"Do I have to finish a Self-Paced class in one sitting once I start?"

We sometimes get this question, and the answer is "Absolutely not." You can work whenever you have a few minutes to complete the reading, and then you can take the test as often as you need to reach the passing score. The testing system will immediately grade each test when you indicate that you are ready. If you need to suddenly quit in the middle of a test, the system provides you a "resumption code" you can use to continue where you stopped on that particular test (and if you lose the code, just contact me and I'll provide it). This type of online training is called "asynchronous," which simply means that you absolutely control your timing, and you do not have to be online at a particular date and time to take the class. It's all under your control. And if you have a question along the way, just send me an email. Couldn't be easier.

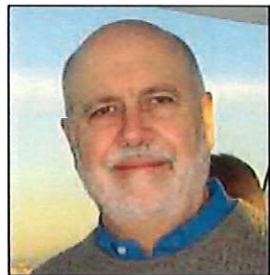

Just about all kinds of illegal dumping can be controlled by local governments, including sloppy oil and gas waste hauling as shown here in Jim Wells County. Local governments in the oil patch can exercise criminal enforcement powers to keep their communities clean (shown here: multiple criminal violations of Texas Water Code Chapter 29, handled at the county level).

Local Enforcement

Most illegal dumping, water pollution, illegal outdoor burning, and public health nuisances can be effectively controlled by cities and counties using these approaches.

1. Municipal Code Enforcement (Applies only inside most cities)

Fine to \$500 / \$4,000; Enforced By: Municipal code enforcement officers

2. Public Health Nuisance Violations (Applies everywhere in Texas)

THSC Chap. 341. Minimum Standards of Sanitation and Health Protection Measures

Fine of \$10 to \$200; Subsequent conviction within one year of first: \$10 to \$1,000 and/or 30 days jail; Enforced By: Peace officers; Local Health Department; County employee trained by health authority (see THSC Chapter 121); Especially see THSC Sec. 341.013(c) for a violation covering many situations; penalties at Sec. 341.091 (criminal) and Sec. 341.092 (civil)

3. Public Nuisance in Unincorporated Areas (Not including "agricultural" land)

THSC Chap. 343. Abatement of Public Nuisances; Fine of \$50 to \$200; Subsequent conviction at any future date: \$200 to \$1,000 and/or 6 months jail; Enforced By: Peace officers; Local Health Department; County employee trained by health authority (see THSC Chapter 121)

Felony outdoor burning is covered at TWC Secs. 7.182 and 7.183.

Misdemeanor violations are actually violations of TWC Sec. 7.177(a)(5). The Outdoor Burning Rule is a rule adopted under THSC Chapter 382 (Texas Clean Air Act) (see [Texas Register](#) on September 3, 1996).

[Note on Oil and Gas Related Laws:](#)

- (1) Texas Water Code Chapter 29 OIL AND GAS WASTE HAULERS sets a criminal penalty at Sec. 29.046, including a stay in the county jail, for several violations concerning waste hauling (see link above for specific sections); and,
 - (2) The Railroad Commission of Texas has developed "Statewide Rule 8" (Title 16 Texas Administrative Code Section 3.8) to provide detailed regulation of oil and gas waste hauling and disposal. These rules were developed under the authority to do so granted by the state legislature in Natural Resources Code Sec. 91.101 and other statutes (see [Texas Register](#), Aug 27, 2004, 29 TexReg 8271). Although the RRC provides administrative enforcement of this rule, violations of Statewide Rule 8 are also criminal violations of NRC. Sec. 91.002, which may be enforced by any peace officer.

Program Description
