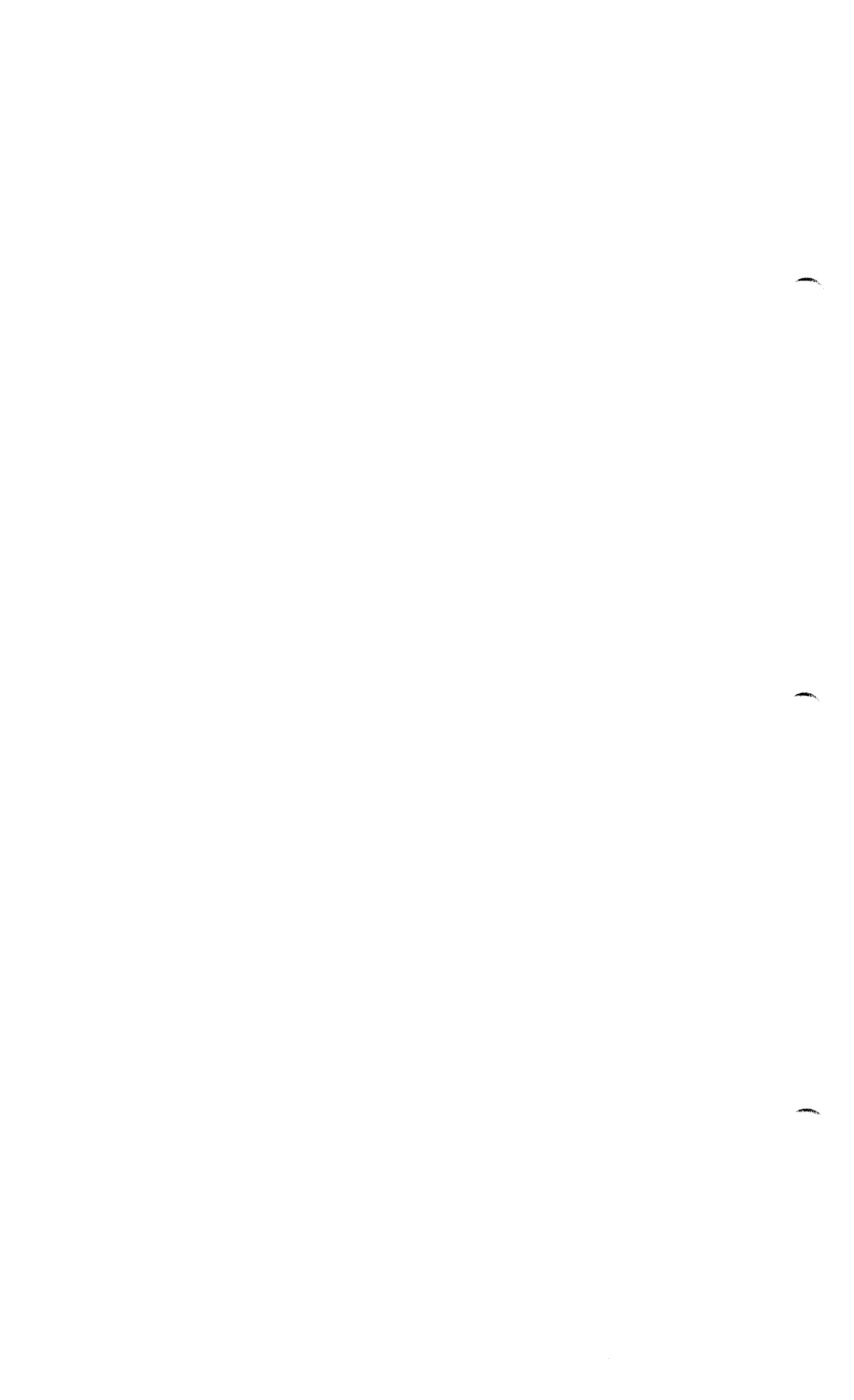

Honorable J. Edgar Ruiz, County Judge, called the Commissioners' Court meeting to order, whereupon the following proceedings were had, to-wit:

ITEM 1. Approval of Bills - Steve Austin

A motion was made by Commissioner Camarillo, seconded by Commissioner Arcaute, and carried unanimously, to approve bills #64,550 thru 65,018 in the amount of \$133,160.68 for the General Fund, bills #62,811 thru #62,912 in the amount of \$137,842.90 for the Special Revenue Fund, bills #714 and #715 in the amount of \$35,000.00 for the Debt Service Fund, bills #4,027 thru #4,030 in the amount of \$143,766.05 for the Capital Project Fund and bills #2,324 thru #2,325 in the amount of \$2,216.19 for the Trust and Agency Fund, as presented by Steve Austin.

MOTION CARRIED.

ITEM 2. Approval of Resolution for 1990 tax roll

Judge Ruiz informed the Court that this is basically the summary of all the County ratios, the appraised values, taxable value for the County which is tax rate at .3717 which includes General Fund, Road & Bridge & Parks, in Debt Service, Drainage Districts, South Texas Business District and the 5 Fire Districts, Road District #5 then four Fire Districts #1, #2, #3 & #4. In terms of the taxable dollars is \$37,229,232.81 (all assessments put together). Note is made of the partial County Exemptions which is Homestead, over age of 65 and Disabled Veterans. We have total exemptions of approximately \$248,614.530.00. Judge Ruiz continued to explain that we then have the AG Youth Exemption, under 1D-23, we have 23 tracts totaling \$346,277.00 and under 1D-1 we have 17,984 tracts which have an exemption of \$859,629,520.00 and total is \$859,975,797.00. The tax rates in the County are .3713, Drainage District .1582, Rate of Ind. School Dist. .0375, Road Dist. #1 one cent, Fire District #1 is .0146, Fire District #2 is .0300, Fire Dist. #3 is .0269 and Fire District #4 is .0293.

