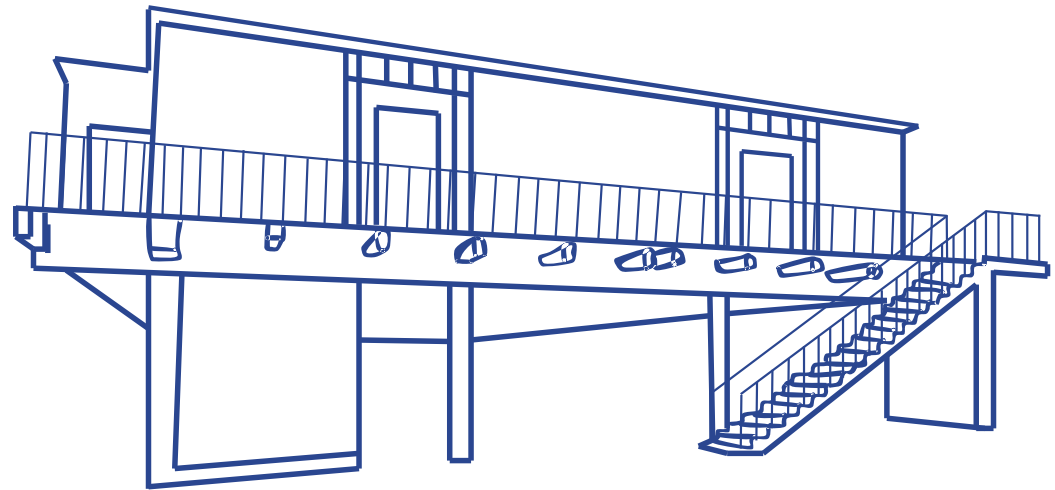

# About Us

**Our Mission** is to prevent and end homelessness on the Treasure Coast and to assure that if homelessness happens, it is brief and non-recurring.

**We are** the designated Lead Agency for the local FL-509 Continuum of Care for Indian River, St. Lucie, and Martin Counties . Collaborating with and guiding 60+ agencies to address homelessness on Florida's Treasure Coast.

**The Housing Hub / Adam's Place** provides access to shelter, coordinated entry, outreach, and housing navigation for residents experiencing homelessness in Fort Pierce and across St. Lucie County.

# Purpose of the Interlocal Agreement

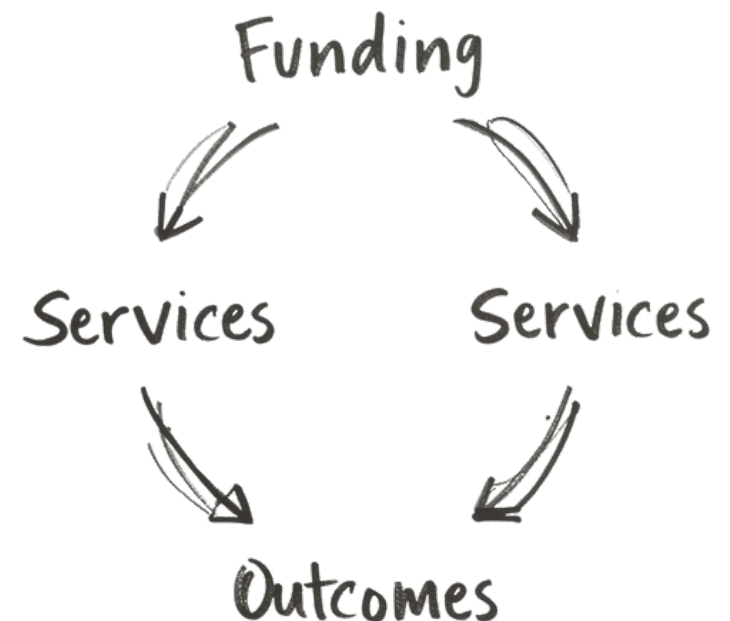
- Funding supports operations of the Housing Hub

135 Successfully Housed



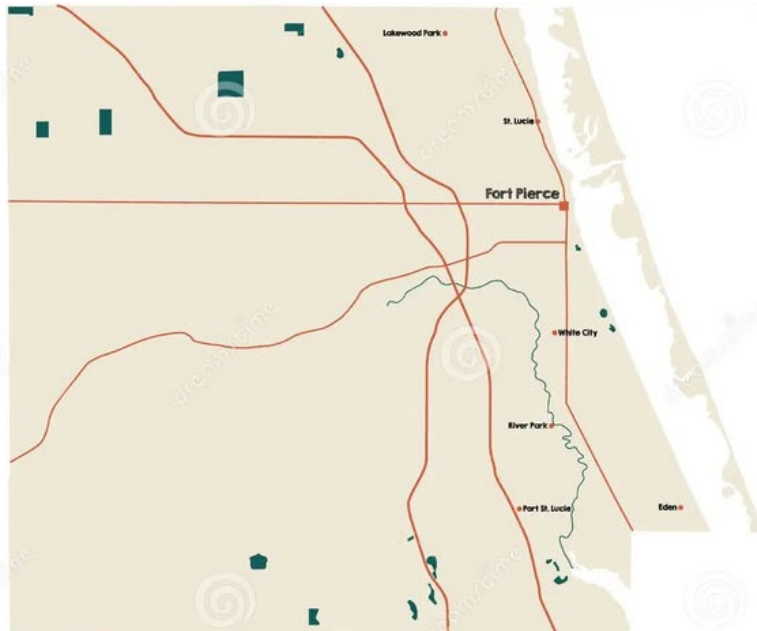
# Core Services Provided at the Housing Hub

- Immediate and safe emergency shelter for unaccompanied women and men
- Coordinated Entry intake & assessment
- Case management & housing navigation
- Diversion & Rapid Resolution services
- Benefit navigation : SNAP, Medicaid, disability applications
- Career navigation / connection to support
- Housing navigation
- Physical and mental healthcare navigation



# Street Outreach & Engagement in the City of Ft. Pierce

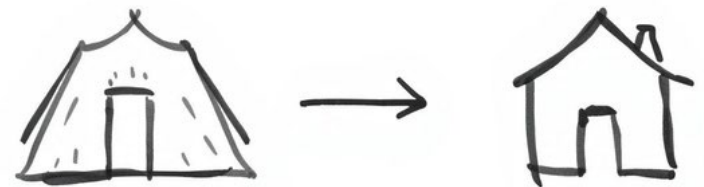
- Daily engagement with unsheltered individuals in Fort Pierce / St. Lucie County
- Connection to medical and behavioral health partners
- Crisis response and safety planning
- Linking individuals directly to Hub services



# Housing Placement & Stabilization Support

Housing Hub staff help households transition from crisis to stability via targeted outreach, emergency shelter, supportive services, crisis mediation, and rapid resolution tactics . Other services include :

- Shared housing
- Landlord partnerships
- Rapid rehousing
- Diversion tactics
- Strong collaboration with local service providers, including those providing :
  - Career guidance / job placement
  - Mental health support
  - Physical health support
  - Recovery Support



# City of Ft. Pierce

## What We See Locally

- City of Ft. Pierce experiences high housing costs and limited rental inventory .
- Seniors are increasing as a percentage of those with housing insecurities .
- Unsheltered homelessness is rising due to a lack of available low-income housing and housing assistance . In addition to shelter space .
- Veterans and medically fragile individuals remain priority populations .

# 2025 PIT COUNT

These numbers represent the number of sheltered or unsheltered literally homeless individuals in St. Lucie County seeking or receiving services or interviewed in camp sites, feeding sites, and other locations on one single day. An additional 1757 individuals residing in the housing of others and were not counted in these totals .
