Automobile Burglary and Theft Prevention Authority Grant Program

WHEREAS, under the provisions of the Texas Revised Civil Statutes Article 4413(37) and Texas Administrative Code Title 43; Part 3; Chapter 57, entities are eligible to receive grants from the Automobile Burglary and Theft Prevention Authority to provide financial support to law enforcement agencies for economic automobile theft enforcement teams and to combat motor vehicle burglary in the jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, this grant program will assist this jurisdiction to combat motor vehicle burglary and theft; and

WHEREAS, Hidalgo County Sheriff's Office has agreed that in the event of loss or misuse of the grant funds, Hidalgo County Sheriff's Office assures that the grant funds will be returned in full to the Automobile Burglary and Theft Prevention Authority.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED and ordered that Richard F Cortez, Hidalgo County Judge, is designated as the Authorized Official to apply for, accept, decline, modify, or cancel the grant application for the Automobile Burglary and Theft Prevention Authority Grant Program and all other necessary documents to accept said grant; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Eddie Guerra, Hidalgo County Sheriff, is designated as the Program Director and Maria Arcilia Duran, Hidalgo County Auditor, is designated as the Financial Officer for this grant.
