I would like to write a post-Hurricane Dorian story and need to know if you and someone else in the city can provide me some stats.

First, I'd like to know how many hurricane shelters were open in the city and how many residents in total took refuge.

I'd also like to know if any of those were pet-friendly shelters, and if so, how many mascots took refuge with their owners.

As of this advisory, you stated that FPUA reported no outages. is this still accurate?

Since the city parking garage was at capacity due to evacuees, how many spaces in total were filled there?

Did the city pick up residents there and transport them to the shelters?

Do you know if anybody had to be rescued during the storm or could you direct me to who might have that info?

Was there any localized flooding in Fort Pierce or on Hutchinson Island?

Was the south bridge ever closed permanently or just to non-residents? (I know it apparently reopened to non-residents at 6 a.m. this morning)

Were there any damages to city facilities?

As of Tuesday at 8:30 AM, here is the latest information:

Although we are out of the cone of uncertainty, St. Lucie County remains under Hurricane and Storm Surge Warnings. Slow-moving Dorian is beginning to move northwestward at about 1 mph, and a slightly faster motion toward the northwest or north-northwest is expected later today and tonight. Tropical storm force winds may be experienced throughout the day today.

Emergency officials are urging residents to be patient. For your safety and the safety of first responders, please stay off the roads until after the storm passes. Avoid sightseeing.

US Postal Service has been suspended in the zip codes that start with these three digits: 321, 327, 328, 329, 334, 347 and 349.

Uber/Free Rides

Uber has suspended operations for for the Treasure Coast and Palm Beach County due to weather conditions. The decision also means the company will no longer offer free rides to emergency shelters.

Evacuations

The mandatory evacuation for residents on North and South Hutchinson Island, those living in low-lying coastal areas, and manufactured homes is still in effect.

Law Enforcement checkpoints will be at both North and South Bridges are also still in effect. Law enforcement is there to verify anyone going onto Hutchinson Island is either a resident or business owner. FPPD has also activated a Alpha/Bravo shift system which will provide double the normal manpower to increase citywide patrols for our community's safety.

South Bridge

South Bridge will remain open only to Hutchinson Island residents and business-owners with proof of residency or ownership. While residents and business owners with identification may be allowed on to the Island at this time, South Bridge could be closed if conditions are deemed too dangerous to safely cross.

Barrier Island Reentry Program

Effective with the 2019 Hurricane Season, residents and property owners of both North and South Hutchinson Island will no longer need a Barrier Island Re-Entry Placard following evacuation for a hurricane. Once a storm has passed and county officials determine it is safe to access the barrier islands, residents and/or homeowners will be required to stop at the check-point and present two documents to justify their access. These documents include a utility bill, insurance declaration or property tax statement along with a government-issued photo identification. 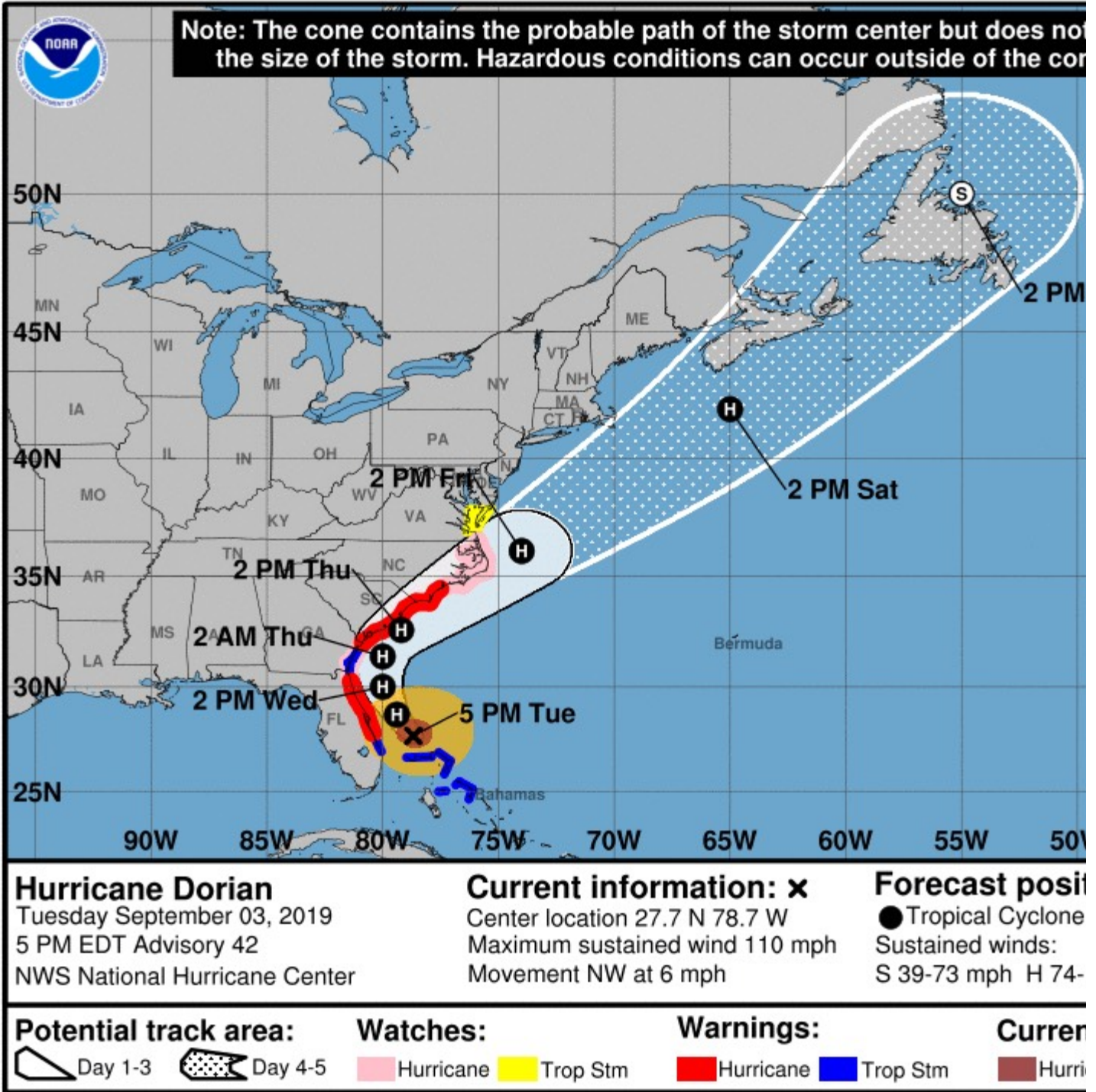

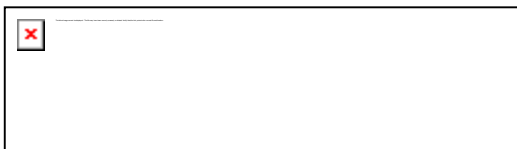
