## Law Enforcement Officer and Police Academy Cadet Generic Job Description

Under the direction of a supervisor, the officer performs law enforcement work, with an emphasis on protecting persons, public safety, preservation of property, and ensuring the rights of all persons are safe guarded. The officer may work under general supervision with moderate latitude for the use of initiative and independent judgment. As necessary, the officer may use force including deadly force based on the circumstances with which the officer is presented.

### ESSENTIAL JOB FUNCTIONS:

The list of essential job functions is not exhaustive and may be supplemented as necessary. A job function may be considered essential if the function is the basic reason the position exists. Generally, essential functions should take 5% or more of the employee's work time. List all essential functions below and provide an estimate of the percentage of time spent performing the function. Those essential functions include, but are not limited to:

- Enforces the Texas Penal Code and relevant federal statutes.
- Takes enforcement action when law violations are observed, reported or suspected.
- Secures, searches and processes crime scenes for evidence and contraband.
- Secures and properly disposes of unlawfully taken aquatic and wildlife resources and other evidence or contraband.
- Assists local, state and federal law enforcement agencies.
- Serves warrants.
- Provides assistance to, and responds to calls from the general public.
- Conducts disaster and emergency response activities, including search and rescue operations and search and recovery operations.
- Prepares and submits investigation reports, arrest and case reports, citations, dispositions, warrants and other records related to enforcement activities, programs and operations.
- Presents information regarding violations and suspect information to local, state and federal prosecutors.
- Testifies in court, administrative hearings and other proceedings.
- Provides information and education to the public regarding related laws, statues, regulations, proclamations and agency and division programs.
- Presents training material to other employees.
- Performs additional duties as assigned.
- Complies with all Agency, Division, and Branch rules, regulations, and procedures.
  
- **Knowledge of:** (an understanding of facts or principles relating to a particular subject area)
  - Knowledge of state and federal statutes and regulations related to wildlife and natural resource enforcement, the Texas Penal Code, the Texas Code of Criminal Procedure and department policies and procedures
- **Skill in:** (the application of knowledge resulting from a development of basic abilities through formal training and practical experience)
  - Skill in using effective and appropriate interpersonal skills to accomplish work goals and objectives

- Skill in using sound judgment in making decisions
- **Ability to:** (capacity in a general area that may be utilized to develop detailed, specific skills)
  - Ability to use and care for firearms and other department-issued equipment
  - Ability to use radios and other electronic devices to detect and respond to law violations
  - Ability to use land and water patrol vehicles, sometimes in extreme, hazardous or dangerous conditions
  - Ability to communicate verbally and in writing, including when testifying in court or other proceedings, when giving commands and instructions and while presenting educational or information programs
  - Ability to maintain integrity in on and off-duty activities and conduct
  - Ability to effectively and appropriately use all levels on the force continuum
  - Ability to work independently to accomplish work goals and objectives, with little or no close supervision

#### **PHYSICAL DEMANDS OF ESSENTIAL JOB FUNCTIONS:**

- Driving
- Carrying items or persons
- Sitting for extended periods in automobiles or at desks and/or computer terminals
- Operating a personal computer
- Walking/Standing
- Bending/Squatting
- Climbing
- Operating Heavy Machinery/Equipment
- Lifting
- Pushing/Pulling
- Grasping
- Seeing
- Hearing
- Kneeling
- Verbal/Written Communication
- Manual tasks: Using scissors, stapler, hole punch, turning door knobs, etc.,

#### **ACADEMY CADET DEMANDS:**

Cadets in the Regional Police Academy will have additional demands placed on them. Those demands are made to simulate real-life situations and possible encounters that law enforcement officers may face. While no training scenario equates to actual field-experience, the cadre takes time to ensure the safety of the cadets while exposing the cadets to rigorous demands of the profession.

#### The Academy Cadet Demands include, but are not limited to:

- Exposure to and/or certification in TASER – the TASER will emit an electronic current in the cadet's body causing temporary incapacitation
- Exposure to and/or certification in Oleoresin Capsicum (OC) Spray – OC is made from a chemical compound that irritates the eyes to cause tears, pain, and even temporary blindness
- Certification and exposure to pressure point control and joint lock/manipulation

- Wrestling, grappling, tugging, and other techniques to subdue and control others
- Operating motor vehicles
- Sitting for prolonged hours in classroom settings
- Reading
- Lectures
- Physical fitness, which may include dynamic and ballistic stretching, aerobic exercise (running, etc.), anaerobic exercise (push-ups, squat thrusts, etc.)
- Body fat measurements
- Body mass index
- Handcuffing techniques, including being handcuffed
- Firing live weapons (pistols and shotguns) and exposure to gunpowder and gun cleaning chemicals
- Indoor and outdoor environments (heat, cold, rain, mud, fog, air conditioning, HVAC, etc.)
