The Estate of the new owner was trying to sell the property and they found that there was a break in the chain of ownership and it needs to be corrected. Commissioner Garces indicated that the purpose of this item was to put into perspective, the road to establishing a new jail. He stated that this has been discussed in the past and currently, there are 546 inmates at the County Jail and 192 that are being housed out of the County. He added that he was attempting to resolve this issue as quickly as possible. If they look at design build, this could possibly be on the fast track and they can save some time, consequently some money. He would like to put out an RFQ on design build just to see what they attract but yet not committing to anything. This way, they have two methods of comparing as to where they are and where they need to be. This will not set aside the current RFQs that are currently being brought in. Commissioner Rosel did not see any problem with this issue because by them doing this, it will not commit the County to anything. Commissioner Garces felt that they needed to look at every possible option that there is available to them. He then made a motion to put out RFQs for design build fast track with a possible budget of about \$15 million to \$20 million. There were some comments on a contract that was brought up by Mrs. Salazar where it was established that J. Bonner and Associates had been paid for their work concerning this contract in question. This firm had developed some specifications for an RFP and Commissioner Arcaute was asking if these were the specifications that they were going to use. The Commission did not know because they did not know what those specifications called for. The Commission had never brought those specifications back to Commissioners' Court for approval. During further comments, the Commission clarified that they will be giving asking for a facility of approximately 1200 beds at a budget of about \$20 million. Commissioner Garces again reiterated his motion and this was seconded by Commissioner Rosel. Steve Crain, County legal counsel, addressed the Court and restated the issue of an Attorney General's opinion on some restrictions on the use of design build and if they got beyond those restrictions, the Sheriff would have to consent to this project and enter into contract. Commissioners Rosel and Garces again reiterated that this will not in any way obligate the County to proceed on this. After further discussion, the Commission voted on the motion for this County to establish a dual process to determine the most cost effective, quickest and

efficient method of designing and constructing the new jail and allowing the RFQ of design build teams to be published. The dual being the conventional method/architectural and design build. It was stated that this should cover both items and not have an effect on any other motion. The motion was put to a vote and all voted in favor.
