RE: K9s4COPS Grant Agreement Terms and Conditions

To whom it concerns:


It is with regret that K9s4COPS sends this letter requesting the return of a K9 Munya from the Hidalgo County Sheriff's Department ("SO"). In March 2016, K9s4COPS granted K9 Munya, a dual purpose K9 officer, to the SO subject to the SO's compliance with the K9s4COPS Grant Agreement Terms and Conditions ("Grant Agreement"). Under the Grant Agreement, K9s4COPS grants K9 officers subject to fulfillment of certain conditions. One of those conditions states that a K9 officer "shall be returned to K9s4COPS" if the grantee organization fails to comply with any of the conditions of the grant.

We understand K9 Munya was assigned to Officer Frank Guerrero, and the SO agreed that Officer Guerrero and K9 Munya would attend a three-week narcotics class, and a six-week patrol class. It has come to our attention that Officer Guerrero attended the narcotics class, but has not attended any of the patrol classes that have been offered, the last of which was scheduled to begin on June 12, 2017. The failure of Officer Guerrero and K9 Munya to complete this training required under the Grant Agreement necessitates that K9s4COPS demand the return of K9 Munya.

Kristi Schiller, K9s4COPS founder, contacted Sheriff Eddie Guerra on or about Friday, June 16, 2017 with concerns over the SO's noncompliance with the Grant Agreement. While it is a regrettable situation, under these circumstances, it was agreed that K9 Munya would be returned to K9s4COPS on or about Tuesday, June 20, 2017, in compliance with the Grant Agreement.

K9s4COPS appreciates the work and sacrifices made by the Hidalgo County Sheriff's Office in serving the community and making it a safer place for all, and we wish it continued safety and support in the future.
