

CHASSIS:

The chassis/cab shall be furnished by the customer and delivered to manufactures facility.

The chassis/cab shall be a Ford 550 Super Duty, 4x4, Diesel engine, 84” cab to axle, auto transmission, and dual rear All-Terrain tires. The cab color shall be (F-1 RED)

The fabricated working platform (Flat bed), tank, pump and all equipment shall be mounted on the customer furnished chassis/cab at the manufacture’s facility.

APPARATUS BODY:

The body shall be a flat bed with a 12 GA aluminum diamond tread plate, (1/8” thickness), floor. The flat bed shall be approximately 132” (11 ft.) long by 96” wide, on 84” cab to axle chassis. All body parts are press formed for durability and appearance.

SUB-FRAME: The sub-frame of the body shall be made of 4” structural aluminum channel supporting the body and tank. Sub-frame cross members shall be made of 3” structural aluminum channel, weld in place approximately 16” apart. Cross members shall be fully welded at each metal-to-metal junction with main runners to provide a rugged frame for off road performance. The outside edges of the flat bed shall have reverse “C” channel to help protect the required lights, reflectors and reflective tape. Side skirts will be in place on each side of bed. The work platform shall be attached to the chassis frame rails at four points by Grade #5 x 0.75 Steel bolts.

The work platform shall be fabricated to support a 300-500 gallon tank, pumping unit with controls, required personnel, tools and equipment normally carried on a “Grass/Brush” apparatus.

TAILBOARD:

There shall be a 10” tailboard at the rear of the bed, It will be full width of the apparatus.

The tailboard shall be supported by 3” channels attached to the truck frame and covered with aluminum diamond tread plate. Starting beneath the flat bed, the tail board shall be extended down, then bent out 10” at 90 degrees, down 3” at 90 degrees and turned under 1” at 90 degrees to form 3” channel bumper. Bumper corners shall be square to allow hand rails to connect and allow easy access to tail board. A receiver hitch with “D” ring plug will be installed at rear of tail drop to allow for winch or tow point.

A coat of black bed liner will be sprayed on top surface of tailboard for a non-slip surface.

The rear tailboard will be covered with chevron striping.

HEADACHE RACK:

In the front portion of the flat bed, attached to the flat bed, directly behind and extending over the cab, there shall be a headache rack made of 2” square tubing with a slatted aluminum tubing insert to protect the chassis rear window. A header plate shall be attached to the headache rack and extend over the cab of the truck. The header plate will accommodate a light bar and two spot/flood lights.

CUBICLES:

There shall be a step up cubicle on each side in the front portion of the flat bed, to allow a firefighter to stand and safely fight fires. The slide-in unit will be mounted with a walk way between cubicles to allow fire fighters access from one cubicle to the other.

The dimensions of the cubicle floor shall be approximately 24" wide x 24" deep and shall be below the floor level of the flat bed, chassis running board height.

The step up cubicle floor shall be fabricated with aluminum tread plate material to reduce wet surface slippage and designed to drain water from around the firefighters feet.

A safety gate be installed to open inward only into the cubical space.

A coat of black bed liner will be sprayed on the floor of each cubical for a non-slip surface.

SAFETY GATES:

Safety gates made of 1" aluminum square tubing, approximately 40" tall, with horizontal bracing will be installed 10" above the cubicle floor on each side to secure the firefighters in each cubicle. Gates shall open inward and be secured by self-closing gas struts pressing against a welded restraint plate. The gate cannot accidentally open.

HANDRAILS:

There shall be handrails made of 1.5" O. D. aluminum square tubing along each side of the flatbed, approximately 40" from the bed floor and over the top of the compartments, for brush protection. Handrails will extend to tail board for support and create grab handles connecting to tailboard. A mid rail will be in place where possible.

PUMP:

A Hale HP200X Combination pump will be installed at the rear of the skid.

The pump shall deliver a range of 240 GPM at 20 PSI to 75 GPM at 150 PSI, with a prime operating range of 150 GPM at 100 PSI, 3" suction and 2-1/2" discharge.

A 4" X 4" manifold with multiple outlets will be connected to discharge outlet with 2 1/2" galvanized fittings. The pump is equipped with an exhaust primer.

ENGINE:

The pump shall be powered by a 18HP Briggs and Stratton Vanguard 350400 Series, horizontal shaft, air-cooled, V-1 win, OHV, electric start engine. The engine will have a 6 AMP alternator, 1.4-liter oil capacity, and meets 1994 CARB standards. The engine shall be electrically connected to the chassis electrical system through the vehicle MASTER SWITCH. Engine will be attached to remote 6 gallon remote fuel tank

CONTROL PANEL:

There shall be a lighted control panel at the rear of the body, next to the pump/engine for easy access by the operator. The control panel shall have a start switch, throttle, choke control, and low oil pressure warning light.

There shall be one 2-1/2" white face with black letter gauge to show discharge pressure.

WATER TANK:

The rectangular design tank shall be made of high quality non-corrosive Polypropylene Series III Co-Polymer, Tank shall have 500 gallon capacity and be divided into equal cells to reduce water splashing, load shifting and provide good off road handling and stability. An 8" x 8" fill tower with a hinged flip up cover and over flow. Fill tower will be installed on the front driver side corner, or as requested. The tank may have a water level sight gauge built in. Standard features include a 2 1/2" outlet, 1 1/2" return/re-circulate, 1 1/2" pass-through and 1" drain and a top storage area.

The tank will be mounted onto rubber cushions pads for shock protection. Tank to be black in color and have a limited lifetime warranty. (See Specification and Warranty Attached).

PUMP DISCHARGE AND SUCTION:

All piping shall be heavy duty galvanized with flexible couplings.

There shall be a heavy-duty steel discharge manifold connected to the pump housing.

There shall be one (1) 2-1/2" suction with screen and valve with cap and chain on the rear.

There shall be one (1) 1-1/2" discharge pipe to the front firefighter cubicles, It will then be reduced to two (2)-1" lines with valves and swivels for whip lines.
