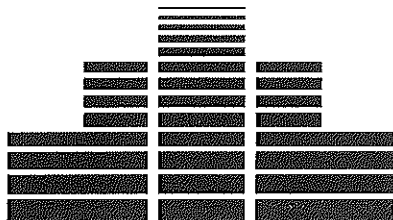

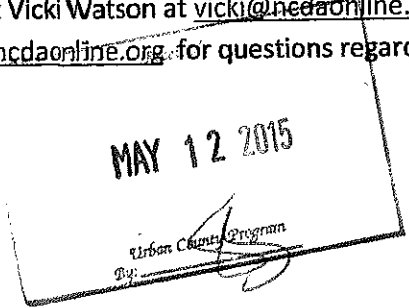
NCDA provides:
