Scope of Work

Way to Grow Lincoln Park! is a holistic project designed to address current roadblocks that Lincoln Park citizens face when attempting to break the cycles of poverty, unemployment/ underemployment and unhealthy lifestyles.

Way to Grow Lincoln Park! will transform the entire Avenue D commercial corridor, pave the way for new business startups, existing business growth and job creation, improve access to healthy foods, goods and services, enhance retail offerings and spur economic growth and positive development in Lincoln Park.

The Scope of Work for the **first 24 months of the Way to Grow Lincoln Park! Project** includes:

- Provide Commercial Façade Grants for up to \$5,000 each available to commercial property owners on Avenue D, from 7th through 25th Streets (provided by City of Fort Pierce);
- Provide grants up to \$7,000 for ten (10) new business startups or existing businesses relocating to the Avenue D corridor to cover the costs of permitting, licensing and deposits associated with the startup or relocation as well as advertising, rent, utilities, staffing, for the first six months (provided via grant from Allegany Franciscan Ministries);
- Provide grants up to \$3,000 each for ten (10) for new business startups or relocates for interior rehabs, small equipment purchases, etc. (provided by City of Fort Pierce);
- Provide Lincoln Park Business Expo for new and existing businesses in Lincoln Park to include educational workshops, guest speakers, vendor booths with supportive service offerings, etc. (Inaugural event provided via grant from Allegany Franciscan Ministries and the City of Fort Pierce; future expos funded by City of Fort Pierce and collaborative sponsors);
- Continue collaborations with Lincoln Park Main Street and the City of Fort Pierce to market and advertise new businesses via social media, TV and radio, etc.;
- Provide annual Highwaymen Heritage Trail Art Show and Festival third Saturday of February, 2019, featuring the award-winning Highwaymen Heritage Trail, funded in part with grants from the Florida Humanities Council, the world-acclaimed "Original" Florida Highwaymen Artists, the 2nd Generation Highwaymen artists, local vendors, etc. (collaborations between City of Fort Pierce and numerous businesses and organizations);
- Replace Zora Neale Hurston Dust Tracks Heritage Trail markers via funding from the City of Fort Pierce and a grant from the St. Lucie County Tourism Development Council during program year. The Zora Trail is an award winning self-guided trail that features Zora's former home and her final resting place in Lincoln Park; and
- Continue installation of multiple positive, encouraging murals throughout Lincoln Park (funded through the City of Fort Pierce).

Report on the Financial Statements

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of the governmental activities, the business-type activities, the discretely presented component unit, each major fund, and the aggregate remaining fund information of the City of Fort Pierce, Florida (the "City") as of and for the year ended September 30, 2017, and the related notes to the financial statements which collectively comprise the City's basic financial statements as listed in the table of contents.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statement

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America; this includes the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express opinions on these financial statements based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America and the standards applicable to financial audits contained in Government Auditing Standards, issued by the Comptroller General of the United States. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. Accordingly, we express no such opinion. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements.

We have applied certain limited procedures to the required supplementary information in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America, which consisted of inquires of management about the methods of preparing the information and comparing the information for consistency with management's responses to our inquiries, the basic financial statements, and other knowledge we obtained during our audit of the basic financial statements. We do not express an opinion or provide any assurance on the information because the limited procedures do not provide us with sufficient evidence to express an opinion or provide any assurance.

Other Information

Our audit was conducted for the purpose of forming opinions on the financial statements that collectively comprise the City's basic financial statements. The introductory section, combining and individual fund statements, and statistical tables are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the basic financial statements. Additionally, the accompanying schedule of expenditures of federal awards and state financial assistance is presented for purposes of additional analysis as required by Title 2 U.S. Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Part 200, *Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards*, and Chapter 10.550, Rules of the Auditor General, and is also not a required part of the basic financial statements.
