ORDER CONTINUING LOCAL STATE OF DISASTER

WHEREAS, on July 25, 2020, the County Judge issued a Declaration of a Local State of Disaster for Hidalgo County resulting from the treat of severe damage, injury, or loss of life or property resulting from the current and recent torrential rains, high winds, hail and possible tornados;

WHEREAS, the conditions necessitating the Declaration of a Local State of Disaster have continued to exist since the original declaration made on July 25, 2020 as a result of “flooding and wind damage due to the immediate emergencies from the current and recent torrential rains”;

WHEREAS, Section 4.18.108(b) of the Texas Government Code provides that a Local State of Disaster may not be continued for a period in excess of seven (7) days without the consent of the governing body of the political subdivision;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED BY THE COMMISSIONERS COURT OF THE COUNTY OF HIDALGO, TEXAS:

1. That the recitals set forth in this Order are True and correct.
2. That the Local State of Disaster declared for Hidalgo County, Texas by the County Judge on July 25, 2020, shall continue until terminated by Order of the Commissioners Court,
3. This Order is passed as an emergency measure and pursuant to Section 418.108 of the Texas Government Code and shall become effective on the 30th day of July, 2020.
4. All Hidalgo County Officials and employee authorized to do any and all things necessary or convenient to accomplish the purpose of this Order.
