Calls for Service

In 2020, our Officers responded to a total of **90,425** calls for service. The table below shows a comparison of the calls for service over the past five years.

Crime Statistics

The Fort Pierce Police Department submits a semi-annual and annual Uniform Crime Report to the Florida Department of Law Enforcement (FDLE) each calendar year. As shown in the table below, during the 2020 calendar year, Fort Pierce experienced a 25.7% decrease in total Part 1 UCR crimes compared to the number reported in 2019. Since peaking in 1988, Part 1 crimes in Fort Pierce have been consistently declining. The number reported for 2020 is **the lowest number of Part 1 Crimes reported since 1971** where, according to the FDLE historical records, Fort Pierce reported a total of 1,108 Part 1 UCR crimes.

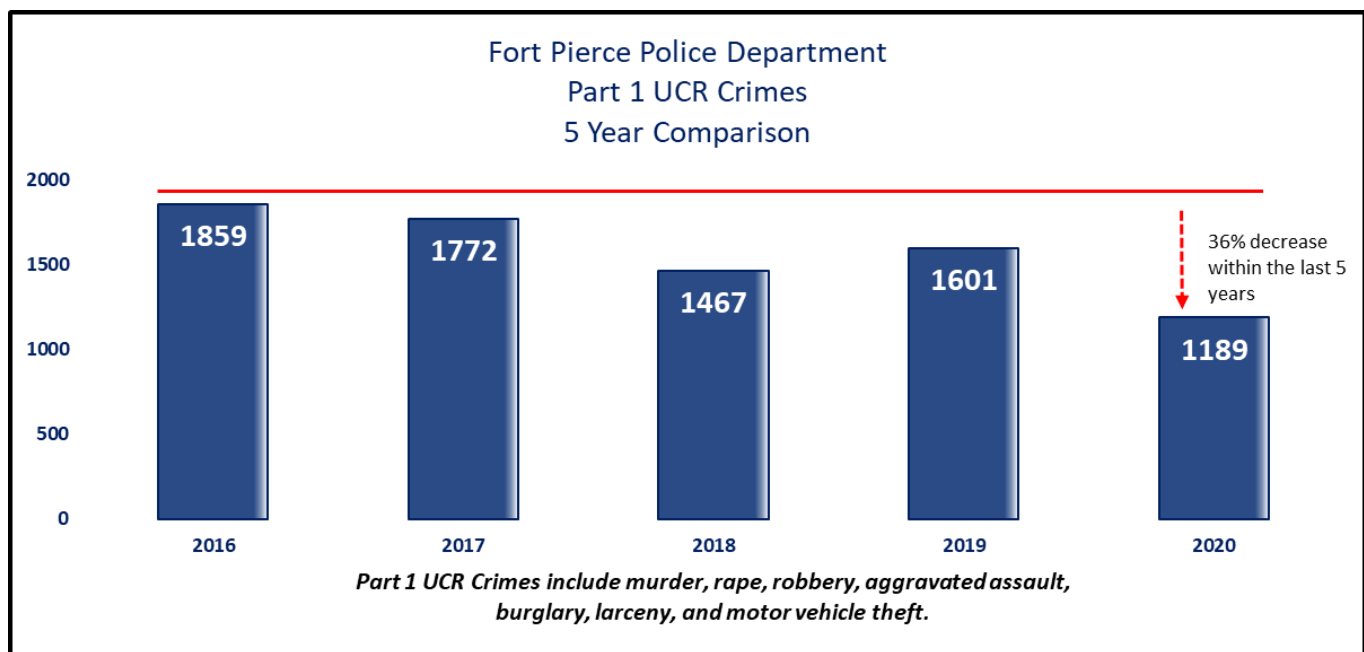

Crime Rate

The crime rate for the City of Fort Pierce is 26.7 incidents per 1,000 residents. Over the years, the city's crime rate has consistently dropped making the 2020 rate lower than the rate of 36.8 per 1,000 residents reported in 1971.

Five-Year Comparison

The charts below show the total number of Part 1 UCR crimes for 2016 through 2020. As a result of policing initiatives, strategies, and community engagement, the City of Fort Pierce continues to experience reductions in crimes. Over the last 5 years, there has been a 20.8% decrease in violent crime, a 39.2% decrease in property crime, and a 36% decrease in overall Part 1 UCR crime.



As mentioned above, crime in Fort Pierce has been steadily declining making Fort Pierce a safer place to live, work and play. According to the National Council for Home Safety and Security (Alarms.org) and Safewise.com, Fort Pierce is among the top 100 safest cities in Florida, ranking 61 and 99 respectively.
