SB 224 Catalytic Converter Grant Program

Whereas, under the provisions of the Texas Transportation Code Chapter 1006 and Texas Administrative Code Title 43; Part 3; Chapter 57, entities are eligible to receive grants from the Motor Vehicle Crime Prevention Authority to provide financial support to law enforcement taskforces and agencies for economic motor vehicle theft, including catalytic converter theft and

Whereas, this grant program will assist this jurisdiction to combat catalytic converter theft; and

Whereas, Hidalgo County has agreed that in the event of loss or misuse of the grant funds, Hidalgo County agrees and assures that the grant funds will be returned in full to the Motor Vehicle Crime Prevention Authority.

Now therefore, be it resolved and ordered that Judge Richard F. Cortez, is designated as the Authorized Official to apply for, accept, decline, modify, or cancel the grant application for the Motor Vehicle Crime Prevention Authority Grant Program and all other necessary documents to accept said grant; and

Be it further resolved that Sheriff J.E. "Eddie" Guerra is designated as the Program Director and Leticia Chavez is designated as the Financial Officer for this grant.
