Hi Josie

I have been asked to submit the attached Environmental Services Agreement from Veolia ES Technical Solutions, LLC for your review. The background information is that Precinct 4 has 15 drums (55 gallon each) of waste paint composed of co-mingled oil based and latex paint. These need to be disposed of appropriately since the material is too old and not usable. Apparently the source of the paint is the citizen's collection center that collects solid waste at no charge from precinct residents. Since landfills cannot accept liquid waste, the paint is not accepted by landfills. The precinct would take paint containers brought in by residents and pour the contents into drums. The remaining paint in the containers was then allowed to dry and harden which allows the containers to be disposed of at the landfill. This is a standard practice for collecting old paint for reuse instead of just disposing of it. Habitat for Humanity does this and offers the paint as a primer or low cost paint if color is not important. Unfortunately over the years the paint collected at Pct. 4 was never used and the drums were forgotten about.

I requested bids from three local companies (only two responded) and Veolia ES. Veolia ES offered the best price for disposal at approx. \$4600.00 which is significantly less than the two local companies. Please let me know if you any questions. Thanks.

1. County of Hildago must also comply with all applicable laws and regulations pertaining to generators of hazardous waste. VEOLIA Environmental Services will not accept improperly identified or unidentified materials.
2. The generator shall have obtained all applicable federal or state generator's identification numbers and state hazardous / non-hazardous waste numbers before waste shipment. VEOLIA Environmental Services will assist in this process if necessary.
3. The proposed pricing is based on the attached scope of work. Any deviation in type or quantity of material will be priced according to the issuance of a change order.
4. Disposal pricing given herein is contingent upon site approval of waste stream and waste stream received must conform to submitted profile/WIP. Surcharges will apply to nonconforming waste streams.
5. All drums considered not fit for transport according to DOT, 49 CFR requirements and/or leaking drums will be over-packed at a rate of \$200 per drum and surcharged at 1.5 times the regular disposal price.
6. Conversion rate for containers sizes not quoted are as follows: 5 gal {0.4 x 55 gal price}, 10 gal {0.55 x 55 gal price}, 15 gal {0.6 x 55 gal price}, 20 gal {0.65 x 55 gal prices}, 30-35 gal {0.8 x 55 gal price}, 85 gal {1.5 x 55 gal price}. Sizes not listed will be rounded up to nearest size converted above.
7. Veolia assesses a Fuel Surcharge. The surcharge is evaluated and increased or decreased as necessary, on the first working day of the month based on the Department of Energy Diesel Fuel Hotline (202-586-6966 or www.eia.doe.gov) monthly survey fuel price averages. The surcharge will apply to transportation charges only.
8. Applicable waste fees and taxes will apply.
9. A 0% Energy and Security Fee will apply to all charges excluding government mandated fees, transportation and fuel surcharge.
10. VEOLIA Environmental Services will prepare all shipping documents (i.e. manifests, labels, packing slips, etc.), if required.

Three bids were submitted to the county for the disposal of fifteen (15) 55-gallon drums of waste painted generated at the Precinct # 4 Citizen's Collection Center. The bidders were:

- Chemical Response and Remediation Contractors, Inc. (CRRC), P.O. Box 2686, Harlingen, TX 78551 submitted a bid of \$3,645.00. Their proposal was for the identification, segregation, and inventory of the drum's contents but not disposal.
- Chemsol Services, Inc., P.O. Box 533207, Harlingen, TX 78553 submitted a bid of \$16,822.50 for preparation of the drums (packaging, labeling, and paperwork) and disposal.
- Veolia ES Technical Solutions, L.L.C., 1800 S. Highway 146, Baytown, TX 77520 submitted a bid of \$4,556.25 for preparation of the drums (packaging, labeling, and paperwork) and disposal.

The bid submitted by CRRC is lower but it did not include the actual preparation and disposal of the drums. I recommend that the bid submitted by Veolia EC Technical Solutions, L.L.C. be accepted by the county for disposal of the drums.

Chemical Response & Remediation Contractors, Inc. (CRRC) is pleased to submit the following proposal to provide Waste Disposal Services at the above referenced facility. CRRC proposes to provide our services in accordance with the following scope of work, schedule of fees, terms and conditions and attachments under the TIPS/TAPS Trades Contract No: 1032813, see enclosed information.

SCOPE OF WORK

Hidalgo County (HC) has accumulated a wide range of waste materials including hydrocarbon liquids, road base asphalt, paints, acids, bases and unknowns at the above referenced facilities. The recommended approach for the waste disposal is conducted in three (3) phases: Phase 1 is the identification, inventory and segregation of the materials; Phase 2 is the development of waste disposal options and Phase 3 is the actual disposal of the materials. Phase 2 can be prepared only after Phase 1 has been completed.

