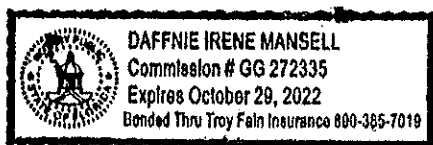

FGSLC is an advocate for music and education. Our various educational programs support the efforts of instrumental music, as well as provide positively life-changing experiences for students. Our youth pledge to stay away from drugs, alcohol and criminal activities.

Future Generations was birthed from a passion of wanting children to feel needed and loved by their family and people throughout their community. Because of drugs, alcohol and criminal activities that children in the St. Lucie County face on a day to day basis, Future Generations has devoted its program to keeping the youth off the streets and offering college as a possibility, by making music accessible to every child. On May 16, 2005, Future Generations SLC was founded in the city of Ft. Pierce, FL by Mr. Joseph Richardson Jr. As the Founder and Director, Mr. Richardson combined his love for music and children together to become one of the most sought after drum lines in the St Lucie County area. This program has been polished and refined to perfection for the past fifteen years under his guidance. FGSLC has received many awards (Ft. Pierce Sunrise Kiwanis Award, St. Lucie Chamber of Commerce Community Impact Award, CSCSLC Award) and has appeared on many stages (St Lucie County PAL, St Lucie County Fair, Annual Sounds of the Season, Sights & Sound Parade, Ft. Pierce MLK Parade, Break the Silence Stop the Violence parade, PSL Opening Football Ceremony, Lincoln Park Juneteenth Celebration) throughout the county. Their most recent appearance is the county's 1st Annual Sounds of the Community, founded by Mr. Richardson. In addition to performances and appearances, FGSLC has been spotlighted on 91.1, 104.7, WPTV and St Lucie County News Tribune.

11. Describe the existing problems or needs to be addressed by this program/project.
Our summer program services low-income families in the surrounding Fort Pierce Area. The impact of the pandemic on K-12 student learning was significant, leaving students on average 5 months behind in Math and 4 months behind in Reading by the end of the school year. These statistics further widened the achievement gap of historically disadvantaged and at-risk students. Our "Reading to The Beat Summer Institute" is strategically designed to not only help students catch up on unfinished learning from the pandemic, but also address long-standing historical inequities in education.

With social distance guidelines in place, there may be a fear and uncertainty to enroll children in a in person at this time. FGSLC is aware of these concerns and offering our program in person and virtual to attract participants and encourage attendance. Our program is not limited to the academics and is complimented by our music enhancement program and outdoor activities. An added component is an invitation to our "FGSLC Community Drumline". We also offer a variety of indoor and outdoor activities/field trips for our campers.

NOTE 1 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The significant accounting policies followed by Future Generations of Saint Lucie County, Inc. are summarized below:

Reporting Entity

Future Generations of Saint Lucie County, Inc., (the "Organization") is a nonprofit corporation operating in Saint Lucie County, Florida. Future Generations of Saint Lucie County, Inc.'s purpose, as stated in its bylaws, is to give youth an opportunity to learn and play musical instruments with peers in a safe setting. Youth will learn how to challenge their abilities through music.

Financial Statement Presentation

Under the FASB Accounting Standards Codification, Future Generations of Saint Lucie County, Inc., is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to two classes of net assets (Net Assets Without Donor Restrictions and Net Assets With Donor Restrictions) based upon the existence or absence of donor-imposed restrictions.

As required by the Revenue Recognition Topic at FASB ASC, the Future Generations of Saint Lucie County, Inc. accounts for contributions as without Donor Restrictions and Contributions With Donor Restricted, depending on the existence and/or nature of any donor restrictions.

Basis of Accounting

Future Generations of Saint Lucie County, Inc. financial statements have been prepared on the modified cash basis. Consequently, certain revenues are recognized when received rather than when earned and certain expenses and the related liabilities are recognized when paid rather than when the obligation is incurred.

Tax Status

Under the provisions of Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c)(3), Future Generations of Saint Lucie County, Inc. is exempt from federal income taxes. Accordingly, the accompanying financial statements do not reflect any provisions for income taxes. It was also determined that Future Generations of Saint Lucie County, Inc. is not a private foundation, as defined by the Internal Revenue Service.

NOTE 1 – SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with cash receipts and disbursements basis of accounting requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

The Organization considers all short term investments with a maturity of 90 days or less to be cash equivalents.

Capital Assets

It is the Organization's policy to capitalize property and equipment over \$500. Musical instruments and office equipment are stated at cost or fair market value at the date of donation less accumulated depreciation. Depreciation is computed on the straight-line method over the assets' estimated useful lives for assets.

Functional Allocation of Expenses

The cost of providing the various programs and supporting services have been summarized on a functional basis in the statement of functional expenses. Accordingly, certain costs have been allocated among the programs and supporting services benefited.

Advertising Costs

Advertising costs are generally charged to operations in the year incurred.

NOTE 2 – LIQUIDITY AND AVAILABILITY

Financial assets available for general expenditure, that is, without donor or other restrictions limiting their use, within one year of September 30, 2021. The Organization did not have any funds available for future general expenditures.

NOTE 3 – ECONOMIC DEPENDENCE

Approximately 93% of the Organization's support for the year ended September 30, 2021 was provided by one grantor.

NOTE 4 – RELATED PARTY

Future Generations of Saint Lucie County, Inc. uses the building, utilities, automobile and equipment of the House of Prayer Pentecostal Church, Inc. (the "Church") to operate its music program. The Organization paid \$5,711 in expenses to the Church during the year ended September 30, 2021. A Director for the Organization is the Director of Music for the House of Prayer Pentecostal Church, Inc.

NOTE 5 – INCOME TAXES

The Organization adopted the new accounting for uncertainty in income tax guidance, which clarifies the accounting and recognition for tax positions taken or expected to be taken in its income tax returns. The Organization's tax filings are subject to audit by various taxing authorities. The Organization's federal income tax returns for the years ended September 30, 2020, 2019 and 2018 remain open to examination by the Internal Revenue Service. In evaluating the Organization's tax provisions and accrual, management believes that the estimates are appropriately based on current facts and circumstances.

NOTE 6 – DATE OF MANAGEMENT REVIEW

In preparing the financial statements, the Organization has evaluated events and transactions for potential recognition or disclosure through January 18, 2022 the date that the financial statements were available to be issued.



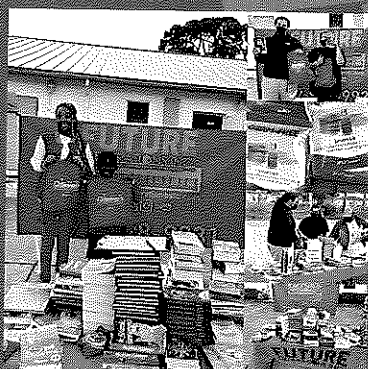
