Statement: "Currents of Florida: Life Below the Surface" is an immersive underwater mural that celebrates the rich marine ecosystems surrounding the state of Florida. At the heart of the composition are sea turtles, a sailfish, and a vibrant array of tropical fish, symbolizing the biodiversity found in Florida's coral reefs, estuaries, and open ocean with also a nod to the Sailfish Brewing Co.

The sea turtles, often associated with longevity and navigation, reflect Florida's commitment to conservation and the vital role of its coastal habitats in the life cycle of endangered species. The sailfish—Florida's official state saltwater fish—represents both the dynamic spirit of the ocean and the deep-rooted fishing traditions that shape local coastal communities. Surrounding them, colorful reef fish evoke the beauty and fragility of Florida's coral reefs, inviting viewers to appreciate and protect these underwater treasures.

This mural serves not only as a visual tribute to Florida's natural heritage but also as a cultural bridge, honoring the deep connection between the people of Florida and the sea that surrounds them.

From left to right, the viewer is taken on a visual journey:

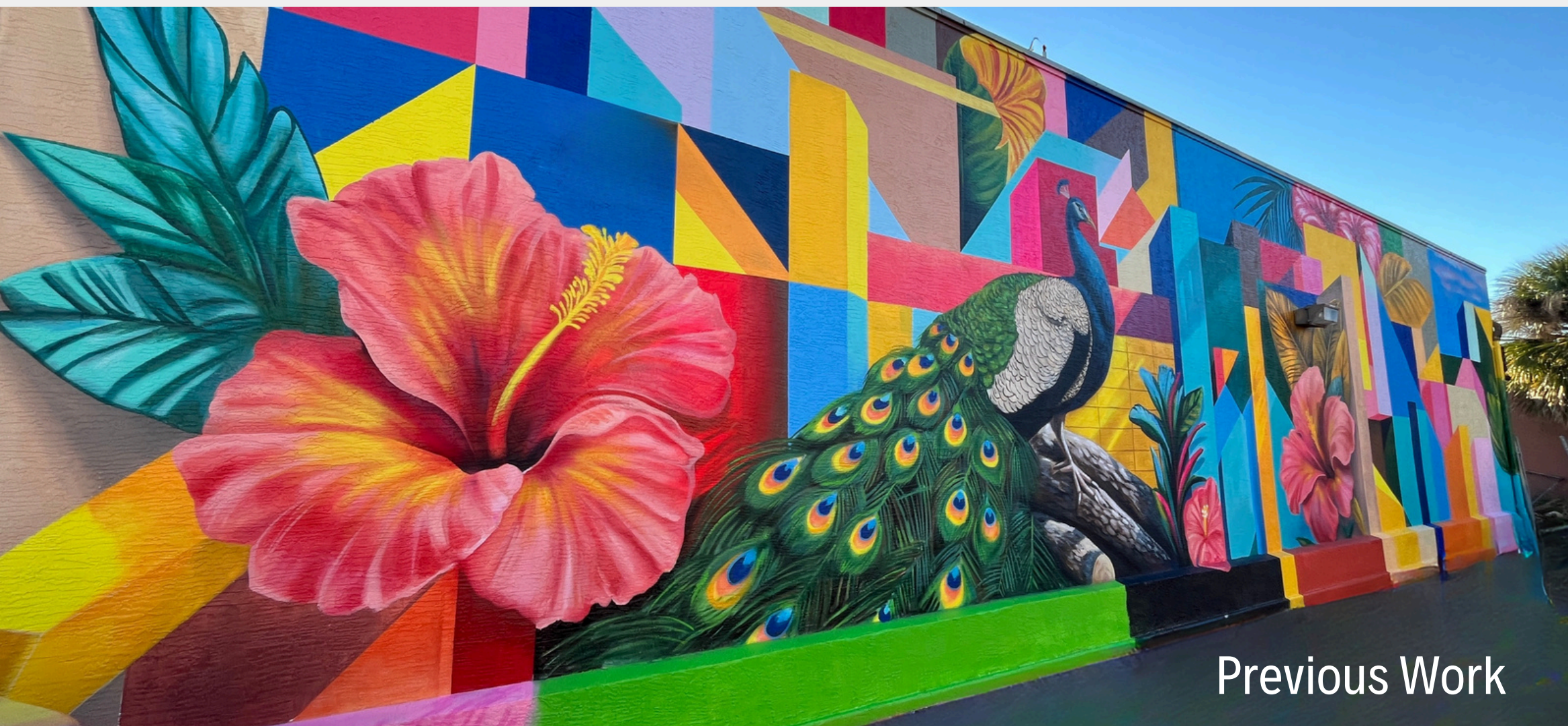
A dramatic sailfish bursts out of a crashing wave, symbolizing strength and agility.

