**RE: 381.004 (f) of the Local Government Code**

Dear Judge:

It is that time of year when the Children's Advocacy Center (CAC) requests funding assistance from appropriate sources. We are reaching out to you for consideration. Section 381.004 (f) of the Local Government Code states: *"The commissioners' court of a county may support a Children's Advocacy Center that provides services to abused children."* Last year, commissioners' court supported the center in the amount of \$50,000. We are requesting the same level of funding for this FY 2015-16.

This funding if awarded along with other funding allows the CAC, a community-based nonprofit, to continue meeting the needs of child abuse victims by providing child forensic interviews conducted by trained interviewers, mental health/counseling services, victim support and advocacy, community outreach/training, and case review using a multidisciplinary team model. We work in collaboration with law enforcement, Child Protective Services, and the District Attorney's Office to coordinate a quick response and provide needed services to the victim and non-offending family members of Hidalgo County. We served **1088 new victims** in 2014 and are on our way to match or exceed that number in 2015.

Studies show that abused children who get early professional assistance are more likely to succeed in dealing and coping with the trauma of abuse and do better later in their adult lives. With early intervention, we can help break the cycle of abuse and, more importantly, significantly increase a child's chances of becoming a healthy adult, a good parent, and a citizen that is able to positively contribute back to the community.

**We are formally requesting funding support from Funding Source 381.004 of the Local Government Code or other appropriate funding sources in the amount of \$50,000, the same level as last year.**
