a. Empower Youth Labor of Love event

The primary discussion focused on the "Labor of Love" project, aimed at assisting senior citizens facing property maintenance challenges. The council reviewed a PowerPoint presentation and script outlining the project's objectives, target audience, and logistical details. The initiative seeks to provide lawn care and minor home maintenance for seniors, particularly those with disabilities or financial constraints, in collaboration with local organizations such as the Treasure Coast Food Bank, children's homeless services, and veteran assistance programs. A structured approach was proposed, including pairing volunteers with beneficiaries and coordinating with city code enforcement to identify eligible residents.

Council members contributed updates on their assigned tasks. A marketing plan was presented, emphasizing digital outreach through social media, partnerships with schools, and community engagement. Volunteer recruitment strategies were also discussed, including outreach to high school students for service hours and creating promotional materials such as flyers and signage. Additionally, logistical support from city departments, such as Parks and Grounds for landscaping and Solid Waste for debris removal, was noted.

It was decided that the project presentation would be formally prepared for city commission approval. A special meeting was scheduled for March 6 to finalize details and rehearse the presentation. Council members were commended for their contributions.

What is adopt-a-neighbor?

“Adopt-a-neighbor” is a fun, impactful program designed to connect volunteers with neighbors who need could use a helping hand of extra support in their daily lives.

Example

Programs such as this have existed for a while so let's take a look at an example that may help us set up our own program.

 <p>TRANSPORTATION VOLUNTEER</p> <p>Drivers connect older neighbors to the community by providing transportation to medical appointments, grocery shopping, and events. Volunteers must be over 18 and drive their own insured vehicle. This commitment is flexible and you may drive as often or as little as you would like.</p>	 <p>ADOPT-A-DRIVEWAY</p> <p>Volunteers adopt an older neighbor's sidewalk or driveway during the winter months. Volunteers clear snow as needed. It's the neighborly thing to do!</p> <p>All equipment (shovel/snowblower) is provided.</p>
 <p>COMPANIONSHIP VOLUNTEER</p> <p>Volunteers are matched one-on-one with an older neighbor to serve as a friendly visitor. Companionship visits include conversation, going on walks, doing puzzles, playing games, or simply spending time with an individual. This volunteer experience is flexible and can be scheduled weekly, bi-weekly, or sporadically.</p> <p>Often, time spent with a "companionship volunteer is the highlight of an older neighbor's day!</p>	 <p>HANDY VOLUNTEER</p> <p>Volunteers help with minor home repairs and chores for older neighbors such as hanging photos, fixing drawers, changing light bulbs, etc. Volunteers are able to choose the tasks they feel comfortable with and arrange the work to fit with their schedules.</p> 

<p>Often, time spent with a "companionship volunteer is the highlight of an older neighbor's day!</p>	 <p>ADOPT-A-LAWN</p> <p>Volunteers adopt an older neighbor's lawn during the mowing season. You can volunteer individually or rotate with friends or family. Mowing is completed as needed (usually weekly) and can be done on your schedule! All equipment is provided.</p>
 <p>ODD JOBS VOLUNTEER</p> <p>We sometimes receive requests for odd jobs and help with one-off tasks from older neighbors. Join our email list and help out as you are available/interested!</p>	<p>Be a piece of the puzzle that helps our seniors remain in their own homes.</p>

Overview

Encourage high school students to assist senior homeowners with home maintenance tasks during the summer, fostering community connection while providing teens with meaningful work and experiencing volunteer opportunities.

Target Audience

Primary:

- High school students (ages 14-18), particularly those interested in community service, earning volunteer hours, or gaining experience.

Secondary:

- Parents of high school students who may encourage participation.
- Local community leaders, educators, and senior homeowners.

Value Proposition

For students:

- Gain volunteer hours for college applications or school requirements.
- Develop skills in yard work, painting, cleaning, and teamwork.
- Build relationships with older generations in the community.

For seniors:

- Receive assistance with tasks they might find challenging.
- Connect with younger members of their community.
- Feel supported and valued by local youth.

Key Messages

- “Lend a Hand, Make a Difference!”
- “Step Up for Your Community – One House at a Time.”
- “Create Change, One Senior, One Smile!”

Marketing Channels

a. Digital Outreach

Social Media Campaigns

- Platforms: Instagram, TikTok, Facebook (target parents).

- Content: Testimonials from previous participants, videos of students helping seniors, “Before & After” yard work transformations.
- Create a challenge: Post a “clean-up selfie” with a senior and tag friends to join.

School Networks

- Partner with schools to announce the program during assemblies, through newsletters, and on school websites.
- Could target clubs such as Key Club or The National Honor Society.

b. Offline Outreach

Flyers and Posters

- Distribute in schools, libraries, coffee shops, and community centers.
- Design eye-catching visuals featuring students helping seniors.

Community Events

- Set up booths at summer fairs, farmers’ markets, or church gatherings to recruit volunteers and spread awareness.

Incentives for Students

- Certificates of Recognition for hours volunteered.
- Community service hours to appeal to colleges.
- Providing snacks and water during volunteering events.
- A final “Volunteer Appreciation Party” hosted at a local park or recreation center.

Collaboration Partners

- Schools: For recruiting students and awarding volunteer hours.
- Local Businesses: Provide sponsorship, tools, and more.
- Senior Centers and Churches: Help identify senior homeowners in need.

Implementation

- April-May would be a “prep period” as partnerships would be finalized, designed promotional materials would be distributed, and social media accounts would be launched.
- June-July would be the start of the program, perhaps with a launch event, and progress would be shared through social media to sustain public interest.
- August would be a time of gathering feedback from students, seniors, and parents to improve the program for the upcoming year.