The mural uses anamorphic and realistic techniques to engage pedestrians and create strong community and tourism appeal, while raising awareness about oceanic beauty and preservation.

This dynamic blend of realism and imagination turns the wall into both a celebration of local ecology and an experience that attracts foot traffic, social sharing, and meaningful community connection.

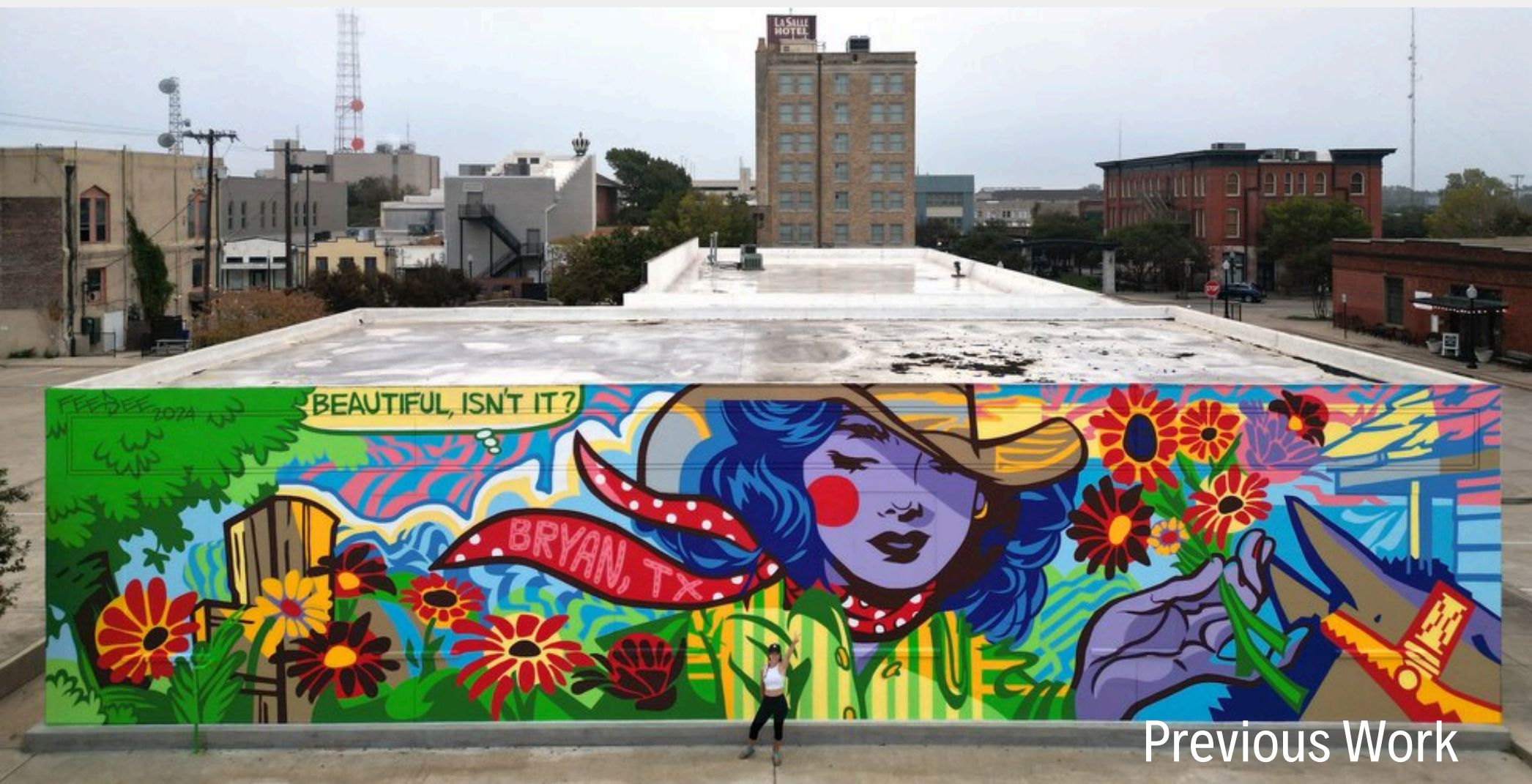

A snorkeler enters from the left, symbolizing our connection to this underwater world and our responsibility to protect it. To the right, an explosion of coral life in neon oranges, purples, teals, and magentas forms the visual heartbeat of the mural. Schools of fish weave through abstract swirls and silhouettes, blending motion and energy into the scene, encouraging viewers to step closer and immerse themselves. Bold use of color and dynamic composition transforms the wall into a selfie-friendly, community landmark, attracting locals and tourists while amplifying the area's cultural identity.

