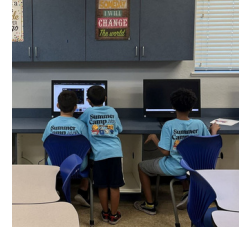

Avenue D - 29th Street to US 1

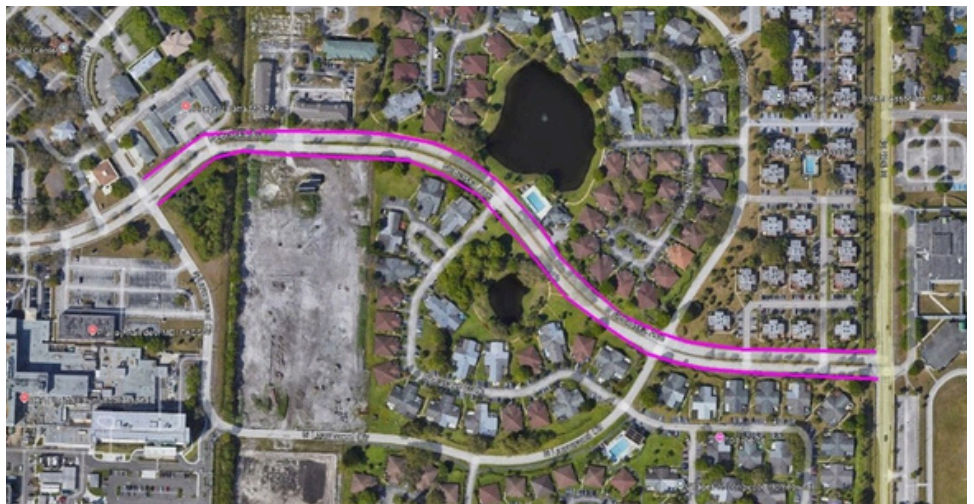
The contractor is set to begin preliminary work, including surveying and related activities, with construction expected to begin the beginning of June. Limited detours along Orange Avenue will be in place throughout the duration of construction. Additional project information is scheduled to be released in a press release.

13th Street Phase II - Georgia Avenue to Orange Avenue

A Notice to Proceed has been issued to the consultant to address Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) comments and finalize the construction plans. This work is currently anticipated to be completed by October 2026.

Nebraska Avenue Sidewalk (Lawnwood Circle)- Phase 1

Staff is coordinating to finalize the contract and obtain City Commission approval. A CEI will be required for this contract.



2026 Steet Resurfacing Program

The 2026 Street Resurfacing Program has identified the streets scheduled for resurfacing. Staff has provided the contractor with the list of roadways and a bid tabulation for submission of the work proposal:

- Crossroads Parkway from Okeechobee Road to Andrews Avenue
- 16th Court from Avenue I to Avenue M
- 15th Street from South End to Avenue O
- Avenue L from 14th Street to 13th Street
- Avenue O from 13th Street to US 1
- Boston Avenue from 29th Street to 33rd Street
- Nebraska Avenue from 33rd Street to 31st Street
- 26th Street from Virginia Avenue to Rhode Island
- Quincy Avenue from Sunrise Blvd to the east end

Avenue B (13th Street to 8th Street) Reconstruction

The City has identified the remaining work items with the contractor and is coordinating efforts to resume work on the project.

SUN Trail Historic Downtown Retrofit - Georgia Avenue to North A1A

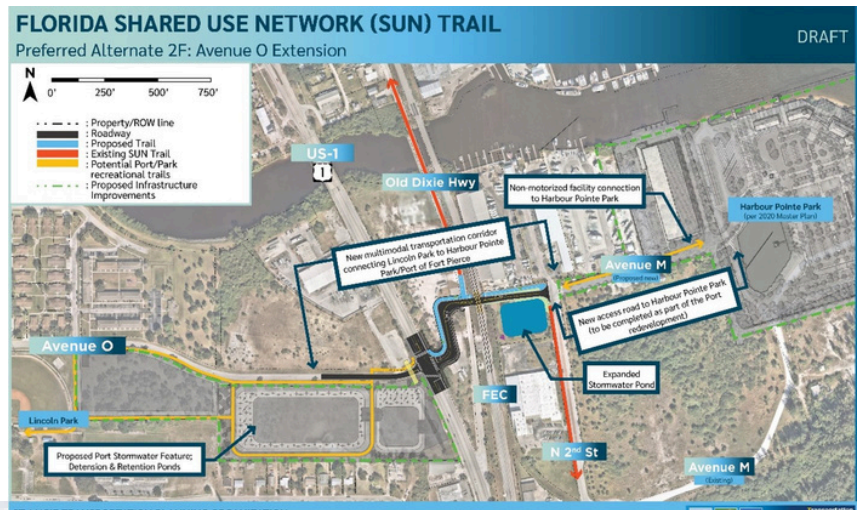
The City has received a fully executed agreement for this project. The Specific Authorization for the consultant will be presented to the City Commission for approval.

