Judge Ruiz reminded Commissioners' Court that they had submitted the same type of Grant last year and because of lack of funds at the Federal Level, this program was not approved. We are now resubmitting the Proposal with a few changes.

Marcell Lawson appeared before the Court and explained that last year

there were 6 million dollars for the whole State of Texas and this year, there are 26 million plus dollars. She explained that this will put the poor people in Hidalgo County to work and there will be rotating Judges from all over the State. She continued to explain that we will have 25 Judges in all and said Judges will get their salaries paid by the State and not by the County, the County only pays for their lodging and food & transportation to and from.

Frank Castellanos appeared before Commissioners' Court and explained that the performance report that was presented to the State is being presented as part of the presentation to Commissioners' Court for the approval of next year's plan. The report compares this year to last year and in some cases to the year before last. Mr. Castellanos stated that they were ahead of schedule in meeting all the performance standards with the exception of the Youth Employment Enhancement Rate. The reason for this is because it is built into the process that those performances don't come in until the middle and the end of the years. The conclusion of this report that was given to the State is that the actions implemented by the Hidaigo, Willacy Service Delivery area had been impacted performances in a positive manner and as a result of these actions, it is anticipated that all performance standards are met or exceeded in PY-89. He continued to explain that some of the major changes were such as the program that was implemented this year using a computerized education program this past year cost in excess of 1.5 million dollars. This next year anticipation is that of the same effort to serve approximately the same number of students and will cost about 1/3 as much.