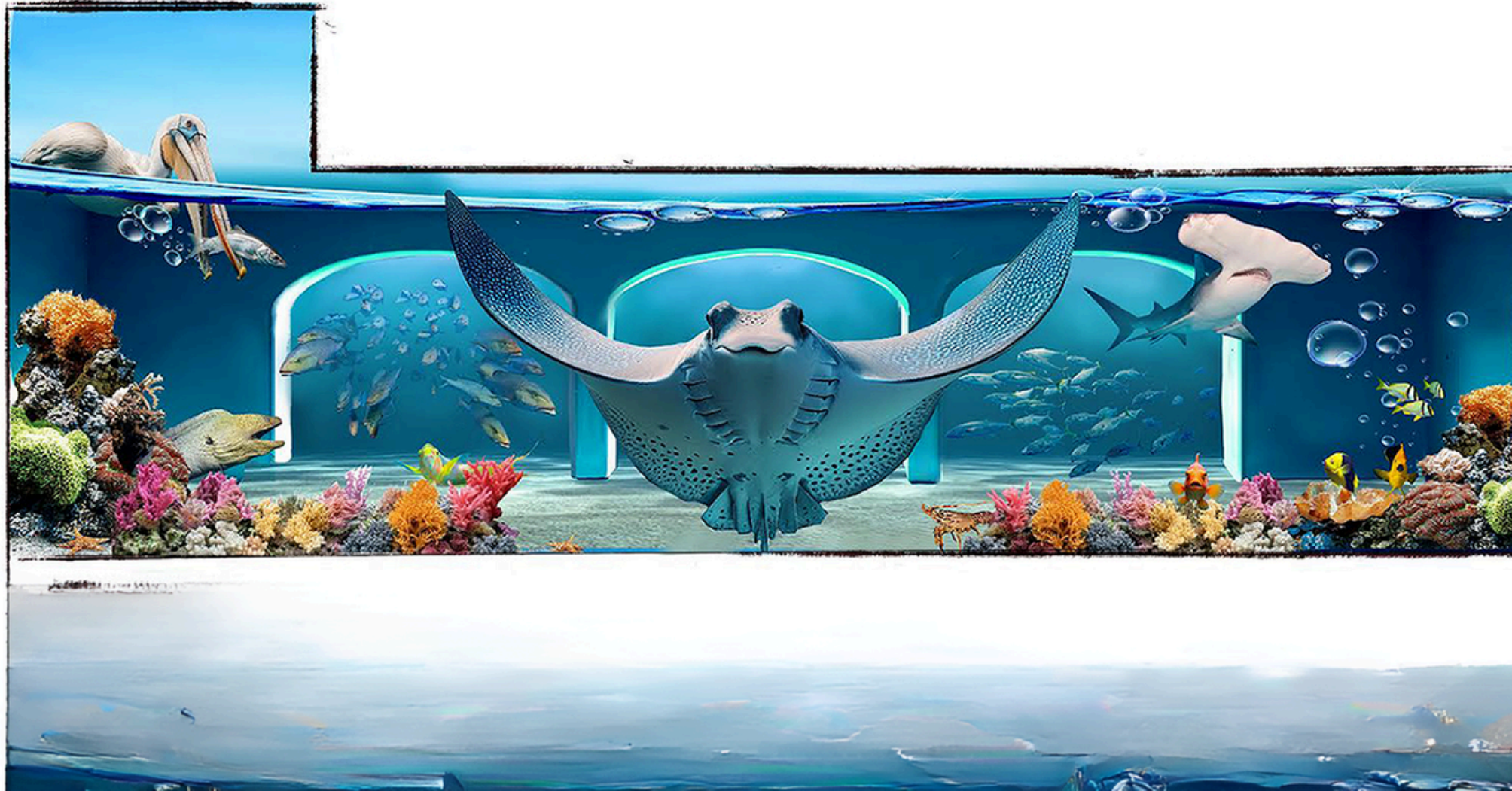

Statement: I was thrilled to see this opportunity, as I have a deep love for marine life and a strong desire to create large-scale, jaw-dropping images of ocean creatures. This wall feels like the perfect canvas to experiment with bold colors and dynamic forms that will catch the eye, emulate flowing ocean currents, and provide an eye-catching artwork for Sailfish. My concept features a stunning octopus stretching across the wall, its arms reaching toward passersby and guiding them around the corner to the door. This is just a preliminary sketch—if the folks at Sailfish and the Mural Program enjoy my work, I'd be excited to explore other marine animals rendered in vivid, realistic 3D, leaping right off the wall.

Some quick notes on my materials: I am very dedicated to producing murals that last decades. I use NovaColor acrylic mural paints, which are extremely durable, vibrant, and long lasting. For this project, I'll use a high quality waterproof primer and finish the piece with an approved UV sealer and graffiti coat to prevent fading, peeling, water damage, and potential vandalism.