Due to the ineligibility of certain areas for SUN Trail funding, along with completed design work in other areas, the project scope has been reduced to include only the segment along South 3rd Street.



SUN Trail Port Overpass

The City has been selected to serve as the Project Manager for the design and construction of this segment of the SUN Trail. A draft FDOT agreement has been reviewed by the City Attorney's Office, and additional information from FDOT is still required. Staff will begin preparing the RFP documentation in coordination with the County, Transportation Planning Organization (TPO), and FDOT.



Surfside Neighborhood Roadway Improvements Phase II

The roadway improvement project will include drainage enhancements throughout the Surfside Park neighborhood. Streets identified for improvements under this project include Melaleuca Drive, Plover Avenue, Pelican Drive, Walnut Court, Eucalyptus Avenue, Cypress Avenue, and Sunset Isle Road. Planned improvements consist of constructing valley gutters on both sides of the roadway, eliminating the remaining roadside swales through regrading, replacing driveway aprons, and completing milling and resurfacing operations. In addition, Fort Pierce Utilities Authority (FPUA) will upgrade water mains and sanitary sewer lines along three of the project roadways.

To date, valley gutters have been installed, driveway aprons restored, and the first lift of asphalt completed on Melaleuca Drive, Pelican Drive, Sunset Isle Road, and a portion of Plover Avenue east of Pelican Drive. The remaining section of Plover Avenue west of Pelican Drive required additional drainage improvements after failed areas were discovered during sewer lateral replacement activities.

The contractor is currently performing drainage installation work along the remaining portions of Plover Avenue, Walnut Court, and Eucalyptus Drive.

SUN Trail Highwayman Trail Gap - Indian Hills

Drive to Georgia Avenue

The City has received fully executed agreements for this work. Final coordination efforts are currently underway prior to advertising the project for construction.



Indian River Drive Corridor Improvements Project - Seaway Drive to Avenue A

This project includes the full roadway and bridge reconstruction of Indian River Drive between Seaway Drive and Avenue A. Corridor improvements include the addition of on-street parking; a curb-and-gutter roadway section complete with sidewalks; decorative street lighting; water, sewer, and electric utility upgrades; reconstruction of the bridge over Moore's Creek; an upgraded stormwater collection system; landscaping enhancements; and ADA improvements, including brick paver crosswalks.

Current construction activities include storm drainage installation, bridge construction, and utility relocation work. Project completion is currently anticipated in Spring 2027.



710 - 704 N. 24th Street

There are four homes under construction at 710–704 N. 24th Street. They have recently completed drywall and are preparing for stucco and roofing. This will be followed by painting and the trim-out phase for plumbing, electrical, and HVAC systems.



4001 Oleander Ave

The new NAPA Auto Parts store at 4001 Oleander Avenue is nearing completion. Only a few final inspections remain before the project is fully completed and ready to open.



