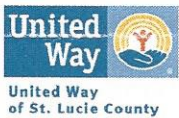
We are requesting a donation from the Police Department Law Enforcement Trust Fund to support our youth development programs focused on crime prevention.

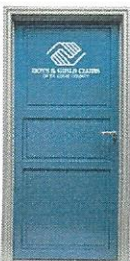

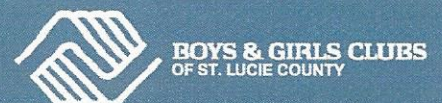


We have changed the name of the conference to the *National Conference on Preventing Crime* to involve more law enforcement and community engagement for everyone. Sheriff Chad Chronister and the Hillsborough County Sheriff's Office are chairing a committee of organizations in the Tampa Bay area that are hosting the conference. It is designed to bring together community leaders, law enforcement officials, and professionals from juvenile justice, corrections, education, victim services and other local, state and federal government agencies. A major goal of the conference is to foster communication and action among practitioners through the sharing of innovative ideas and prevention strategies that have been successful in communities nationwide. The 2018 conference, which was held in Jacksonville, was a tremendous success with approximately 1500 participants from twenty states.

Members of the host committee have been asked to secure necessities for the conference to provide free of charge to adult and youth attendees, including but not limited to: food for the command post and hospitality suite; book bags for youth; beverages; and souvenir items.
