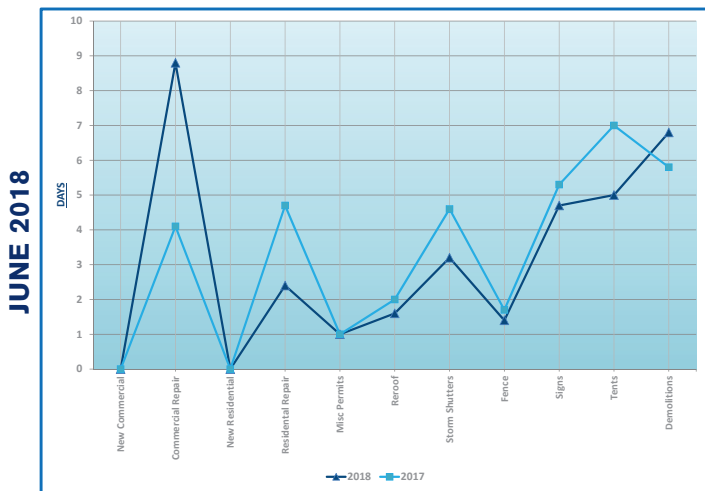

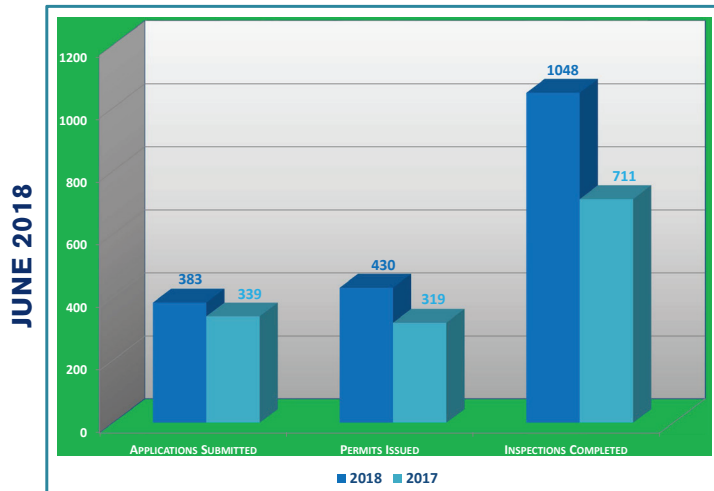

**St. Lucie County Project -
Edwards Road
Drainage Replacement**

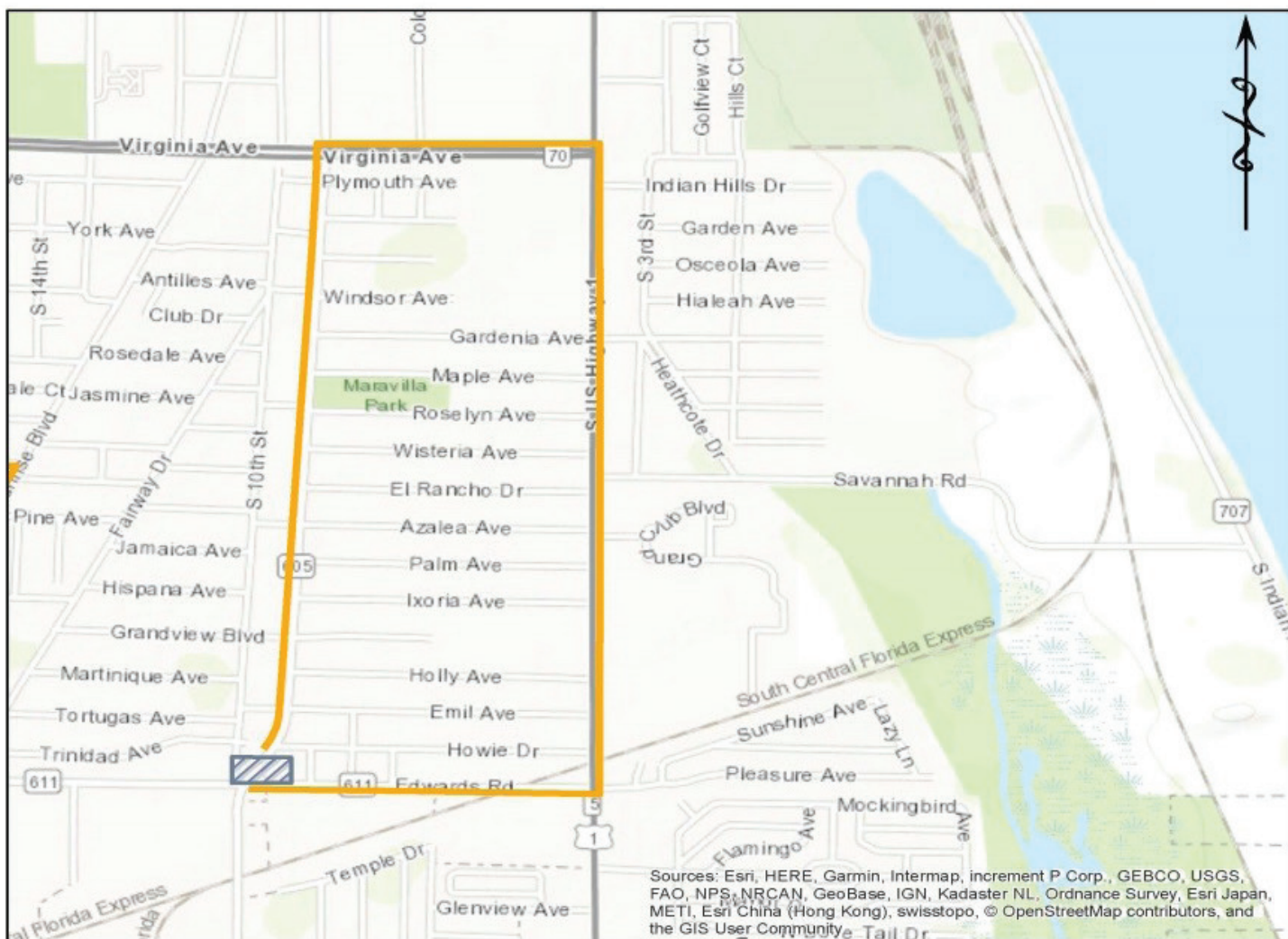
St. Lucie County has completed numerous studies of the 54” storm drainage trunk line located on the north side of Edwards between US Highway 1 and the west side of Oleander Avenue. This conduit is responsible for conveying stormwater run-off from Edwards Road and the surrounding areas west to the City of Fort Pierce Canal No. 9 where it continues its westerly flow to Sunrise Boulevard. At this point the conveyance system reverts back to a piped system utilizing a 72” RCP stormdrain directing the run-off to the west to 25th Street and then north to a detention pond for treatment.

The video televising of the existing drainage system indicated that numerous failures within the storm drainage trunk line have occurred and SLC proceeded implementing an emergency drainage replacement project in order to

maintain the integrity of not only Edwards Road, but also the traffic signal mast arms and equipment. The first phase (currently underway) of the project includes the removal and replacement of a portion of the 54” main line located within and adjacent to the Oleander Avenue right-of-way. In addition, to this replacement a cross-drain that spans Edwards Avenue will also be replaced. This work will be done at night so as to lessen impacts to surrounding businesses and residents. The original construction timeframe for Phase I was July 2, 2018 thru July 31, 2018, but due to unforeseen conflicts, the construction most likely will continue past this deadline a week or two.

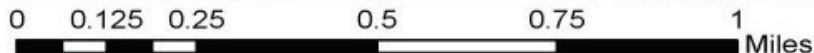
No construction commencement dates have been set for the future phases.
