RE: 2010 Overtime Reimbursement

Dear Sirs:

Attached is the monthly (\$1,408.60) and annual maximum (\$16,903.25) overtime reimbursement limits for participating officers in the Rio Grande Valley Safe Streets Task Force. These limits apply to each law enforcement officer assigned full-time to the task force. Currently, the Hidalgo County Sheriff's Office has two deputies assigned to the task force, Joshua Kaltenbach and David Garcia. They are each eligible for overtime reimbursement up to the fiscal year 2010 limits. These limits will apply until September 30, 2010. A new "Notice of Limits" will be issued for the fiscal year 2011, prior to October 1, 2010. The proposed overtime reimbursement limits for fiscal year 2011 are \$1,433.52 per month or \$17,202.25 annually.

NOTICE OF LIMITS.

FOR

FY 2010 STATE AND LOCAL OVERTIME REIMBURSEMENTS

Subject to the availability of funding and legislative authorization, the FBI may reimburse state and local law enforcement agencies (LEA) for the cost of overtime incurred by officers assigned full-time to FBI managed task forces provided the overtime expenses were incurred as a result of task force related activities. Consistent with regulation and policy, a separate Cost Reimbursement Agreement (CRA) must be executed between the FBI and the LEA and an underlying Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) must exist in support of the task force relationship.

For Fiscal Year 2010, the maximum limits for reimbursements under these CRAs are \$1,408.60 per month and \$16,903.25 per year for each officer assigned full-time to the task force. These limits are effective for overtime worked on or after October 1, 2009.

FBI field offices and state and local law enforcement agencies may process overtime reimbursement requests under formally executed CRAs in accordance with the authority of this notice. This notice is issued unilaterally by the FBI's Head of Contracting Activity and does not require formal acceptance and signature by FBI field offices and state and local law enforcement agencies.