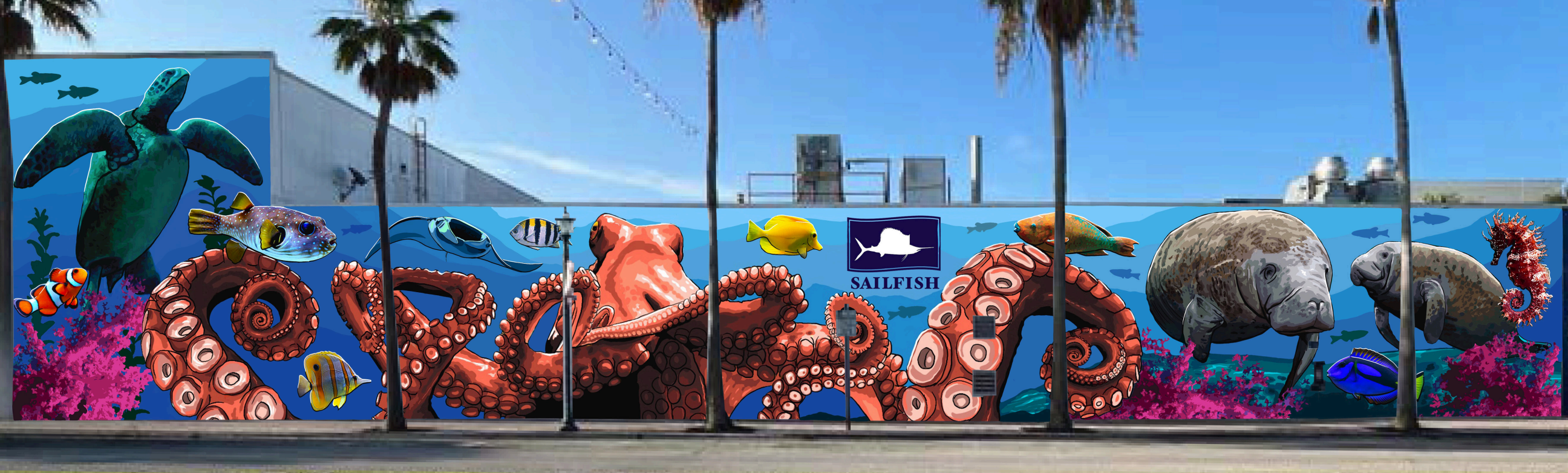

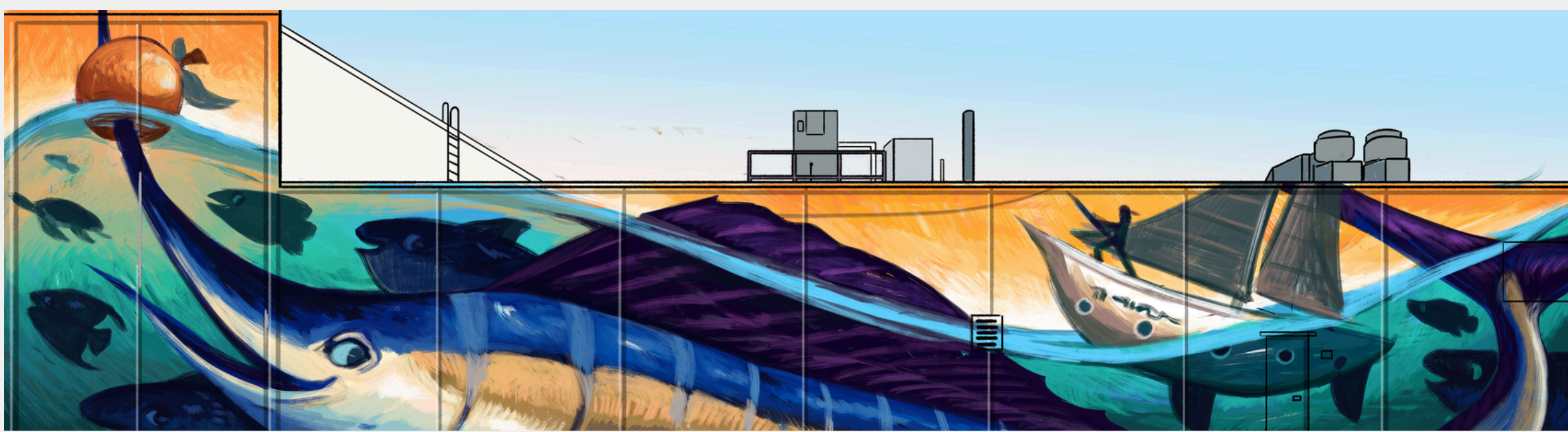
Statement:

My proposal showcases a gigantic sailfish hunting for oranges in the ocean while a sailboat rides in its wake. The sailboat carries a fisherman who attaches himself using a high-powered line connected to the creature's dorsal fin. In the beautiful Floridian sunset, viewers are meant to appreciate the capacity of man and beast to work together.

I love the ability of murals to create fantastical scenarios for citygoers, so I began with a massive fish to accentuate the importance of maritime life in Fort Pierce. The inclusion of the sailboat not only enhances the scene, but it also creates a life-sized reference for pedestrians to understand the scale of this friendly character. Passersby are always my primary focus, so I depicted the sailfish looking down towards the pavement, allowing anyone to have a photo opportunity in which they lock eyes.

