Boys & Girls Clubs teens get to work

What do you want to be when you grow up? It is a question we remember answering when growing up, and we ask it of the youth we encounter today.

Through its after-school programs and summer camps, Boys & Girls Clubs of St. Lucie County (BGCSLC) helps many of the young people in St. Lucie County answer that question, whether they are little kids dreaming of being an astronaut, a dancer, or a basketball player, or teenagers dreaming of being a music producer, engineer, or attorney.

And now, BGCSLC is ready for teenagers, and their more refined dreams. The Clubs have created into the Future, a year-round workforce readiness and career exploration program that helps teens look at all the possibilities the future might hold for them and helps them make realistic choices that meet their needs.

"We don't want them to have anxiety when someone asks them what they want to be when they grow up. We want

them confident knowing that together we can make a plan to reach that goal," said Linda Soto, Vice President of Specialized Services for BGCSLC.

One example of that goal is Elyse Bailey. Before being selected as Youth of the Year for St. Lucie County, she had mentioned that she wanted to be an attorney. This summer Elyse, a high-school senior next semester, started a paid internship at the Hoskins, Turco, Lloyd & Lloyd law firm in Fort Pierce.

The internship did not fall into Elyse's lap.

"These connections happen from our club level staff who pay attention and listen to our members and then follow it to our administration team who then reach out to our partners and donors to make the magic happen and find a good fit for everybody," said Will Armstead, CEO of BGCSLC.

Across the county, Club teens are working in several paid positions at Firestone Complete Auto Care, Indian River Select and in the BGCSLC finance and grant writing departments.