A motion was made by Commissioner Arcaute, seconded by Commissioner Camarillo, adopting the Resolution resolving that said appraisal roll which amounts of Taxes entered is hereby approved for the 1990 tax year.

ITEM 3. Consideration and approval of renewal of lease for Hidalgo County Library system

Judge Ruiz explained that this is an extension of the contract and is at a less rate. The monthly rent is being reduced from \$550.00 to \$534.00 and is a contract extension for 2 more years at \$534.00.

Mr. McGee appeared before the Court and explained that the office premises are acceptable for their operation at this time and definitely for the next 2 years. He explained that the reduction in the lease is after discussion with his staff, stating that they were somewhat displeased with the janitorial services that were available. The landlord agreed to reduce the rate if they would look after their own and cancel the janitorial services previously provided. He explained that on the contract, item #3 reads, "The Lessee shall provide their own janitorial services", thus needing to make the change.

A motion was made by Commissioner Salinas, seconded by Commissioners Camarillo and Cavazos, to authorize an amendment to the existing lease by extending the contract for one year at the rental rate of \$534.00 per month, lessee shall pay electricity and shall provide their own janitorial service,

the term of the lease dated November 19, 1979 shall be extended for a period of one year beginning December 1, 1990 thru November 30, 1991. All the conditions thereof in the contract are in full force and effect.

ITEM 4. Request to advertise for office furniture and equipment - Adult Probation Department

Mr. Castaneda appeared before the Court and explained that this is for the equipment necessary to move into the new Administration Building and the other part is the replacement of approximately 1/4 of existing equipment that has not been replaced in a long time.

Judge Ruiz explained his concern with the advertising is that we are under the process of receiving bids for the renovation and anticipate that the earliest, possible date of construction will begin on the first of the year and will be finishing around March at the earliest or maybe April at the latest. He explained wanting to avoid that if a bid is accepted, the equipment has to be accepted or otherwise having to pay storage or otherwise have a storage problem in hand.

Mr. Castaneda then said the next solution would be to get the assurance that said monies can be passed onto the next budget.

Recommendation was made that once bids are received, an explanation of existing circumstances be made to the vendor with the low bid.

A motion was made by Commissioner Salinas, seconded by Commissioner Cavazos, to authorize the advertisement for bids for the purchase of office furniture and equipment for the Adult Probation Department. Bid opening December 19, 1990, bid award January 8, 1991.

ITEM 7. Budget Amendment:

Judge Ruiz explained that these items are budgeted annually in the General Fund but this is the first time this item has needed a request for a budget amendment. We have local registrars at each, individual city or the large majority of this issuance to file birth and death certificates on behalf of the County of Hidalgo. He continued to explain that what we pay them is fifty cents per birth and death certificate that they file for us and consequently need \$1,500.00 for aid to other Governments and \$1,500.00 to finish up the calendar year. (aid to other Governments is what we pay the cities such as McAllen, Edinburg, Pharr, Weslaco, Mission, Mercedes, Donna, San Juan, Elsa, Alamo, Edcouch, Hidalgo, La Joya and the the 8 J.P.'s, San Juan & Alton.)

A motion was made by Commissioner Salinas, seconded by Commissioner Cavazos, to approve a budget amendment of \$1,500.00 for Vital Statistics which goes to aid to other Governments.

ITEM 10. Approval of Budgets on Certificates of Obligation Funds

Judge Ruiz reminded the Court that there were two different issues: one for \$3,250,000.00 for 1990 Certificates of Obligation and the other for

\$1,250,000.00 which is the 1990 Series A. He explained that what we have spent now, in terms of the 1990 - \$3,250,000.00 - the cost for the sale of the bonds themselves, financial advise, Attorneys - first of all \$56,861.98, to Rocher/Pierce \$6,997.37 for Legal fees, the actual purchase of the Building at \$2,350,000.00 and the local Attorney's Fees/Commissions etc. is \$151,105.91. The total cost to-date is \$2,564,965.26 and we had a tax rebate of \$37,134.95. We are recommending a budget in the remaining balance Renovation/Administration Building \$650,000.00, Architectual Fees \$52,000.00 and other at \$20,169.69.

A motion was made by Commissioner Arcaute, seconded by Commissioner Cavazos, to approve the budget of the 1990 Series of \$3,250,000.00.

A questions and comments session followed with Commissioner Salinas informing the Court that Amigos Del Valle will be having a meeting on the 29th of this month. Due to shortage of monies that have been cut down to the elderly, he is requesting to the Commissioners and to the small cities that belong to Urban County to comply or donate out of Urban County allocations for Year 4. This will be to support the Amigos del Valle Program in our own Community.

Judge Ruiz explained that in the last 4 years, Amigo del Valle's budget has not had a single dollar increase, but has had a minor decrease. The level of service and the cost of living has used up the budget to the point that they have reduced their participants and are serving less meals now as compared to 4 years ago. A percentage of the Tourist Industry do visit our Amigo del Valle Centers and are being rejected because of the lack of money. He continued to explain that the intent of the meeting to be held will be to review the 1989 and 1990 budget and the Mayors are going to ask the respective questions that need to be asked insuring that there is no waste. By insuring no waste, supervision needs to be taken to see that no meals are leftover and that we continue the efficiency of the Amigos del Valle Program as we know it.

Judge Ruiz informed the Court that Regular & Special Meetings will be held all the way thru December 4th, 10th & 18th but we will not have a meeting on December 25th which is Christmas Day and a Holiday.