Additionally, it represents southeastern Florida's plentiful wildlife, recreational activity, and bountiful flora. This is further explored by the inclusion of other common species around the sailfish, like sea turtles, damselfish, grunts, and others that fade into the background.

The sailfish is important because it's found on Fort Pierce's seal, and I believe this to be a great opportunity to establish a gentle-giant mascot in the heart of downtown. Additionally, as a hunter, I find it very similar to humans in how we've used the sea to prosper. Finally, I wanted this piece to converge with Sailfish Brewing Company, the current business owners within the building.

Statement: For this mural entitled "You Gotta Sea This!" I have a dolphin, sea turtle and octopus, along with other forms of sea life including fish and coral. The really awesome thing about this mural is you will notice an "over the top" 3-D effect, quite literally. At the top of the mural wall I will attach small metal panels (props) to extend certain features such as the turtles head, or the arm of the octopus (see attached sample). These features, along with shadowing in the mural helps to create an eye-catching wow factor that will be sure to capture the attention of anyone looking for an amazing photo-op! I have also attached a couple samples in my portfolio (below) of mural I did for a local Trampoline park, and a ship in which I used the 3-D prop features.

Statement: This mural design for Fort Pierce, Florida, is a tribute to the powerful elegance of marine life, portrayed through a dynamic composition that reflects my signature geometric style. The central figure is a sailfish—an iconic species native to the Atlantic waters off Florida—depicted in motion, swimming from left to right across the wall. Its elongated bill and expansive dorsal fins are strategically emphasized to align with the wall's natural shape, using the horizontal space to create a sense of speed and directional energy.

On the right side of the mural, a group of colorful tropical fish emerges in geometric perspective, gradually increasing in scale as they approach the viewer. This spatial illusion is designed to make the viewer feel smaller in front of the mural, amplifying the presence of nature and evoking a sense of awe and humility. Behind them, a vibrant underwater backdrop of stylized coral reefs adds rhythm, depth, and a celebration of biodiversity.

The artwork magnifies the natural world, not in a literal way, but through a bold visual language—angular lines, vivid color palettes, and fragmented geometry—that brings movement and vitality to the composition. By blending abstraction with nature, the mural invites reflection on the delicate balance between human presence and the vast ecosystems that surround us. It aligns with my ongoing mission as an artist: to reconnect people with nature by transforming public spaces into immersive, energetic experiences.

