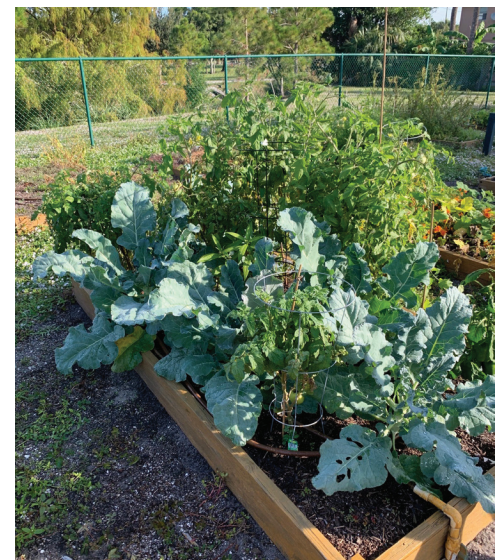

CONSTRUCTION UPDATE



Ohio Avenue and U.S. Highway 1 Realignment:

Construction of the long awaited Ohio Avenue realignment has begun. Many residents and visitors know that this intersection, with its offset east and west legs, is a hazard to motorists attempting a left turn onto U.S. Highway 1. The construction cost of this project is \$1,015,000 and is being funded with FDOT compensation and revenue generated from collected City of Fort Pierce road impact fees.

The design of the project includes the shifting of the Ohio Avenue, east of U.S. Highway 1, to the north to allow better alignment with the west leg of Ohio Avenue. In addition, the intersection will

receive three (3) new mast arms with traffic signals which will eliminate the strand wire traffic system currently in place. Project improvements to Ohio Avenue (east of U.S. 1) include a new drainage system, a boulevard style street with landscaped islands, new sidewalks, curb and gutter and, of course, an entire new roadway.

Current construction activities include the completion of the new storm drainage system, installation of the mast arm drilled shafts, completion of the road subgrade, base, and Type “F” curb and gutter for the westbound Ohio roadway.

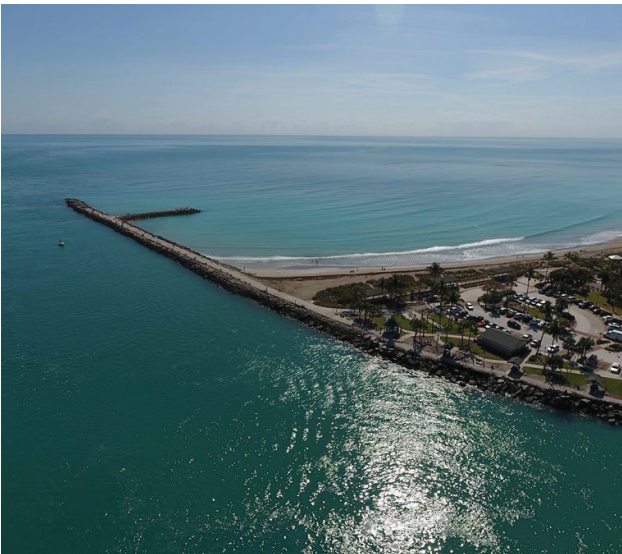


South 7th Street Reconstruction:

All utility conflicts have been relocated and the contractor has completed the Wendell Road drainage construction, with the exception of the final tie-in on the southeast side of Sunrise Boulevard. We are still waiting on AT&T and Comcast to complete the undergrounding of their facilities along S. 7th Street in order for the contractor to proceed with the final roadway construction. Final construction completion is projected for February 2020.

Melody Lane Seawall

Construction activities of the new Melody Lane seawall are wrapping up. All king and batter piles are in place as are the concrete seawall panels. The contractor has completed the grouting of the panel joints and the seawall cap formwork. Currently the seawall cap concrete pours are underway with the contractor completing two 40 LF pours a day. It is anticipated that the cap will be completed soon after the holiday break. Construction completion scheduled for March 2020.



Intercoastal Dredging Update:

The Army Corps of Engineers has requested the City to dredge a section of the IWW to the east of Tern Island. Staff has met with Saint Lucie County Staff, Commissioner Dzadovsky and Mark Crossley with FIND to discuss sand placement options and potential to join their dredge permits as a sub. Sand samples from the area to be dredged are now being analyzed for composition and compatibility to be placed on the beach. Tetra Tech is also finalizing material quantities and creating a dredge template for our unit price contractor to provide a cost proposal.

