NACo Working on Your Behalf: Success Stories from 2024

The National Association of Counties (NACo) is your voice in Washington, D.C. Every day, we are working to support counties through improved federal policies, enhanced best practices and cost savings solutions that assist every county across the country. We are extraordinarily grateful for your membership and support – we are stronger as an association and as counties when we are united in pursuing our common goals.

Over the past year, on your behalf, NACo achieved significant gains that support your county, including:

- ✓ Obtaining a more flexible definition of the term “obligation,” **enabling counties to invest directly allocated American Rescue Plan Act funds** to more effectively meet the unique needs of our communities and residents.
- ✓ Securing **full funding for the Payment in Lieu of Taxes (PILT) program** for Fiscal Year 2024 and advocating for mandatory full funding for FY 2025 and beyond.
- ✓ Achieving adoption of NACo’s proposed Federal Communications Commission **rule requiring wireless providers to implement geo-routing for 988 calls**, ensuring that the 988 Suicide & Crisis Lifeline connects callers to appropriate crisis centers based on their general location.
- ✓ Leading advocacy efforts **against legislation that would increase the size and weight of heavy trucks**, citing concerns about the impact on county-owned infrastructure and educating members of Congress on the potential damage to local roads and bridges.
- ✓ Tackling the challenge of housing affordability by acting on the recommendations of NACo’s **Housing Affordability Task Force** and publishing resources on topics from community engagement to land use and zoning.
- ✓ Unveiling the **National Center for Public Lands**, an initiative dedicated to advancing the policy and practice study of America’s public lands counties through educating federal and state partners about the unique challenges faced by counties containing federal lands.
- ✓ Launching the **Artificial Intelligence (AI) County Compass**, a how-to guide for counties navigating the emergence and explosion of AI use in government, based on the recommendations of NACo’s **AI Exploratory Committee**.
- ✓ Publishing the findings of NACo’s **National Commission on Mental Health and Wellbeing**, presenting federal policy recommendations designed to address the acute mental health crisis in America and offering practical solutions for county leaders.
- ✓ Delivering more than 20 new resources and a new state ambassadors’ program from our **Opioid Solutions Center** to help state associations and counties **address behavioral health challenges** and maximize impact with opioid settlement dollars.
- ✓ Hosting hundreds of county officials for more than a dozen in-person **peer networking exchanges** on topics from early childhood investment to economic development.