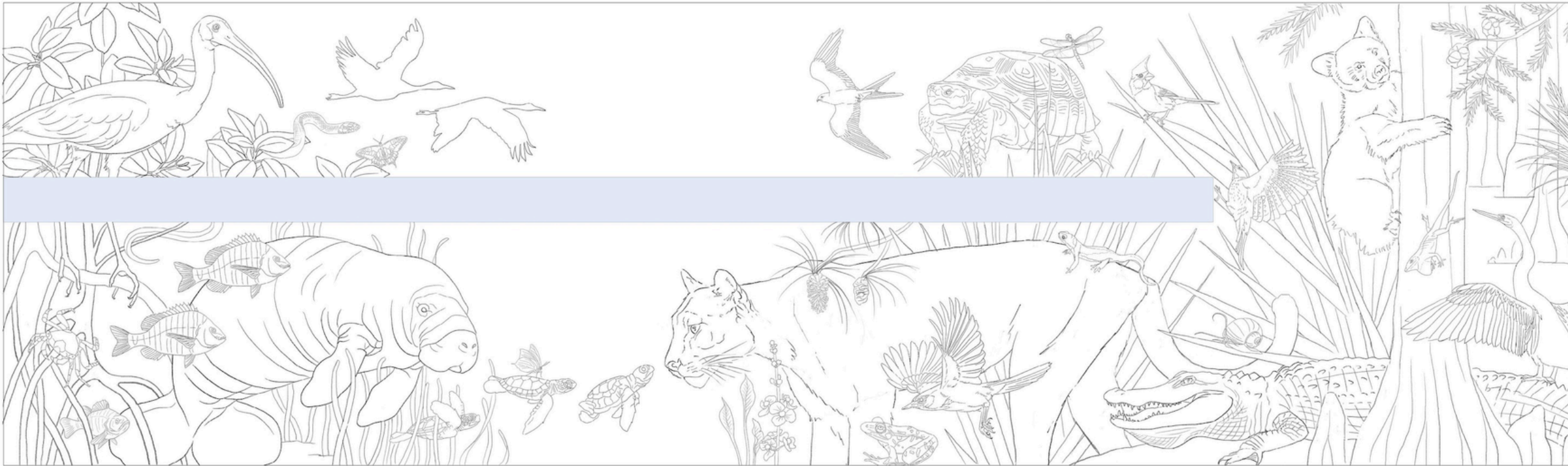

