Subject: Thank You — On Behalf of Jesse and His Supporters

Dear Ms. Blankenship, Ms. Biaselli, and Officer Ramirez,

I am writing on behalf of myself and a circle of friends and supporters who care deeply about Jesse Rojas— and who have watched, with great interest and admiration, the remarkable difference each of you has made in his life.

Not long ago, Jesse was experiencing homelessness and facing what must have seemed like an overwhelming set of obstacles. Today, thanks in no small part to your combined efforts and compassion, he has a safe place to sleep, a clear sense of direction, and renewed hope for his future. That transformation does not happen by accident — it is the direct result of dedicated professionals choosing to see the potential in someone when it would have been easy to look away.

I would like to recognize each of you individually for the distinct and essential role you have played in getting Jesse back on track to financial independence and future success.

Officer Ramirez — you were the first to recognize Jesse's situation and, rather than simply moving on, you took the time to connect him with resources that could truly help. Your decision to refer Jesse to Treasure Coast Homeless Services set everything else in motion. That single act of compassion reflects the very best of community-oriented policing, and Jesse's supporters and I are deeply grateful.

Ms. Blankenship — once Officer Ramirez made the referral, you welcomed Jesse, listened to his story, and took the time to understand both his circumstances and his potential. Your ability to look beyond his immediate situation and recognize what he is capable of achieving led to his acceptance into the TCHS housing program. In providing him with stable housing and access to support services, you gave Jesse something invaluable: a secure foundation from which to build his future.

Ms. Biaselli — your ongoing oversight and guidance are a cornerstone of the program's success. The work you do in ensuring that residents understand and fulfill the terms of their housing assignments is essential — not only to the integrity of the program, but to the long-term success of each individual you serve. Jesse is fortunate to have someone of your dedication in his corner.

I also want to extend my appreciation to the broader team of other staff members at TCHS. The many forms of support they provide create the environment in which residents like Jesse can truly thrive, and their contributions deserve recognition as well.

I am pleased to share that Jesse is making meaningful progress. He is actively pursuing his Commercial Driver's License (CDL), with the goal of securing employment with a major over-the-road trucking company. Last week, he met with SAGE Truck Driving School to discuss their training program and employment opportunities. Next week, he has an appointment with a CareerSource Research Coast representative to explore a WIOA workforce tuition grant that may fund his CDL training.

Looking further ahead, Jesse aspires to earn enough to purchase property and build his own home here in Florida — goals that, not long ago, may have seemed out of reach. Because of the foundation you have helped him build, they no longer are.

I respectfully ask that each of you share this letter with your supervisors and appropriate leadership within Treasure Coast Homeless Services and the Fort Pierce Police Department. It is important that your leadership is aware of the exceptional work you are doing — not only for Jesse, but for the broader Fort Pierce community. Professionals of your caliber deserve to be recognized at every level of your respective organizations.
