SECTION 1. PARTIES TO THE CONTRACT

This 2021 Community Services Block Grant Program Disaster Relief Supplemental Funds Contract Number 61210003565 ("Contract") is made by and between the Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs, a public and official agency of the State of Texas, ("Department") and Hidalgo County, Texas-County of Hidalgo Community Service Agency, a political subdivision of the State of Texas ("Subrecipient") hereinafter the "Parties".

SECTION 2. CONTRACT TERM

This Contract shall commence on October 01, 2021, and, unless earlier terminated, shall end on September 30, 2022 ("Contract Term").

SECTION 3. SUBRECIPIENT PERFORMANCE AND SERVICE AREAS

- A. Subrecipient's service area consists of the following counties: **HIDALGO**
- B. Subrecipient throughout its Service Area shall implement a Community Service Block Grant Program ("CSBG") in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 106 of the Community Services Block Grant Act (42 U.S.C. §9901 *et seq.*), as amended by the "Community Services Block Grant Amendments of 1994" (Public Law 103-252) and the Coats Human Services Reauthorization Act of 1998 (Public Law 105-285) ("CSBG Act"); Additional Supplemental Appropriations for Disaster Relief Act, 2019, (Public Law 116-20); Chapters 2105 and 2306 of the Texas Government Code ("State Act"); the implementing state regulations under Title 10, Part 1, Chapters 1, Chapter 2, and Chapter 6, Subchapters A and B of the Texas Administrative Code, as amended or supplemented from time to time ("CSBG State Rules"); and the Department's guidance related to CSBG. Subrecipient further agrees to comply with the Certification Regarding Lobbying for Contracts, Grants, Loans, and Cooperative Agreements attached hereto as Addendum A, Certification Regarding Drug-Free Workplace Requirements attached hereto as Addendum B, Certification Regarding Environmental Tobacco Smoke attached hereto as Addendum C, Certification Regarding Debarment, Suspension and Other Responsibility Matter attached hereto as Addendum D, the Contract Benchmarks attached hereto as Exhibit A; the Performance Statement attached hereto as Exhibit B; the Budget attached hereto as Exhibit C; all such addendums and exhibits incorporated herein for all relevant purposes; the assurances, certifications, and all other statements made by Subrecipient in its application for funding under this Contract; and with all other terms, provisions, and requirements herein set forth.
- C. Subrecipient shall utilize funds for direct services and activities for low income households at 125% of the Federal Poverty Income Guidelines impacted by Federal Emergency Management Agency ("FEMA") DR 4466 or DR 4454. Subrecipient may also utilize funds for community-wide benefit activities, in accordance with its Department approved Disaster Need Assessment, if such activities benefit low income households at 125% of the Federal Poverty Income Guidelines. This benefit will be evaluated in one of the two following ways: 1) The benefits of the activity are available to all community members regardless of income level, and the CSBG portion of the total project costs are equal to or less than the proportional share of the CSBG households in the community; 2) The benefits of the activity are available to a subset of the community (restricted by geographic area and/or income), and the CSBG portion of the total project costs are equal to or less than the proportional share of the subset of the community.