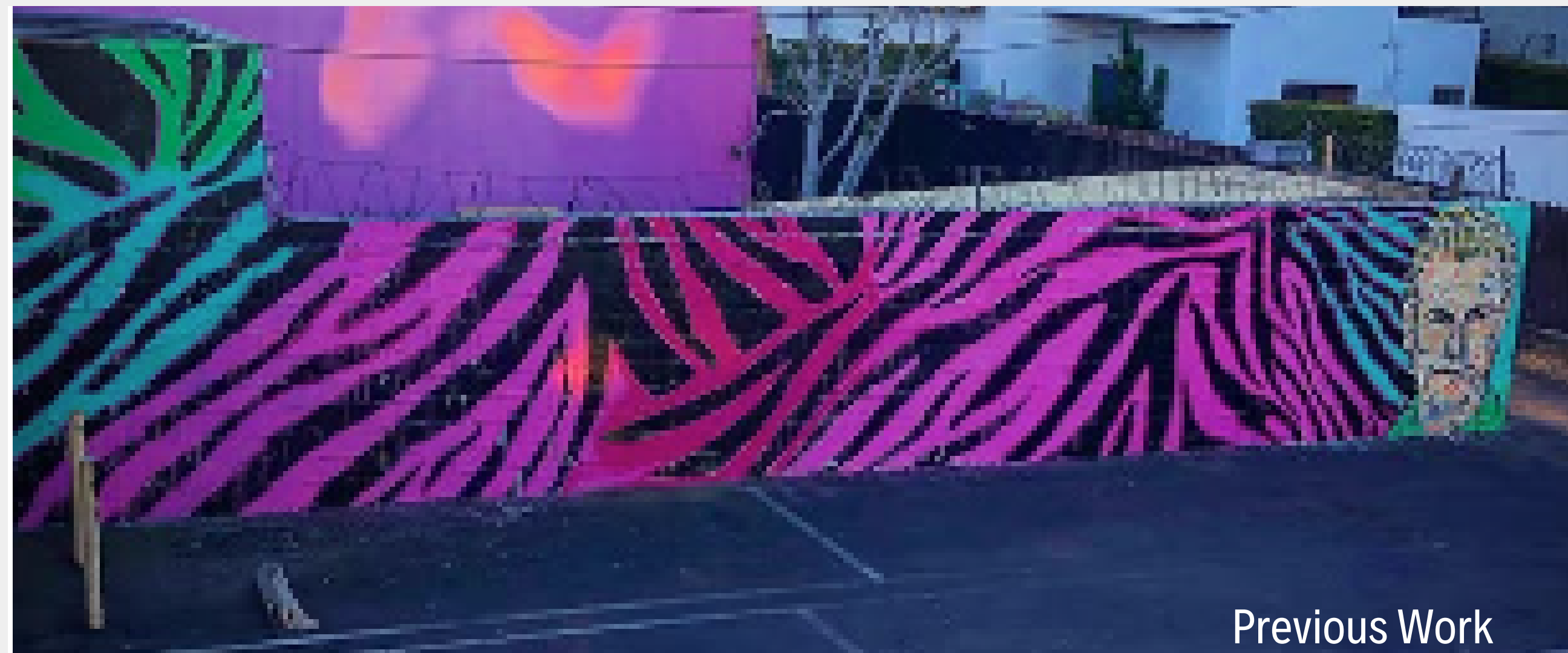

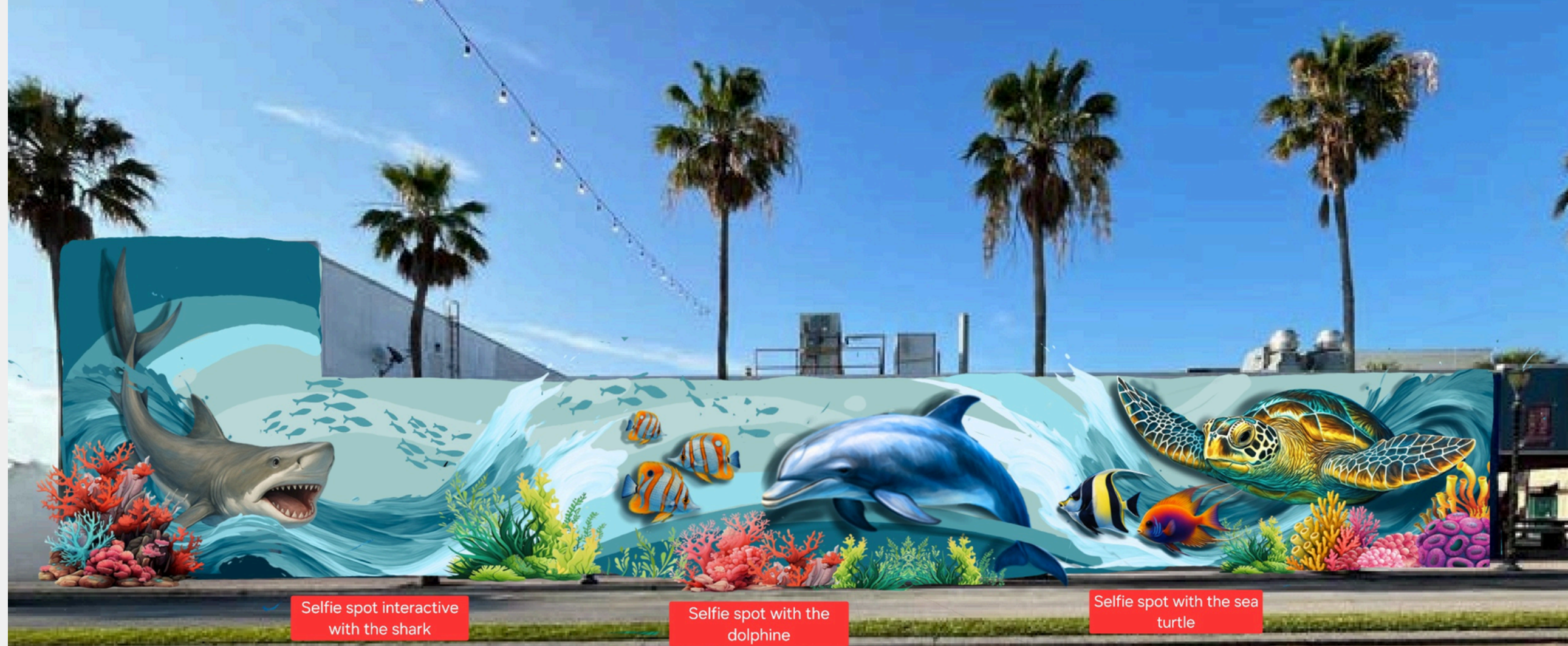
