- No presentation shall exceed three (3) minutes.
- Delegations of five (5) or more shall appoint one person to present their views before Commissioners Court.
- Presiding Officer may limit the time when there are more than ten (10) registered speakers to allow for more participants during the allotted thirty (30) minutes for Open Forum.
- Should the speaker drift from the stated subject, or become disruptive or abusive, he or she shall be given one warning and, if the conduct continues, may forfeit the remaining time and/or be escorted from the proceedings.

Audience participation is limited to the Open Forum portion of the meeting. At all other times during a Commissioners Court meeting, the audience shall not enter into discussion or debate on matters being considered by Commissioners Court, unless requested by the presiding officer.

The Hidalgo County Commissioners Court is a Constitutional Court and possesses the power to issue a Contempt of Court Citation under Section 81.024 of the Texas Local Government Code. Accordingly, members of the public in attendance at any Regular, Special, and/or Emergency meeting of the Court shall conduct themselves with proper respect and decorum in speaking to, and/or addressing the Court.
