## ITEM 1. ADULT PROBATION DEPARTMENT:

## A. ELECTRONIC IMAGING SERVICES AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE RANETTE COMPANY &amp; HIDALGO COUNTY

1A

Joe Lopez opened by stating that this agreement was agreed to by himself, Mr. Lamb, owner of Ranette, and attorneys involved. He stated that this was a three year contract for electronic imaging, which is electronically copying files on to the computer system to promote easier access to the files. It also includes pictures for identification purposes. Commissioner Rosel asked if he felt comfortable with the long term contract quoting Judge Ruiz "what if tomorrow new software comes out and you have a long term contract with this company." Mr. Lopez stated that it was in the contract to update as they went along, if anything happened to the system Ranette would fix it. All upgrades will be done at no additional cost. Judge Ruiz asked, if they were to go bankrupt tomorrow, would all the records still remain part of the County and Mr. Lopez responded with a yes. Judge Ruiz also asked if there was a cancellation clause and the answer was also yes. After further discussion, Judge Ruiz recommended approval. Commissioner Rosel so moved and was seconded by Commissioner Garces to authorize and approve the contract with the Ranette Company and the County of Hidalgo for the Electronic Imaging Services for the Adult Probation as presented.

## ITEM 2. ADULT DETENTION FACILITY:

B. DISCUSSION AND ACTION ON METHOD OF CONSTRUCTION

Judge Ruiz opened by stating that there were four statements of qualifications. He stated that he recommended Masterson, Moreland, Sauer and Whisman Inc. as financial advisors for the County of Hidalgo for this pending issue for the Adult Detention Facility and other improvements to the County of Hidalgo. Commissioner Arcaute so moved and was seconded by Commissioner Sanchez.

2B

Judge Ruiz recommended to the Commissioners that the method of construction should be a design-build with option to operate. He added that the advantages of this concept would be less cost up front, as far as the soft costs. There is also less administration from the County Government, as it is turn-key and there are no draw downs. Judge Ruiz stated that in his opinion, there is better control over the design and operational function and that it would provide for a faster method of construction; plus in and around the State, there has been proof that the cost of construction has come down considerably because of the involvement of the private sector. At this time, Commissioner Arcaute asked him what he meant by "option to operate" and the response was to allow

this Commissioner's Court, on the bidding procedure, the option to actually award or not award the operational end of the project, as this would be more of a cost consideration. By this, it was more of whether or not the Sheriff's Department can do a more effective job with less funds upon the design that is established. The County Judge then gave an example of this, after which Commissioner Garces asked if after the design is approved, Can the Jail Commission come in and consider it and the response was that they could. Commissioner Arcaute voiced a concern by stating that back when Commissioner's Court had created the Non-Profit Corporation, he felt that this Court had delivered the message that they would not go with the design-build concept because this was the concept of the corporation. Judge Ruiz interjected by saying that this was one of the designs of the corporation, but he felt that the corporation had more latitude, as the procurement procedure of the corporation was more lax.

The question of the option to operate and building this facility using a more conventional method was the issue in a discussion initiated by Commissioner Rosel, in which it was argued by the County Judge that they could not only save money in the construction, but also probably save money on the operational end, if they went on the design-build with the option to operate. Commissioner Sanchez then mentioned that the design-build method would allow for more participation from the Court and it might be more appealing if it was done as one package with the option. He did, however, state that they should be looking more at a method that would be more advantageous to the County vs. the Sheriff's Department. Commissioner Garces also voiced his concern with the lack of effort on the Sheriff's Department part, as the department was not very active with either the non-profit corporation or the present proceedings. He felt that the Sheriff should take a more active role. Commissioner Arcaute continued this discussion by saying that he felt this was why they were having problems in understanding what design-build meant.

