- Bureau of Reclamation to release direction later this month.



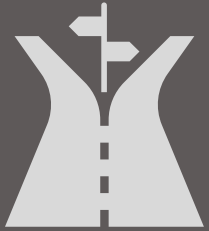
Surface Transportation Program

Update on FY27 Earmark Requests



Bullard Ave Traffic Interchange – Not Sponsored

- Submitted for \$3.39M with a 20% local cost share.



Computer Aided Dispatch (CAD) – Not Sponsored

- Submitted for \$4.99M with a 25% local cost share.



Soil Aquifer Treatment (SAT) Site - Sponsored

- Submitted for \$3.2M with a 20% local cost share.
- \$746,869 in the House Appropriations Subcommittee Bill.
