ITEM 8. DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION TO ENTER INTO AN INTER-LOCAL AGREEMENT WITH TEXAS ASSOCIATION OF COUNTIES FOR STORM WATER PERMIT GROUP APPLICATION REQUIREMENT ISSUED BY ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY

Loura Etnire explained to the Court that these were regulations that had been implemented by the EPA, mandating Counties to issue or to join and get permits or get permits issued. She went on to say that the Texas Association of Counties has developed a program to assist counties in meeting the Storm Water Permit requirements issued by the EPA. In her explanation she stated that the only thing that this did not cover was landfills, airports and any new construction. She further explained that this application came in two parts, a group application would cost per site \$500.00 if the county joined with TAC; this would cover all legal and engineering costs. If on the other hand the counties went on their own to get the permit from EPA, it will entail legal and engineering costs, and the estimated testing cost alone ranged from \$8,000.00 to \$20,000.00 per site. She stated that the deadline to join with the Association is today.

A brief discussion followed, after which a motion was made by Commissioner Camarillo, seconded by Commissioner Salinas, to approve an interlocal agreement with the Texas Association of Counties for Storm Water Permit Group Application Requirements issued by the Environmental Protection Agency and authorize the submittal of the required \$500.00 for legal and engineering costs.

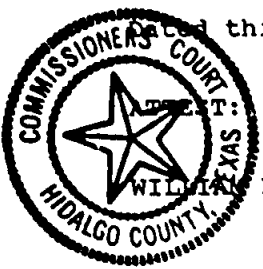