Commissioner Rosel went back to the option to operate portion of the recommendation, as far as cost to the County and this resulted in a discussion with regards to how the proposals would be considered. Steve Crain, County Legal Counsel, informed the court that there would be a problem with using the term design-build, and that it would have to be specified more clearly, as it might violate the bidding law. The discussion continued on the design-build concept with this being the recommendation of the County Judge. Commissioner Sanchez also added that he felt that everyone agreed on the fact that there was a considerable amount of savings that he felt that this opportunity should not be passed up. Judge Ruiz stated "the mere fact that there was a study from the Jail Committee that dictates that 1000 beds are going to cost \$28 million is ultimately scary", especially when it was an architectural firm who dictated this price. After continued discussion, a motion was made by Commissioner Garces and seconded by Commissioner Sanchez to accept the method of the design-build with the option to operate for the new jail facility.

Mr. Saenz opened by stating that they were seeking approval to receive funding from the Maternal and Child Health Bureau. This target population included women, children and adolescents in rural areas. The total amount being sought by the Health Department is in the amount of \$149,670 to support the mobil clinic. There is a possibility of funding being extended for another 5 years. The clinic serves up to 50 clients per day and 12,000 per year. This application is strictly a grant and no matching is required. Commissioner Rosel made a motion and was seconded by Commissioner Garces to authorize the submittal of this grant application of \$149,670.

Omar Garza opened by stating that several years ago, the position of secretary for the Sanitation Department had been deleted. Since then there has been an increase in demand for the Sanitation Department. He also stated that employees from the Health Department were trying to fill the void in the Sanitation Department but the demand

has gotten to be to great. He wants to bring the position that had been deleted years ago and needs a budget amendment to do so. During this conversation, it was mentioned that Commissioner Rosel had requested to swap employees with the Health Department and Commissioner Sanchez voiced his opinion of the situation, as to why Commissioner Rosel got his choice of personnel and Commissioner Sanchez did not when he requested the same thing in the past. After some discussion and comments, A motion was made by Commissioner Arcaute and seconded by Commissioner Sanchez to approve the request for a permanent secretary for the Sanitation Department and approve the budget amendment of \$9,765 and salary at \$13,200 annually.

Dr. Garza stated that amendment was necessary because the nurse that use to handle TB shots is now Director of Nurses and that left the position open for TB elimination. She says that she needs a full time R.N. to handle the TB in the largest clinic. He also stated that this would be at a salary set by the Texas Department of Health at \$34,512. This position is paid for by the TB grant. To supplement this grant for the rest of the year it would take \$11,504. After brief comments, a motion was made by Commissioner Rosel and was seconded by Commissioner Garces to authorize the adjustment into the Tuberculosis Division Grant as presribed by the forms at \$11,504 in order to set a salary for Tuberculosis R.N. at \$34,512.

Judge Ruiz opened by stating that this would be a resolution that would amend the personnel policy in terms of previous action taken by Commissioner's Court and it would prohibit the use of tobacco in the courthouse with the exception of specific areas to be named by the County of Hidalgo. At this time Commissioner Garces so moved and was seconded by Commissioner Sanchez.

Judge Ruiz stated that this was an extension of what was done last year. He said it authorizes them to collect a fee that transfered to the State and in turn is turned over back to the County at \$25,000 per year per County Court at Law Judge and if there is an excess of the \$100,000 per year then the excess is divided between the State and the County. He stated that it did not happen last year but could in the future. Judge Ruiz recommended the adoption of the renewal of the resolution.

Judge Ruiz asked if there were any terms with this. Vona Walker made a comment but was inaudible. Judge Ruiz then asked if there was a balloon after the 4 years. Judge Ruiz wanted to reemphasize that equipment not be financed over the term of office of each official which is 4 years. In this senario there is sufficient time for the useful life of equipment. There will be three payments of \$25,000 annually and a balloon at the end of the fourth year. Judge Ruiz stated that the total amount with interest and everything is \$147,530, and the interest would be established by the contract. It is for the purchase and financing of 2 used motorgraders, 1 used water truck, and 1 cab & chasis truck. The terms for the financing would be \$25,000 annually, first payment to be February 1 and \$25,000 each year with a balloon at the end of the fourth year and authorize the County Judge to execute this particular loan in terms of the loan proceeds. Commissioner Sanchez so moved and was seconded by Commissioner Arcaute.