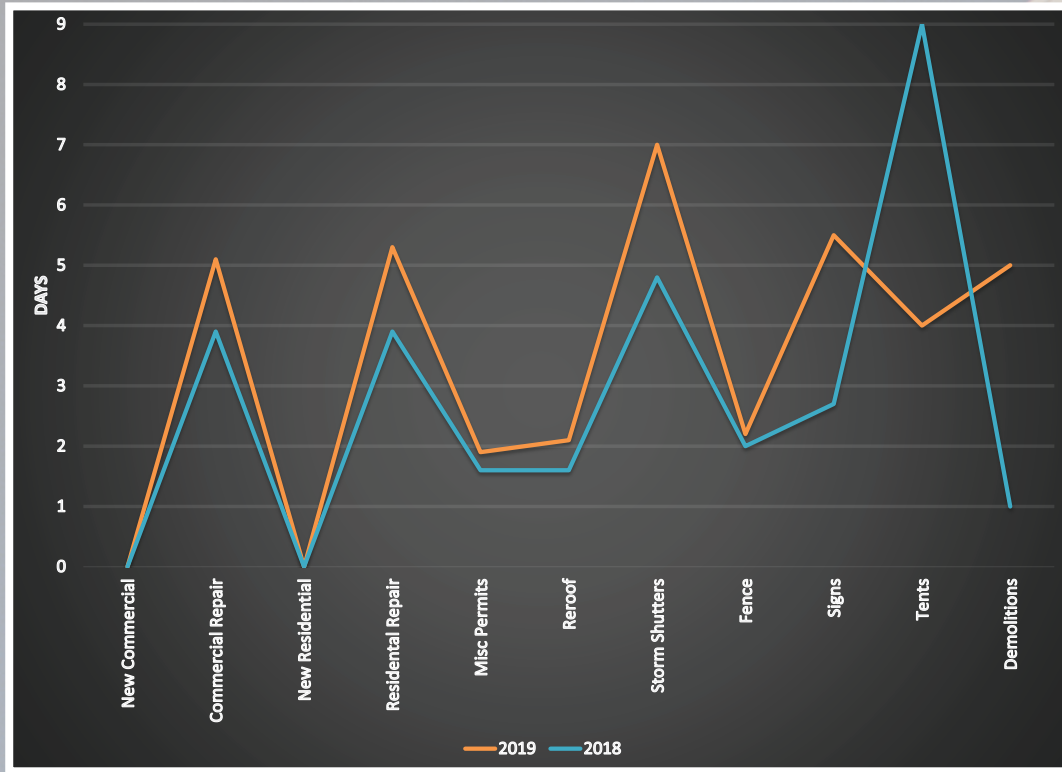
STARBUCKS

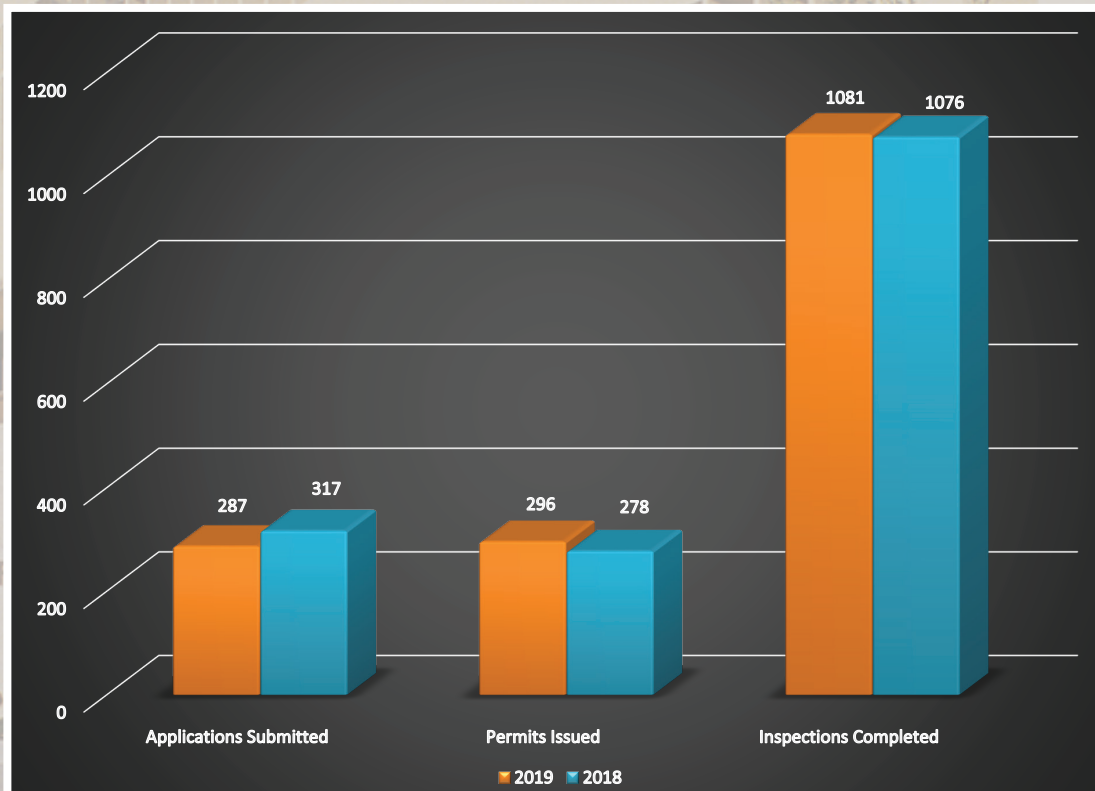

As we venture into 2020 with great excitement, we are beyond proud of the accomplishments made in 2019.

Beginning in February, the Public Works Department launched the downtown tram. The tram is a 15 passenger electric shuttle that transports riders throughout downtown and the PAD. Success has been tremendous and to date over 3000 riders have enjoyed the experience. An app will be debuted in early 2020 that will allow patrons to follow the whereabouts of the tram on their phone.

In March the Public Works Department and the Keep Fort Pierce Beautiful Board hosted the annual Keep Fort Pierce Beautiful, Great American Cleanup. Great American Cleanup is the nation's largest community improvement program which takes place annually in an estimated 20,000 communities nationwide. In addition to the GAC, the City of Fort Pierce was named

Tree City USA for the 30th consecutive year. April and May were filled with community outreach. Celebrating Earth Day, Team Public Works spent time with students at Fairlawn Elementary educating them on recycling and efforts made to keep the waterways in our community clean. The Public Works Department held an open house for citizens to come and learn more about the responsibilities of this department as well as get to know some of the staff. Movies in the Fort was hosted at the Recreation and Resource facility with many kids and families attending.

The summer months of June, July and August were full of rainy season maintenance and youth activities. The Summer Jam Youth Camp was a huge success with over 65 youth from throughout the community. Participants enjoyed daily activities at the gym that included physical fitness and educational enrichment. With the assistance from Children's Services Council, the campers were also able to enjoy STEM (science, technology, engineering, math) and coding activities. It was also the kickoff of a very

successful Firehawks football and cheer season. There were 250 football players and 70 cheerleaders. 5 out of the 8 youth football teams made it to the playoffs and 2 of the teams made it to the Treasure Coast Championship games. The Lady Hawks had an amazing year as well with teams placing at regional and national competitions. Look for more great things to come from the recreation and resource center.

September brought about concerns that we have all become accustomed to, Hurricane Dorian, a category 5 storm was tracking for landfall along the Treasure Coast. We are grateful that the storm made a turn and damage to the City of Fort Pierce was minor. A silver lining to Dorian, the Public Works Department has many new team members and this storm gave everyone an opportunity to go through what it takes to prepare the City for a storm.

October, November and December were arguably the favored months.. The growing of the grass begins to slow, hurricane season comes to an end, and the artisans of



this department get to spread cheer through their holiday decorations. Every year they try to expand their reach and this year found the round-a-bout at Avenue Q and 17th Street receiving a beautiful Christmas tree made of lights.

Often overlooked, the men and women of the Public Works Department are much more than the maintenance arm of the City of Fort Pierce. It is a department filled with people that care about their community and take pride in the work that they do. It is an honor to work along side each of them and we look forward to the wonderful things to come in 2020.
