

The survey gathered non-inmate 2017 population estimates of the State of Florida. From the 483 cities and 67 counties of Florida, the focus was limited to just 30 coastal locations of the 550 total (about 5%). Selected were those locations deemed likely to have already addressed vendor deliveries and demonstrations of water apparatuses or other equipment in public parks. Emphasis was given to east coast sites. City size designations of S M or L were based on <25 K, 25 -250 K, and > 250 K, respectively.

Within the application, there are sections which address items that vendors may be utilizing as a part of the event such as: inflatables (wet and dry); music; amplified sound; tents; stages; food; alcohol; special effects etc. We have insurance and licensing requirements to go along with some of these. We are working on updating this procedure with mostly "housekeeping" items. It should be completed, soon. The email attached is our standard format email sent to vendors inquiring about obtaining a permit to operate within our Parks.</p> <p>However, we are changing the way we handle vendors under a recreational/instructional contract. Currently, we provide the location at no charge on the agreed-upon dates and times for a 70%-30% split of fees charged the public. Fees are established by the contractor. We collect all the monies. Payments to the contractors for their 70%, occur monthly. This allows the Division to provide yoga, karate, dog obedience, farm tours, baton, dance, kayak, painting and a number of other classes to the public that we would not normally be able to provide using internal staff.</p> <p>We are now moving towards a Registered Instructor Permit procedure, which includes a vendor registration fee and facility use fee. Facility use fees (different than our standard rental fees) will be established by Pro Formas for the first year, then included in our Fee Schedule, approved by the Board of County Commissioners. Obviously, there will be some areas where a use fee is difficult to establish such as the stadium stairs, used by personal trainers and their clients. In these situations, a general use fee will be established.</p> <p>Please let me know if you'd like me to pass on the updated Vendor Permit procedure/Registered Instructor Permit procedure upon completion. However, we are equally concerned and have looked to others for their info related to this topic. It is my personal belief that these vendors/businesses should have to pay a park permit fee to operate there. The funds could go to offset park maintenance.</p> <p>We do have a couple of places where we really limit use and require fees.</p> <p>At our Community Maritime Park for example, we require all users to get a permit.</p> <p>Also, we have 3 outdoor fitness courts located around town that requires a quarterly permit to use for group instruction. We partner with the business and help promote them. IF they don't sign up with us, they can't restrict non-paying customers from using the equipment simultaneously. Also, we may schedule on top of them if we don't know they are using it.</p> <p>Other than that, we have special event permits and park rental agreements like most agencies.</p> <p>Our enforcement is currently at about 0. We are working towards getting a ranger position. Once we do, along with a new Mayor in December, we may be more proactive in this area.</p>
