our nation's military, conscious of my own deficiencies, mindful of the great trust that has been placed on me and thankful for so many of you who have prayed for me," DeSantis said.

"I will not be a rudderless vessel in this endeavor."

While his speech did not focus on specific policy proposals, the new governor put the environment front-and-center, saying water resources ought to be clean, and toxic blue-green algae ought to be fought.

"For Florida, the quality of our water and environmental surroundings are foundational to our prosperity as a state," DeSantis said. "It doesn't just drive tourism. It affects property values, anchors many local economies and is central to our quality of life."

The environment was a key issue during his whirlwind gubernatorial campaign against Democratic Tallahassee Mayor Andrew Gillum. DeSantis won in November by 32,463 votes, or roughly 0.4 of a percentage point, with the backing of President Donald Trump.

DeSantis' election was a win for conservatives and those loyal to President Donald Trump's nationalist policies and agenda. It also secured Republican's position in the governor's mansion, a post that has not been controlled by a Democrat in nearly 20 years. Both chambers in the state Legislature are also controlled by Republicans.

Both DeSantis and his wife, Casey, who vows to play an active role as first lady, have said they will keep environmental issues as a top priority. But as was true during the campaign, DeSantis has offered few details about how he will govern.

DeSantis also spoke about education during his 20-minute-long speech inaugural speech, focusing on vocational and technical training and school choice.

"There is honor in jobs that require vocational skills and those who work hard in these trades," the governor said.

DeSantis is expected to make the first of three appointments to the Florida Supreme Court on Wednesday. During his speech, he once again repeated what he will look for on the Supreme Court.

"I will only appoint judges who understand the proper role of the courts is

to apply the law and Constitution as written, not to legislate from the bench," DeSantis said. "The Constitution, not the judiciary, is supreme."

DeSantis also warned state and local officials that he will veto proposals that engage in wasteful spending and remove officials who are neglectful of

their required duties, shortly after the crowd cheered his promise of banning so-called sanctuary cities and cracking down on illegal immigration.

High-profile Florida politicians attended the inauguration ceremony, including Rick Scott, whom DeSantis succeeds; former Gov. Jeb Bush; U.S. Congressman Matt Gaetz; state House Speaker Jose Oliva; and state Senate President Bill Galvano.

Following the inaugural ceremony, Scott was scheduled to fly to Washington, D.C., to be sworn in to the U.S. Senate by Vice President Mike Pence.

The three newly elected Cabinet members — Agriculture Commissioner Nikki Fried, Chief Financial Officer Jimmy Patronis and Attorney General Ashley Moody — were also officially sworn in during this ceremony.

Jeannette Nuñez, Florida's 20th lieutenant governor and the highest-ranking Hispanic woman to be elected in Florida history, was also sworn in.

Members of the public also came to

witness the event, which historically is followed by an inauguration parade. But that parade was canceled this year because the DeSantis made plans to baptize their son Mason at the governor's mansion with water brought back from the Sea of Galilee in Israel.

During the inauguration, roughly 100 people stood on a street blocked by law enforcement and took in the promises of the governor. Prior to the ceremony a group of protesters marched on that street, banging drums and wielding signs that read "not my governor" and "we will be watching you!"

About two hours after protesters presented their messages, DeSantis addressed the crowd at the end of his speech, vowing to help "overcome tribalism that has dominated our politics."

"If we set the interests of hard-working taxpayers as our true north, then I have no doubt that the state of Florida will cruise to bright new horizons," DeSantis said. "We will see that rising sun."
