BACKGROUND

The Point-in-Time (PIT) Count is an annual HUD-required survey of all people experiencing homelessness on a single night in January. Its data guides federal funding and resource allocation, while giving local agencies and nonprofits a snapshot of homelessness to plan services and assess policy impact.

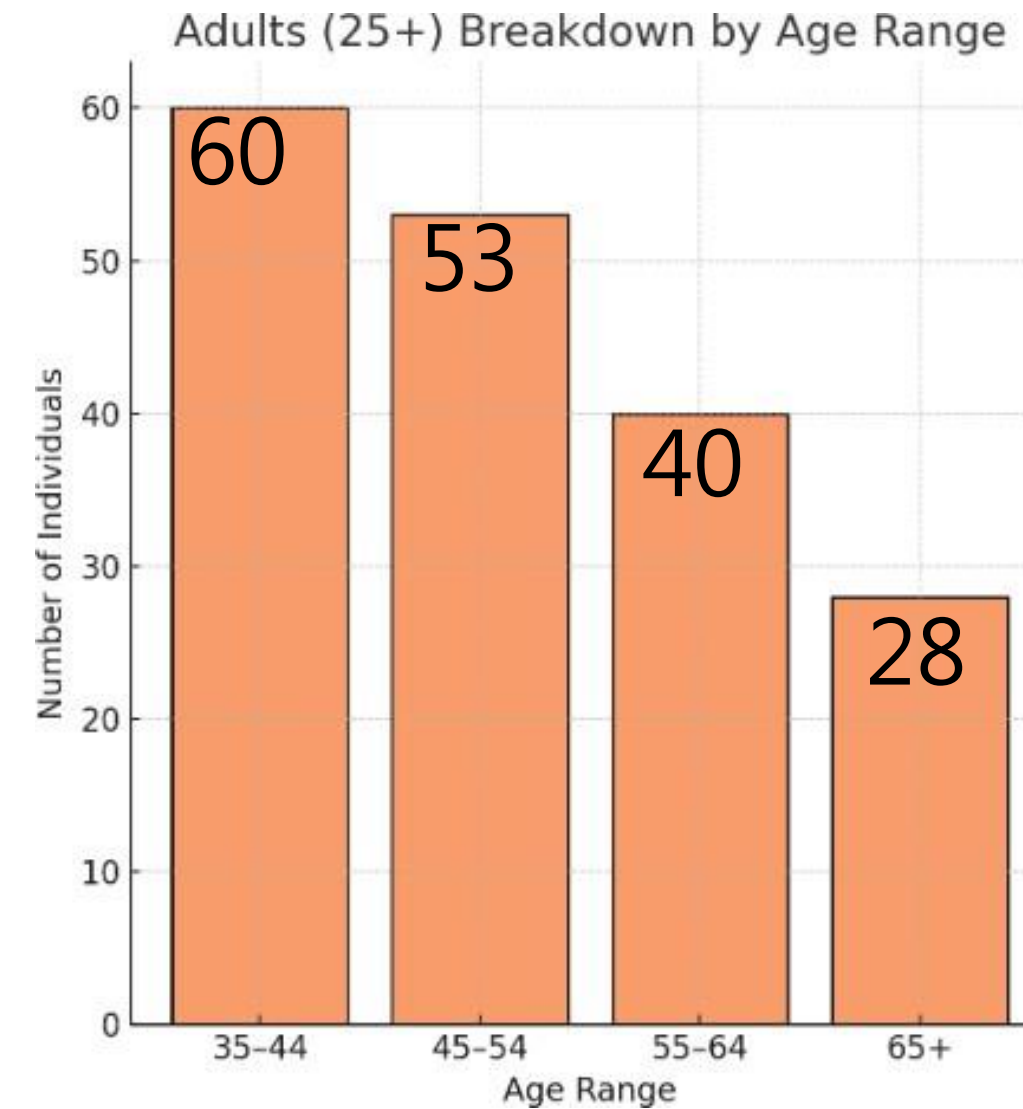
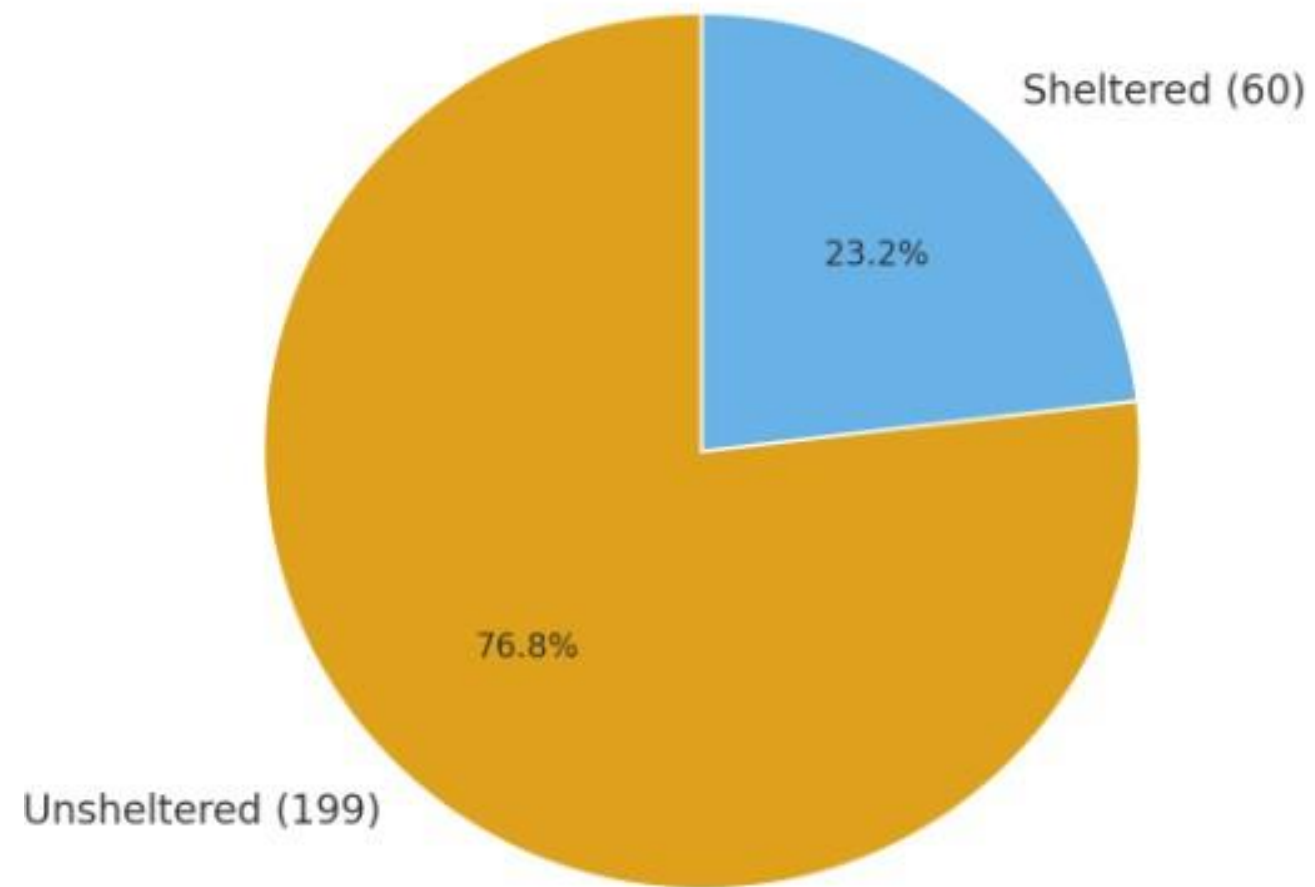
