**WHEREAS,** Revive Awareness Day was established statewide through Senate Bill 66, known as Victoria's Law, inspired a statewide movement to expand naloxone access, increase awareness, and prevent future overdose deaths; and

**WHEREAS,** the City of Fort Pierce recognizes and remains committed to supporting prevention, treatment, recovery, education, and stigma-reduction efforts; and

**WHEREAS,** the Opioid Abatement Team at the Florida Department of Health in St. Lucie County is committed to expanding access to naloxone, coordinating overdose-prevention initiatives, supporting community partnerships in promoting education, recovery, and stigma reduction throughout the community; and