3000 Okeechobee Road

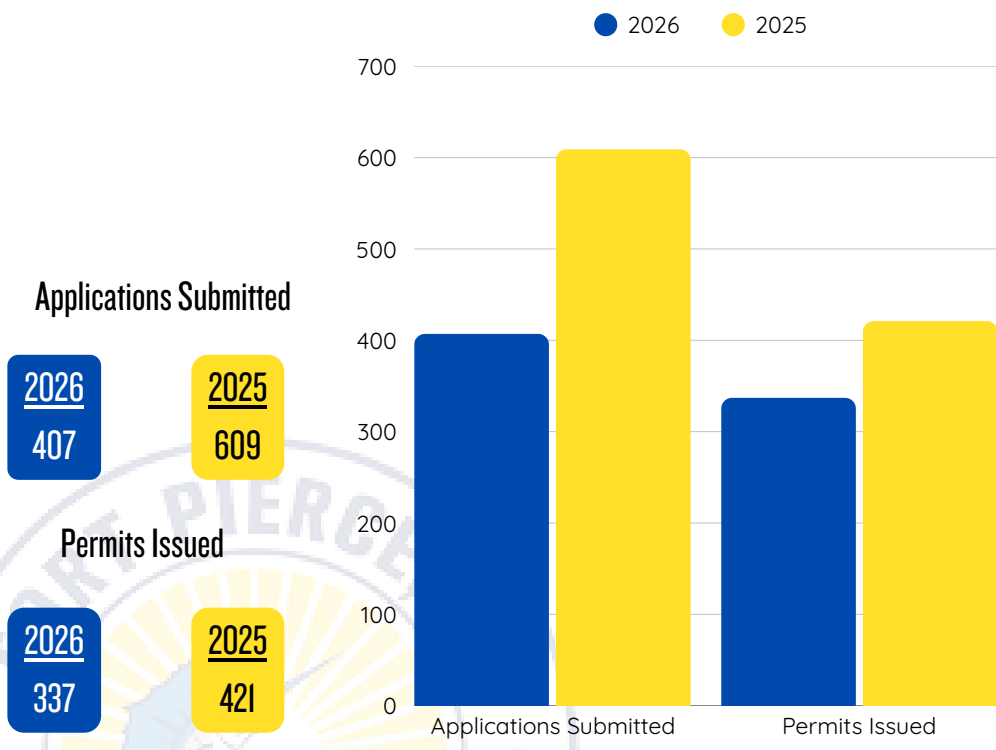

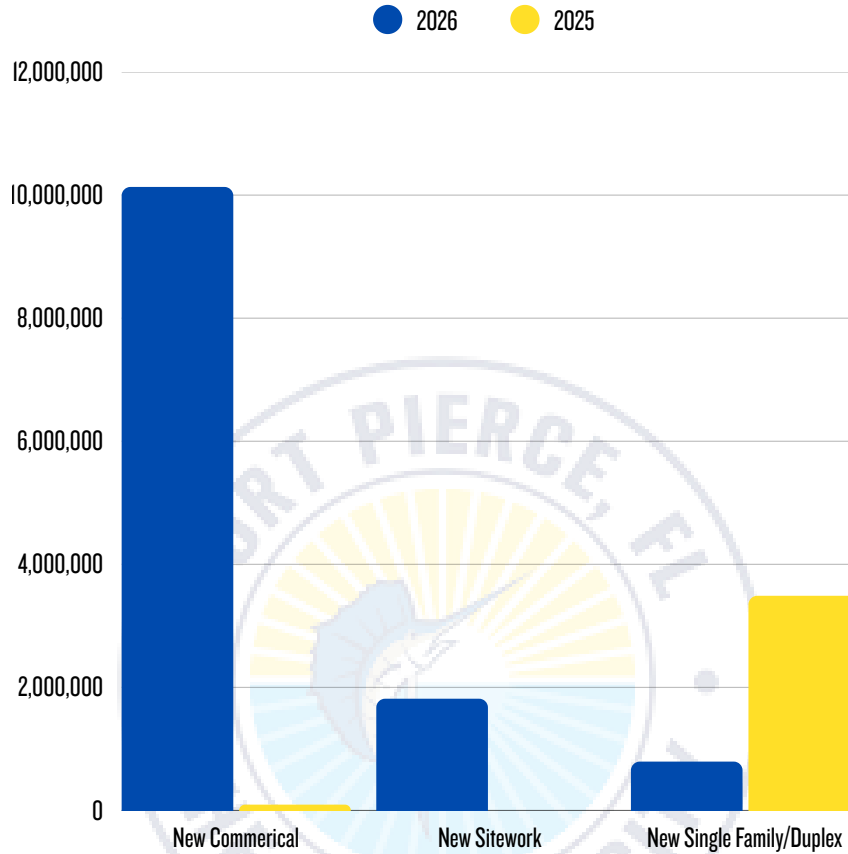

Strong Start

We've had a strong start to the fiscal year. Through May, we were approximately 700 rounds ahead of last year and \$40,000 ahead in green fee revenue over the same period. While there is still plenty of work ahead of us, the improved course conditions have played a significant role in this year's early success.

Grass Matters

Beginning in mid-May, we launched our aggressive summer course maintenance program. The first greens aeration was completed on Tuesday, May 12th, and Wednesday, May 13th, and the greens have responded extremely well. Weeds have been treated, are beginning to yellow, and are being steadily suppressed by new turf growth. We will also be spiking select tees and fairways to relieve compaction following the busy winter season. A second large-scale greens maintenance effort is planned for early September, following a similar approach.

Maintenance Perspective

Beginning in early June, Hole #6 will temporarily play as a par 3 for the remainder of the summer. During this time, we will be performing “inter-sprigging,” which incorporates new, healthy turf sprigs to promote a stronger and healthier playing surface. Hole #6 has been our weakest fairway, and this improvement initiative is intended to significantly enhance the condition of the primary landing area between 150 and 75 yards from the green.