PHASE I – IDENTIFICATION, SEGREGATION AND INVENTORY

This project approach consists of six (6) tasks: **first**, inspect the integrity of the containers; **second**, identify materials by package labeling and/or MSDS information; **third**, segregate materials into hazardous and non-hazardous waste classifications and unknowns; **fourth**, create an inventory of the materials; **fifth**, use field analytical techniques to better identify or classify the unknowns; and **sixth**, prepare a project report.

If during the onsite activities, other potential environmental hazards are discovered, then HC will be notified as to scope of work, schedule and any associated costs.

The following terms and conditions (2 pages) apply to this proposal.

CHEMICAL RESPONSE & REMEDIATION CONTRACTORS, INC.
CONTRACT TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. **Services to be Performed.** Chemical Response hereby agrees to act as environmental services Contractor and to furnish all labor, materials, equipment and subcontracted items reasonably necessary to complete the Work described in the attached proposal. Chemical Response and Client may make changes in the Work to be performed hereunder from time to time by written modifications signed by both parties.
2. **Invoicing and Payment.** Unless otherwise specified in the proposal, invoicing and payment shall be as follows:
 - a. **Progress payments.** Chemical Response may at its option submit periodic itemized invoices for charges accrued for work performed under the proposal, less prior payments received; provided, however, it shall not submit such invoices more frequently than daily. For Lump Sum Work, the amount due under each Progress or Final invoice shall be the percentage of such work completed times the lump sum price.
 - b. **Final Invoice.** After the work under an Order is completed and all charges for the associated subcontracts, vendor items, and reimbursable have been received by Chemical Response. Chemical Response shall issue a final invoice setting forth the total amount due for the work less prior payments received.
 - c. **Payment.** Payment is due under each progress or final invoice upon receipt. Interest shall accrue on payments not received within thirty (30) days at the lesser of (i) the maximum lawful interest rate or (ii) one and one-half percent (1½%) per month, or eighteen percent (18%) per annum. Chemical Response reserves the right to withhold delivery of reports and other project documentation pending receipt of payment.
3. **Responsibility for Payment.** Client agrees to make payment to Chemical Response for services rendered hereunder in the amounts and on the terms specified above and in the proposal, regardless of whether Client or another person or entity is legally responsible for remediation or abatement of the environmental conditions involved and regardless of whether Client is entitled to reimbursement for such costs from his or from some other person's or entity's insurance carrier.
4. **Termination for Non-Payment.** In the event Client fails to make any payment when due under this Contract, Chemical Response may stop work and, may, at its option, terminate this Contract for non-payment and seek recovery of its damages from Client.
5. **Information and Authorization.** Client represents and warrants that it has furnished Chemical Response with all pertinent data and information concerning the work to be performed hereunder, the nature of Client's premises or site and the nature of the conditions to be remediated, including any special hazards or risks involved with such work, premises, site or conditions. All such information furnished is contained or referenced in the proposal.
6. **Permits, Access to Real Estate.** Client shall be responsible to secure any and all easements, licenses, rights of way, or other interests in real property necessary for Chemical Response to perform the Work. Client shall procure any and all applicable federal, state or local approvals, consents, permits, licenses and orders needed to enable Chemical Response to perform the work contemplated hereby.
7. **Compliance With Environmental Laws.** Client hereby warrants that all material, substances, or waste to be stored, treated and/or disposed of under this Contract is the sole and exclusive property of Client or other third party. Client further warrants that it is not subject to any legal or equitable restraint or order which prohibits the treatment, storage and/or disposal of such waste by any transporter or disposal facility.
 - a. Client shall be solely responsible for the storage, handling, transportation, treatment, processing, and disposal of any wastes, pollutants, or contaminants that are the subject of this Contract and for full compliance with provisions of the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act, as amended ("RCRA") and all other applicable federal, state, or local laws, statutes, or regulations governing the treatment, transportation, storage, or disposal of waste or material.
 - b. The parties hereto agree that Chemical Response is not and shall not be considered (i) the owner of material, substances, or wastes noted in the Proposal; (ii) the operator of a waste management facility; (iii) the generator, storer, or disposer of hazardous or solid waste; (iv) to have arranged for the transportation or disposal of any wastes, pollutants, or contaminants by virtue of the performance of this Contract or anything contained herein, as those terms are used in RCRA, the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act, as amended, or any other federal or state statute or regulation governing the treatment, transportation,

storage, or disposal of materials or wastes.

c. In the event that Client requests Chemical Response 's assistance in meeting Client's obligations as set forth herein, Chemical Response as requested by Client may (i) collect samples and perform analytical testing to assist Client in the characterization of waste for the purpose of Client's manifests; (ii) identify a number of potential transporters and disposal facilities from which Client may select in accomplishing the transportation and disposal of collected waste; (iii) draft the technical provisions of contracts or purchase orders and prepare manifests implementing Client's selection of a transporter and/or disposal facility for review and execution solely by Client.
