Substantial Amendment to the One Year Action Plan for Year 2011
Publication Date: April 28, 2012

Notice is hereby given that the County of Hidalgo has completed its proposed One year Action Plan for 2011 (Program Year 24) and are hereby now submitting a Substantial Amendment for the Additional Funds received for the amount of \$208,293 under the Emergency Solutions Grant Program (ESG). The total revised allocation for year 2011 is now \$578,591.00. The County, through the Urban County Program and in cooperation with the agencies listed below, will submit its Substantial Amendment on the Emergency Solutions Grant Program (ESG) to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), San Antonio Office, One Alamo Center, 106 South St. Mary's St., Suite 405, San Antonio, TX 78205, on or about Tuesday, June 5, 2012. H.U.D. will review the proposed Substantial Amendment and is expected to approve the Substantial Amendment by July 1, 2012.

The County is hereby soliciting comments during a thirty (30) day comment period from April 30, 2012 thru May 29, 2012. Interested parties are encouraged to make their views known on the Substantial Amendment to the One Year Action Plan for 2011 (Program Year 24), by calling or visiting the Urban County Program office, 1916 Tesoro Blvd., Pharr, TX 78577, (956) 787-8127. A more detailed listing of activities and explanation of the Substantial Amendment will be made available to any interested party.

County of Hidalgo
 Urban County Program – One Year Action Plan (Substantial Amendment)

The County of Hidalgo One year Action Plan, administered through the Urban County Program, encompasses direct funding from the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), HOME, and Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) Program. Indirect funding resources (also referred to as leveraged funds) from private resources will be used to match the ESG program.

Program Goals

The four program goals of the County of Hidalgo, Urban County Program Consolidated Plan Strategy (CPS) are:

1. **To provide Decent Housing:** To provide housing opportunities for low and moderate income persons, to retain and upgrade affordable housing stock, to provide homeless support services, and to ensure that housing opportunities and services are provided without discrimination.
2. **To Provide a Suitable Living Environment:** To promote a decent, safe, and viable urban environment through the provision of quality of life services, elimination through the provision of quality of life services, elimination of barriers to the isolation of services and participation in decision-making, to provide adequate infrastructure for community and economic development, and conservation of historically or culturally significant properties and natural resources.
3. **To Expand Economic Opportunities:** To expand opportunities for persons of low-and-moderate to obtain job skills training, to promote job creation, and to provide an environment conducive to job training and new industry.
4. **To Form and Strengthen Partnerships:** To form new partnerships and to strengthen existing partnerships between the county, federal and state agencies, local government, and non-profit organizations.

Specific Goals:

- One: To provide the necessary public or private infrastructure to support housing: in particular, housing for low and moderate income residents.
- Two: To encourage the provision of safe and sanitary affordable housing through the promotion of new housing, rental property and/or the rehabilitation of existing housing stock.
- Three: To expand economic opportunities for persons of low-and-moderate income through the creation and/or retention of jobs, in cooperation to the greatest extent possible with state and federal empowerment and enterprise zones.
- Four: To provide for planning activities that will promote a more viable, safe and affordable environment in areas where low-and-moderate income persons reside and work.
- Five: To provide public facilities and assistance for the improvement of 'quality of life' conditions for persons who are presumed to be of low-and-moderate income
- Six: To provide public services in the areas of youth and elderly services, health services, drug abuse counseling, homeless services and enforcement of fair housing law.
