Urban Counties Programs & Services:

Intergovernmental Relations (IGR) Program

This program represents the interests of urban counties in the Texas policymaking process. Among many other priorities, some IGR projects are:

- Maintain continuous dialogue with state officials regarding proposals to limit county revenue options and modify property taxes;
- Promote action to prevent prison overcrowding and jail backlogs;
- Opposition to unfunded mandates and restrictions on county authority;
- Promotion of fair funding for urban counties — based on population or number of clients, rather than equal funding per county; and
- The Policy Analysis Project providing members with comprehensive analysis of proposed legislation, AG opinions, and proposed rules impacting counties.

Education Program

This program provides urban county officials with continuing education events on issues of importance to their counties. Education programs include:

- Urban Counties luncheons;
- Biennial Education Conference; and
- Critical Issues Workshops and Executive Roundtables.

Member Services Program

This program develops projects that provide services directly to members, including:

- The Urban Counties Clippings Service, providing daily e-mails containing articles of interest to county officials from state and national newspapers;
- Urban Counties Newsletters, which provide analysis and updates of important issues and state policy developments;
- Public Power Pool, the largest electric power aggregator in Texas (P3 operating expenses are funded by the participating entities); and
- TechShare Program, which develops projects that will save counties money through shared information, resources, and efforts in technology procurement.

Legislative: Jim Allison, General Counsel, monitors the legislative session and all called special sessions. The State Officers assist in the support of our legislative program.

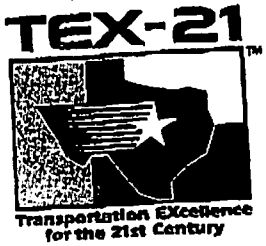
