

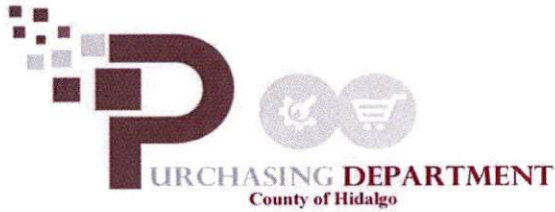

BACKGROUND

On March 17, 2020, pursuant to the authority under Texas Government Code Section 418.108, Hidalgo County Judge Richard Cortez issued a Declaration of Local Disaster for Public Health Emergency due to the imminent threat arising from the Coronavirus (COVID-19). On March 22, 2020, in accordance with Texas Government Code Section 418.108(b), the Commissioners Court of Hidalgo County issued an Order of Continuance of Declaration of Local Disaster for Public Health Emergency that affirmed the activation of the Hidalgo County Emergency Management Plan and extends the Declaration of Local Disaster.

Hidalgo County Health and Human Services Department (HCHHSD) in response to the COVID pandemic public health emergency and in accordance to the National Preparedness Goal under the Presidential Policy Directive 8 (PPD- 8) which directs us to aim in the establishment of ' secure and resilient nation with the capabilities required across the whole community to prevent, protect against, mitigate, respond to and recover from the threats and hazards that pose the greatest risk," and in order to comply with the directive of Homeland Security Presidential Directive 5 (HSPD-5)

COMPLIANCE

Under the Presidential Policy Directive/PPD-8: National Preparedness, "it is aimed at strengthening the security and resilience of the United States through systematic preparation for the threats that pose the greatest risk to the security of the nation, including acts of terrorism, cyber-attacks, pandemics, and catastrophic natural disasters," and in compliance with the Homeland Security Presidential Directive 5 (HSPD-5), and the Center for Disease Control and Prevention, Public Health Emergency Preparedness and Response Capability 9 (Medical Materiel Management and Distribution), and pursuant to the Order of Continuance of Declaration of Local Disaster for Public Health Emergency that affirmed the activation of the Hidalgo County Emergency Management Plan and extends the Declaration of Local Disaster, we request the courts approval to award for the repairs, painting and retrofit ramp area of the Emergency Management Stockpile Warehouse to continue the further needed response to the COVID-19 public health emergency.

ADMINISTRATION

Emergency Management Warehouse serves as a strategic stockpile of all pertinent PPE and emergency supplies.

The retrofit of the Emergency Management Stockpile Warehouse ramp will allow a forklift to safely and ergonomically transport any pallets of material to/from the warehouse. Expansion of the existing dock will provide a temporary laydown area, strategically located by the ramp, readily available for the transport.

Sec. 262.024. DISCRETIONARY EXEMPTIONS. (a) A contract for the purchase of any of the following items is exempt from the requirement established by Section 262.023 if the commissioners court by order grants the exemption:

- (1) an item that must be purchased in a case of public calamity if it is necessary to make the purchase promptly to relieve the necessity of the citizens or to preserve the property of the county;
- (2) an item necessary to preserve or protect the public health or safety of the residents of the county;
- (3) an item necessary because of unforeseen damage to public property;
- (4) a personal or professional service;
- (5) any individual work performed and paid for by the day, as the work progresses, provided that no individual is compensated under this subsection for more than 20 working days in any three month period;
- (6) any land or right-of-way;
- (7) an item that can be obtained from only one source, including:
 - (A) items for which competition is precluded because of the existence of patents, copyrights, secret processes, or monopolies;
 - (B) films, manuscripts, or books;
 - (C) electric power, gas, water, and other utility services;
- and
- (D) captive replacement parts or components for equipment;
- (8) an item of food;
- (9) personal property sold:
 - (A) at an auction by a state licensed auctioneer;
 - (B) at a going out of business sale held in compliance with Subchapter F, Chapter 17, Business & Commerce Code; or
 - (C) by a political subdivision of this state, a state agency of this state, or an entity of the federal government;
- (10) any work performed under a contract for community and economic development made by a county under Section 381.004; or
- (11) vehicle and equipment repairs.

(b) The renewal or extension of a lease or of an equipment maintenance agreement is exempt from the requirement established by Section 262.023 if the commissioners court by order grants the exemption and if:

- (1) the lease or agreement has gone through the competitive bidding procedure within the preceding year;
- (2) the renewal or extension does not exceed one year; and

(3) the renewal or extension is the first renewal or extension of the lease or agreement.

(c) If an item exempted under Subsection (a)(7) is purchased, the commissioners court, after accepting a signed statement from the county official who makes purchases for the county as to the existence of only one source, must enter in its minutes a statement to that effect.

(d) The exemption granted under Subsection (a)(8) of this section shall apply only to the sealed competitive bidding requirements on food purchases. Counties shall solicit at least three bids for purchases of food items by telephone or written quotation at intervals specified by the commissioners court. Counties shall award food purchase contracts to the responsible bidder who submits the lowest and best bid or shall reject all bids and repeat the bidding process, as provided by this subsection. The purchasing officer taking telephone or written bids under this subsection shall maintain, on a form approved by the commissioners court, a record of all bids solicited and the vendors contacted. This record shall be kept in the purchasing office for a period of at least one year or until audited by the county auditor.
