ITEM 1. APPROVAL OF PROPOSED BUDGET AMENDMENT AND APPROPRIATION

Judge Garcia addressed the Court and stated that this was in Connection with the Warrant Officers to attempt to lower the number of no shows currently in County Court at Law courts. Mr. Dickinson stated that this was just start up costs. There was no money appropriated for the Officers to do what had to be done effectively. The budget that is before the Court would get the Officers through the end of this year. The amount of this amendment is \$31,771, which includes, according to Mr. Dickinson, 18 to 20 thousand was for start up such as vehicle, emergency equipment. Their annual budget would be approximately \$20,000 not including salaries which would be equal to that of the deputies. Their total budget, to include salaries, would be approximately \$80,000. Mr. Dickinson also stated that these would fall under the County Courts at Law but would be overseen by one of the County Court at Law Judges. Judge Garcia made some comments in regards to how bad the no show rate has gone up in his 15 year tenure as County Court at Law No. 3 Judge. He feels these officers will help those numbers decrease immediately and drastically because people will start to find out that if they don't show, then they will be sought after and brought in. He also stated that they would fall under all the County Courts but they will be doing their reporting the County Court No. 3 and that's how their accountability will be kept. Commissioner Sanchez expressed his feeling towards starting up these Warrant Officers and that the cost for doing so will be well worth the effort. At this time Commissioner Sanchez made a motion and was seconded by Commissioner Rosel to approve the request from Judge Richard Garcia, to allow the \$31,771 necessary in the budget for the program for the Warrant Officers.

Ciro Trevino opened by stating that this was the annual report of Taxes collected throughout the year up to June 30. He proceeded to go over the collections and the delinquencies for the County and all the other entities that the tax office collects for. He felt that a better job was done this year in collecting than the previous year. At this time a motion was made by Commissioner Garces and was seconded by Commissioner Rosel to approve the Tax Assessor's annual report for 1994.

Mr. Crain opened by stating that in prior discussions, there had been some questions about the signatory powers of the County Judge. On page 5, paragraph 5.06. This paragraph refers to section 113.901C of the Texas Local Government Code. He stated that this had been discussed by the Commission previously. If the County Judge waives his signatory ability on requisitions, then they come before the Commission for approval. Since there is no Judge at this time, unless one is appointed, requisitions would have to come before the Court. If and when a judge is appointed, then he or she can make a decision to waive their ability to sign. The other changes in this draft are changes that were approved several meeting ago where amounts were raised. Commissioner Rosel then voiced his concerns in which he stated that he would like to table this item and hold a workshop to address all the questions that anyone may have because he for one has a lot of questions. After some comments concerning scheduling a workshop for this item and also that the rest of the changes with the exception of the above mentioned, had already been adopted, Ms. Maldonado and Mr. Dickinson both addressed the Court and stated that there was a dire need for a Generator but there was nothing that could be done until another agenda was posted for Friday. At this time Commissioner Sanchez made a motion and was seconded by Commissioner Garces to approve the Purchasing Policies and Procedures as amended and presented by Legal Counsel.

- COMM. ROSEL I think it was brought to my attention that we needed the cities participation on this particular funding and we do have it. I met with the Mayors two weeks ago after this Commissioner's Court instructed me to do so. I met with them and they said that they would pay their equal share as they have previously done.
- COMM. ARCAUTE Do we have a figure on that?
- COMM. SANCHEZ Do we have anything in writing?
- COMM. ARCAUTE Let this record show a verbatim on the minutes.
- COMM. SANCHEZ Do we have any Interlocal Agreement with them now that they will do it such and such a way?
