RE: **Cardinal Waves Subdivision – Pct. 3**
Final Approval

Cardinal Waves is a thirty four (34) lot subdivision located on the Southeast corner of Brushline Road and Mile 6 ½ North Road.

The proposed Subdivision lies within the City of Mission E.T.J. and was approved by the Planning and Zoning and City Commission of said City.

The Drainage Report was submitted to, reviewed, and approved by the H.C.D.D. No. 1 Manager on April 05, 2011. The proposed subdivision lies within Zone "X" as per FEMA's FIRM.

The proposed subdivision plat was submitted to, reviewed, and approved by Jaime Salinas, ROW Agent on April 7, 2011. The proposed subdivision plat will dedicate fifteen (15) feet on Brushline Road and of additional Road Right of Way in accordance with the Hidalgo County Thoroughfare Plan.

Sanitary Services will be provided by OSSF. Soil Analysis Test were conducted by Jose Angel Gonzalez and approved by the Hidalgo County Environmental Health Department. All septic tank systems have been installed, inspected by the HCHD and can be expected to function satisfactorily.

Water Services will be provided by AGUA SUD. There is an existing eight (8) inch waterline on Brushline Road that will serve as the primary source of water for the proposed development.

The proposed plat is more than 5 acres and therefore requires a SWMP3 which was submitted, reviewed, and approved by Dr. Lorie Ochoa. In addition, a copy of the project's Notice of Intent (NOI) was submitted and approved by TCEQ and a copy was forwarded to the Hidalgo County Office of Environmental Compliance.

The subdivision received Preliminary Approval from the Hidalgo County Commissioners Court on June 28, 2011. The Subdivision Plat has been reviewed and complies with the Hidalgo County Subdivision Rules, Texas Water Development Board Model Subdivision Rules and the Texas Local Government Code.

The Hidalgo County Advisory Board convened and recommended **Final Approval** on **December 14, 2011**.
