

**Hidalgo County
Excessive Force Resolution**

A resolution establishing rules and regulations regarding the use of excessive force during non violent civil rights demonstrations, including physically barring entrance to a facility or location which is the subject of such demonstrations, and providing penalties for violations thereof; In the **County of Hidalgo, State of Texas**, as follows:

ARTICLE I

Section I: It is the policy of the **County of Hidalgo** to prohibit the use of excessive force by the law enforcement agencies within its jurisdiction against any individual engaged in a non violent civil rights demonstrations. The **County of Hidalgo** also prohibits physical barring of any entrance to, or exit from, such a facility within its jurisdiction.

ARTICLE II

Section II: It is the policy of **Hidalgo County** to enforce this policy to the full extent allowed by law.

ARTICLE III

ARTICLE I



ARTICLE II


Section 1: It is the policy of the Hidalgo County to enforce this policy to the full extent allowed by law.
